The Mather Sisters from Emerald tra
(Courtney and Kurstyn) have moved to fix

Cairns in the hope of taking their squash to a whole new level under the coaching direction of Marc Forster and Steven Finitsis.

Splitting the family in two hasn't been easy but Mum (Kerry) and the two girls have settled in well and are already into a regular routine with school and training.

Courtney indicated she was training daily "I'm constantly at the squash courts or in the gym working on balance, technique, fitness or mental components."

Kurstyn on the other hand is "doing 6



training sessions a week (including fixtures). On Tuesday I have two sessions, including fixtures and on Saturday I also have two training sessions".

Meanwhile, Dad (Andrew) remains back in Emerald working hard to fund the girl's dreams and keep everything afloat at home.

The girls have made massive sacrifices like changing school, leaving behind friends and leaving other sporting teams they played in to pursue their dreams to represent Australia in squash.

Time will tell but if anyone can get them there it is Marc Forster. The girls have always had a healthy respect for Marc. Many years ago when the girls were very young, Marc coached out at Emerald and built up a good relationship with the family.

Now with Steve Finitsis based in Cairns, the girls have another strong mentor honing their game.

The girls have already made their presence felt in NR. Having moved to Cairns for the last term of school in 2016, Courtney and Kurstyn added some punch to the Ingham Qualifier.

Courtney won both the U17 and U19 events. Kurstyn won the U15 and the plate in U17.

The girls then trained hard for the AJO in Darwin in January.

Courtney had a big win first up against

Jessica Graham before bowing out in the second round to the eventual runner up Kaitlyn Watts from New Zealand.

Her 11-5, 11-9, 9-11, 14-12 win over the 2016 Australian Junior Champion Graham was full of merit. Courtney finished 6th overall but one must remember she is still eligible for U17 so it was a good sign that her training is paying off.

"Defeating the 2016 Australian under 19 girls champion at the AJO in 2017 is definitely a very proud moment for me" said Courtney.

Kurstyn was very unlucky to be knocked out in the first round of the U15 Girls event by another Queensland rising star Ella Burge - 11-13, 8-11, 11-6, 11-5, 6-11 - before losing the Plate final to Victorian Eishaanii Sukunesan in straight. She finished 10th overall.

So two Top 10 finishes in Darwin was a pleasing result but more work is yet to be done!

Their next event was the Cairns Qualifier in February. Courtney played in the U17 Girls and was too good for the opposition beating the U15 Australian Champion Hayley Hankinson in the final 3-0.

There were no girls to hold an U19 event so Courtney took on the U19 boys and performed well finishing 3rd overall.

Kurstyn played well in the U15 girls but found Aussie Champ Hayley Hankinson too strong in the final. She played up in the U17 girls and beat Hayley's sister Danielle for 3rd place.

Courtney has now been selected to play

for Australia in the U19 Trans-Tasman Series that will take place after the Oceania Junior Championships in Auckland, New Zealand on the 18/19th April 2017.

"All the hard work is starting to pay off already. Both of the girls are starting to see results from their training and hard work and we couldn't be happier with the decision to move them up to Cairns. It's hard being away from Andrew and the rest of my family, but you do what you can for your children to give them opportunities to achieve their dreams" said Kerry.

The girls are no strangers to success but they both yearn for greater glory. Their role model has been the legendary Nicol David so they have set their goals very high.

Only one question remains: Will they represent NR or CR at the Queensland Junior Championships? Stay tuned!

Following the AGM of Squash Australia in November and the recent Q Squash Board meeting the following affiliation categories have been set for 2017.

- 1. Full Registration \$66.00 per annum Q Squash fee payable up front. This covers you for all organised squash competitions and tournaments and includes Player Accident Insurance and access to Matrix. Some regions may charge an additional fee to this so you need to talk to your regional committee or your centre operator for the actual price payable in your region.
- 2. Seasonal Registration \$40.00 Q Squash fee payable up front at beginning of each season 2 seasons per year. This covers you for all organised squash competitions and tournaments and includes Player Accident Insurance and access to Matrix.
- 3. **Social Registration \$33.00 Q Squash fee payable up front.** This covers social hire players with Player Accident Insurance.
- 4. **Affiliate Registration \$10.00 per annum.** Typically for parents of players or persons wanting to be a friend of "Squash".

Affiliations fall due on 1st January and expire on 31st December of each year for full playing/paying players ... remember if your season goes over into the new year you will need to renew to remain covered for player accident insurance.

Being affiliated to your State and National bodies helps both organisations to obtain funding from Government. Funding is heavily based on the numbers of registered players a sport has. The more players we have registered the more money we should be able to access to grow the grassroots and HP levels of our wonderful sport.

All players affiliating have access to the Q Squash Newsletter and also the Squash Australia members portal where you can obtain great discounts off everyday purchases.

By being an affiliated player in Queensland you are helping to fund the Q Open, Mackay Open, Cairns International, Sandgate Women's Open, Brisbane Open, Scottvale Park Open, Gladstone Open and Moura Open throughout 2017. As well as these events Q Squash is able to help support our Junior Sharks to attend both the Australian Junior Championships and the Australian Junior Open.
