W#111 Eain Yow Ng from Malaysia won the PSA M10 NT Open in May. Seeded #4 for the event Ng recovered from 0-2 down in the final to beat Aussie Josh Larkin 7-11, 7-11, 11-4, 11-6, 11-6.

The 2016 World Junior Champion had to play 226 minutes of squash to secure the title including two five setters - a 75 minute final against Larkin and a 61 minute Round 2 clash with veteran Mike Corren.

The 19 year old was too good for another young gun in the semi final. Ng beat tournament giant killer Tsz Kwan Lau from

Hong Kong (21) in four.

Earlier W#127 Lau toppled the tournament favourite Zac Alexander (W#66) in their quarter final clash winning the match 11-6, 11-9, 12-10 in a brisk 37 minutes.

Zac Alexander had been chasing his 7th PSA title in succession.

Larkin was clearly the best of the Aussies dropping just one game on route to the final. He picked up 1150 points toward the Australian Squash Tour additional prizemoney moving himself into 3rd position.

Alexander, Rhys Dowling and Matt Hopkin each picked up 450 points.

In the chase to share \$5,000 in additional prizemoney Alexander maintains a healthy lead of 1150 points over Dowling and 1350 points over Larkin.

Our 6th Commonwealth Games article looks back at the 2014 Glasgow Games

Our team boasted World Champions David Palmer and Rachael Grinham.

In his 5th Games, Palmer was striving to win his first Gold Medal and we welcomed the return of Rachael Grinham who boycotted the previous Games.

For Palmer winning two GOLD MEDALS was the "icing on the cake" to an illustrious career which included winning two World Championships and four British Opens.

Palmer teamed up with Cameron Pilley to win the Men's Doubles before teaming up with Rachael Grinham to win the Mixed Doubles.

Despite their success, the Australian team had to deal with a last minute team change as a result of Matt Karwalski's successful appeal against his non inclusion in the team.

Zac Alexander was originally selected in the team and was already in the village preparing for the squash competition when the Court of Arbitration for Sport ended a 2 month legal battle ruling in favour of Karwalski.

Karwalski was the 3rd highest ranked Aussie at the time so it was reasonable to expect he would be a member of the 5 man squad. Instead, Squash Australia selected the 7th ranked player ahead of him.

When Alexander left the village Australian team chef de mission Steve Moneghetti was full of praise for how he handled the disappointment "Zac Alexander has been exemplary in this process. An outstanding Australian. He minimised the disruption on the team by taking the bad news well. He was so professional."

WORLD DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHI



Squash Australia has just named the Australian team to compete in the 5th World Doubles Championships in Manchester, England from the 1-5 August in the Men's Doubles. 2017.

It is hard to imagine that in this modern era of squash competition there have only been four previous World Doubles Championships: Hong Kong 1997, Chennai 2004, Melbourne 2006 and Darwin 2016.

One would have expected with doubles being a major part of the Commonwealth Games that a World Doubles Championship would be played more often.

Men: Zac Alexander, Ryan Cuskelly, David Palmer and Cameron Pilley. Women: Sarah Cardwell, Rachael Grinham, Tamika Saxby and Donna Urquhart.

Coach: Paul Price

Squash Australia has basically stuck with the same team they chose to compete at the 2016 World Doubles Championship. The only difference is Tamika Saxby replaces Christine Nunn.

This is a strong indication as to who will be chosen to compete at the 2018 Commonwealth Games.

Cardwell, Cuskelly, Grinham, Palmer, Pilley and Urguhart all represented Australia at the 2014 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow.

At the 2016 World Doubles Championship:

Alexander and Palmer won a silver medal

Grinham and Urquhart won silver in the Women's Doubles.

With no bronze medal playoffs: Cuskelly and Pilley secured bronze in Men's Doubles whilst Palmer and Urguhart took bronze in the Mixed Doubles.

One could argue that Australia didn't field their strongest combinations in Darwin so it will be interesting to see who plays with who in Manchester.

In Darwin the combination of Cardwell and Nunn did not reach the semi finals of the Women's Doubles. Likewise the combination of Grinham and Pilley did not reach the semi finals of the Mixed Doubles.




































THE FINAL WORD

One of the four main goals of Squash United is to Build 10 significant Centres around Australia in the next 10 years but I want to achieve a lot more than that!

Instead we need to be building Squash Courts in other recreation facilities, at schools and Universities and we need to think differently about how we approach it.

Has anyone spoken to Westfields or the other Shopping Complex owners? They have an enormous amount of real estate and many are now putting gyms in.

Squash Courts are incredibly low

maintenance by comparison and can be shown to be profitable so it ticks a lot of boxes that these businesses have.

But we can do even better than that. The advent of 24/7 gyms has made software and hardware significantly more cost effective than ever before.

There is no reason that a squash court cannot be built into a row of shops with swipe card access and cameras.

Everyone will see what is happening and it will be an incredible advertisement for our sport.

Did you know some retirement villages are now being built with Squash Courts? We need to be approaching developers and sell them on the virtues of including squash courts.

The facts are simple, the old ways will not work in the future. It is time to try new ideas. No doubt many people will read the ideas above and immediately decide that some of them are impossible.

Well ... they all already exist somewhere in the world right now!

If you want to know what I and the Squash United team will be doing for the next 10 years it is all written above!

I hope 50 people copy these ideas and aim to do it before me or better than me.
