The Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) in partnership with the Western Australian Institute of Sport (WAIS) have created a life skills program for developing athletes.

The Developing Champions program is designed to assist the development of aspiring young athletes to gain personal development skills with the support of the Personal Excellence program at WAIS.

WA Squash has been fortunate to be part of this program since 2013.

9 athletes along with 2 from Table Tennis and 1 from Volleyball attended their first workshop 'Foundations For My Success', with Joe McCarthy (Tennis background) and Cruz Hogan WAIS Athlete (Javelin).

Our athletes included Callum Blakey, Olivia Bunter, Georgia Charles, Isabella Diver, Kane-Jaran Holman, Abel Jin, Olivia Lindsey, Pascale Louka and Remi Young.

The athletes looked at: Setting Goals; Managing their Time and Drugs in Sport.

After starting the session with the emotional video of Derek Redmond in the 400m final of the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, commitment to sport was discussed. Cruz Hogan spoke about his career and the many injuries he suffered yet still persevered and made the commitment to be the best he could.

The athletes learnt the importance of goal setting. Having decided what their goals were, they worked out the steps to achieving them using the SMART guidelines.

Next they completed a weekly time management plan including sleeping, eating, traveling, studying and training. Although all athletes admitted they were busy before this exercise, they were amazed at how many 'spare' hours they had each week.

Athletes finished the session with discussions on the integrity within sport, sportsmanship and drugs within sport. It was made very clear that it was their responsibility to know exactly what substances they put in their own bodies and were given the resources to manage this.

The athletes next workshop will be in the April school holidays.

Finlayson Sporting Complex Official Open Day

FACT 1: "This \$19 million project undertaken by the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder entailed the construction of an hallmark sports precinct designed to complement

existing facilities, and provide high-quality grounds and amenities for soccer, rugby league and rugby union, cricket, squash and equestrian sports".

FACT 2: "The first stage of the project (Elements 1 and 2) was completed in 2013. It required the installation of utilities, access road, car park, street lighting, internal fencing and footpaths as well as the relocation of the Goldfields Equestrian Club track and stable facilities to an adjacent block. Element 3 involved the construction of the sporting fields is complete. The multi-purpose clubrooms and squash facility (Element 4 of the project), was completed in 2016".



It was great to visit the new squash courts in Kalgoorlie. Having played a number of Golden Opens and seeing the EGSRA slowly lose access to courts, you could sense a great deal more positive energy around the place at having a new, larger venue to access. It was great to see so many people, new to squash, getting on and having a go.

Court tech have done a fantastic job building the courts, I hope the whole squash community will get behind the Golden Open in June as a big celebration of the new facility.

There has been a change of management at Terrace Squash.

WA Squash has entered into an agreement with local squash identities **Glenn Hitch** and **Ken Watson**. In partnership, Glenn and Ken will manage and operate the Terrace Squash Centre to optimise its full potential, including promoting the sport of squash and realizing the centre's commercial opportunities.

WA Squash President Steve Bowen commented on the change "With goodwill, love of squash and determination we can progress the management of the centre so that we all gain from increased numbers of players, increased registrations with WA squash, increased pennant teams, higher squash standards and greater publicity and promotion of squash."

Under the agreement WA Squash authorized events such as the WA Open and State junior tournaments and squad training sessions will continue to be held at the centre.

The new managers have prepared an operational plan covering intended developments over the next few years. Their immediate priority is to increase player numbers and establish a fully-active club at the centre, which will in future be known as **The Club Perth**.

Glenn said that their overriding aim was to create a club-based environment within which members could find social, intellectual and physical enjoyment, stimulation and

challenge at whatever level they preferred. "A wide range of activities will be offered to club members. They will be facilitated by experienced leaders, some of whom we have already appointed. We want to have at least one of these people present to welcome patrons to the centre during most opening hours."

Although all will be welcome the partners see the majority of their clientele coming from those resident or working in the many high-rise buildings that surround the centre. "With eight courts available to patrons **The Club Perth** is the only commercial squash centre in the Perth CBD.

"We hope that among other things we can re-ignite what in earlier years was a popular and active "corporate challenge" program", said Ken. He went on to say "we invite you and your friends to join **The Club Perth**".

AUCKLAND NEW ZEALAND 21-30 APRIL 2017



Six WA Squash Players are heading across the ditch to compete in the World Masters Games. The World Masters Games (WMG) is the World's largest multi sport event. Held every 4 years it is the pinnacle sporting event for masters competition worldwide.

WMG 2017 will be held in Auckland with 28 sports and 45 disciplines. The squash registration closed early due to its popularity, with age categories of 35+ to 80+.

Di Cook, Sue Hillier, Mike Millington, Anne Richards, Kevin Smuts and Sue Volzke from WA have entered the event.

Sue Volzke (O65), Anne Richards (O60) and Sue Hillier (O50) have all been seeded #1 for their respective events which actually commence on 22 April.

Sue Volzke has won 3 World Masters Championships and was a finalist in 2014. She has also won 10 Australian Masters titles. **Anne Richards** has won 1 World Masters Championship and was runner up in another, 2 WMG and 9 Australian Masters titles. **Sue Hillier** has won one World Masters Championship and 4 Australian Masters titles.

67 Players participated in the 31st SW Squash Masters at the Busselton Courts in West St over the long weekend in 5 Divisions with ages from mid 30s to late 70s.

This is the largest Masters squash event outside of Perth and one of the longest running.



Busselton was able to have representatives in all 5 division finals on the Monday morning, which was a huge effort never achieved before by the home club.

The coveted Division 1 shield was taken out by the Busselton team made up of current and ex Busselton players Paul Hey, Sean Brockman and Michael Bishop.

Both Paul and Sean managed for a 2nd time over the weekend to win games off their higher ranked Perth opponents while Michael won easily against his lower ranked opponent both times to set up a 6 games to 3 win in the final.

The standard of squash was exceptional in the finals with a combination of patient

long rallies and incredible shot making and retrieving. This is just the 6th time Busselton has taken out the Division 1 shield since 1987.

Bunbury successfully defended its Div 2 shield defeating the Busselton team of Phil Cox, Paddy Denison, Bruce Philpott, and Graham Mitchell by the slender margin of 5 games to 4 in the final.

One of the games they lost in the last match being 8/9 so if this had gone the other way they would have won!

The Div 3 final saw Ron Buswell, Brian Roby and Chris Champ go down in the final 3/6 to the Mirrabooka team, even tho they were able to defeat the same team earlier in the first match of the weekend.

In Div 4 the Busselton team of Stu Morgan, Bruce Lawrence and Peter Mohr were defeated in the final by their Perth opponents 3/6 but it could have been all so different had Stu not

lost two of his games 7/9 and 8/10.

And then Busselton won its 2nd Shield for the weekend with the combined Busselton/Bunbury team of Wendy Dale, Phil Box and Chris Reston defeating their Perth opponents by the narrow margin of 5/4.

Sat night saw 50 people socialise at a function which recognised 27 players who have entered the tournament 10 or more times with one player having entered an incredible 27 times out of a possible 31.

He took charge of the draws and results for the World Masters Championships in Melbourne in 2001.


He initiated the ASMA rankings system


