Many players panic when they begin to lose. It is important to understand that a match isn't over until match ball is decided.


I have personally seen so many players recover from being 2 games to love down.

State of the Game - Putting the sportsmanship back in the game

Too often these days we are seeing behaviour on our squash courts which is not in the spirit of the game. These acts of bad sportsmanship are having a detrimental effect on the participation levels within our game.

Just think if you were looking for a sport to join or for your child to join and you were watching a squash game where players were swearing on court, arguing with the referee calls, smashing their racket or even failing to lend a hand if their opponent falls. How you might wonder if this was really the sport for you?

Well sadly, I believe this is becoming far too common in our game, seeing at least one example of all of these in the last month, and disappointingly, most of them from people whom off court are great and social people. For whatever reason when they step on the court, they seem to forget about the "Etiquette of Squash".

So I would like to list a number of things that I see, which are starting to creep into our game more and more, which we need to STOP:

- Referee abuse
- Racquet abuse
- Incessantly arguing "let" calls
- Body checking to establish "let" calls
- Players who crowd opponents
- Fishing for unrealistic "lets"
- Appealing then continuing to play
- Monopolising warm up time
- Hitting people with the squash ball
- Hitting people with the squash racquet



We all need to take a good look at our behaviour on court, and see if it truly passes the **True Sports Test** "would I want my children or my grandchildren playing a game where someone is acting like me?"

Behaviours need to start changing NOW. I appeal to all players to be honest with yourself and begin addressing any of these behaviours if they are part of your game.

We should all play the game hard, play the game fair and be a True Sport!

Lisa explained how she will be approaching her new role "I will be focusing on creating a new Q Squash Sporting Schools Program that each region/club and school will be using".

"I feel the Oz Squash program is not squash specific enough. I've run three Oz Squash sporting schools programs in the past year and by the end of the term the children still don't full understand what squash is all about".

"The first development phase I have been assigned to will focus on Southern Region with the second phase being Central Region".

"But in saying that if anyone from any other region is interested please contact me ASAP as I would like to work with them to get the program up and running".

ELITE TRAINING CAMP

Lisa delivered her first elite training camp just for girls in Brisbane in May.

Lisa described the camp as a huge success "the girls got a lot out of the 3 days. The highlights were a Q&A session with **Liz Irving** as well as learning new things, for them to incorporate into their daily training back home".

The six girls received expert advice from some of Australia's finest coaches: Lisa Camilleri (two times Commonwealth Games representative), **Vicki Cardwell** (former World Champion) and elite coach **Liz Irving** (former World#2).



QUEENSLAND DOUBLES SUCCESS



Alexander, Cardwell, Cuskelly, Grinham, Palmer, Pilley, Saxby and Urquhart have just been named in the Australian Team to compete at the World Doubles Championship in Manchester, England from the 1-5 August 2017.

With the Com Games Team requiring 10 players to be selected, Camilleri is still a strong chance to represent Australia at the 2018 CG - which would be her 3rd Games.

"Sarah and I played very well together. With my main focus being a Commonwealth Games gold medal in women's doubles, I will be playing in the Vic Doubles with Sarah as well as getting in as much practice as possible on proper size doubles courts in lead up to selection".



With the QJC just a few days away we thought it might be a good time to introduce QJC Tournament Director Caitlin Penfold and get to know her a little better.

You have been appointed to the role of Tournament Director for the upcoming QJC. How are you feeling about that?

It has definitely been a little overwhelming. As people could imagine, it's very daunting being young and having to manage and organise such a big event – especially since it has been approximately five years since SR has hosted a QJC. This was also the first year that there was online entering so that was a fun exercise to reconcile but I hope everyone found this way much easier and less time consuming. It's been challenging to juggle all the things I need to do for the QJC as well as my studies, work and normal life! However, I have some very good people to rely on to help me out with the running of this tournament.


Rosemary Lord has been magnificent organising this event as well as other SR committee members.

You have run a number of tournaments within Southern Region. You obviously enjoy that role. What do you like about it?

I'm a person who loves organising things and having them run to schedule. I think it's important to have a tournament planned, in case something happens to disrupt the normal flow eg. Injury. It's great to travel to all the places in SR and encourage all of our juniors to get involved and have fun. That's what it is all about – having fun and playing squash.

You are still very young and studying at Uni. What inspired you to get involved with squash administration?

Watching kids achieve their goals and knowing you are a part of their journey – no matter how big or small I find it very inspiring. I think being a young person behind the scenes brings a breath of fresh air to it. Most of the administrative side is working with other people that share the same passion as you which makes it a lot easier to

get on the same page so to speak. I think as a young adult I bring new ideas and attitude to squash and I definitely want to see it thrive. I also have a coaching certificate which I got when I was only 17 and hope to work on that in the future.

What are you studying at Uni?

Currently, I am enrolled in a Bachelor of Education / Bachelor of Arts at the University of the Sunshine Coast. Hopefully I will be graduating in mid-2018. I love teaching kids and seeing them grow into passionate and confident young adults. Being a positive role model is important for kids – especially teenagers and it can help build character, confidence and perseverance.

What got you into squash in the first place?

Growing up, my dad was always playing squash at the Caloundra, Currimundi or Maroochydore courts. My mum would take me to squash every Thursday afternoon with my coach 'Bob' (Robert Keleher) who made the whole experience of training fun and innovative. Eventually Maroochydore started training on weekends and that's when I was introduced to the junior squash circuit. In 2012 I made the SR team for the first time and I played junior squash until I aged out.


Ironically, in 2016 I went on a teaching placement at the same school as my old coach!

Is your family involved in squash?

My whole family have been involved in squash for a very long time. Originally with my dad playing and then followed by myself and my younger brother Josh (everyone knows Joshua Penfold!) My mum has always been at our side making sure we have packed everything and are eating the right food.

What do you like about squash?

I love the dynamics of the game. It is so different to any other sport. You can play at any time of year and I suppose it was the only sport that I was good at. As I've grown up I have learnt to respect the pace and technique involved. It takes countless hours of dedication to master your sport and squash is no different.

Do you aspire to any particular role in the future?

I'm hoping to branch out into "School's" squash after I secure my first teaching position. Hopefully, I can be involved with other Tournament roles - coach, manager or organiser. I'm hoping the experience I'm gathering now, will help me fulfil future roles.

You have been involved on the playing side and now behind the scenes. What would you like to see change in the future?

I would like to see much more promotion in schools. Most teachers are happy to accommodate most sports and are happy to see children succeeding.


This period of time in particular, is very rocky. Squash Australia and Q Squash are going through many changes in policy and management and I hope that the solutions are found soon so we can continue working on increasing junior numbers. Communication is always what needed to be strong and at the moment I think there could be more communication. However, in saying that, once the managing committees and policies get sorted, I'm sure it will become clearer in the future. Squash is going through a 'drought period' and all it will take is for some dedicated people to come together to promote this sport out into schools and the public. And also more courts!

What would you like the players to do when they get to Nerang for the QJC?

I would love for players to make sure they are listening to any announcement made. We ask for all juniors to get to the courts at least 15 – 20 minutes before their first match and report to me when they arrive. As with any other junior tournament, players must provide their own eyewear and gear and also mark/referee after their match. If a scheduling issue occurs please come and speak to me or another organiser to sort the issue out ASAP.

How would you describe your personality?

I'm a very outgoing, outspoken, and bubbly person. I love chatting to and meeting new people. My mind is always thinking about a hundred different things at once which is not helpful when I'm trying to focus on one task. I like to think of myself as the ray of sunshine on a dark day.
