CHAMPIONS

Mike Corren beat three young guns to take out his 6th Golden Open. The "Moose" beat 2016 Australian Junior Representative Joseph White 11-7, 11-1, 11-2 (21min) to set up a semi final clash with Tom Calvert.

#4S Corren beat #2S Calvert in 34 minutes 11-5, 11-7, 11-6 to reach yet another PSA Final.



Meanwhile #1S Rhys Dowling took care of Australia's premier junior from 2016 Alex Eustace beating the #8S 11-5, 11-3, 11-7 (34min) before destroying Solayman Nowrozi (AUS) 11-9, 11-2, 11-2 (28m) to reach the final.

The final was a tense battle between "youth" and "experience". "Experience" won out in the end 16-14, 8-11, 11-9, 11-6 (60m) giving Corren back to back titles and his 6th Golden Open.

Tamika Saxby beat Samantha Foyle 7-11, 11-6, 11-4, 11-5 (32m) to claim the inaugural Women's Golden Open Title.





JUNIOR SQUASH-A-THON

14-15 JULY 2017

Mirrabooka Squash Club is hosting our first **SQUASH-A-THON**, an Annual Event designed to raise money to assist Juniors and we ask for your assistance to get the word out to as many clubs as possible.

Mirrabooka Squash Club, like many other clubs, would love to see the numbers of juniors increase. With your help with the promotion of the **SQUASH-A-THON** we seek to enlist as many juniors as possible with the aim of each junior raising funds to go back to their respective Junior Squash Club.

We would like to see each Junior pledge their funds raised, to go directly to the needs of their junior club, i.e.: equipment, junior club prizes, interstate trips, uniforms.

The juniors will be asked how the funds they raise will be distributed within their own Clubs, of course with the help of their coaches, parents and organiser of their club (i.e. helping out their club, interstate trips, uniforms, equipment).

For this event to be successful, we will require as many juniors as possible to participate and of course a few adults from their clubs to supervise on the night.

Our club will help by supplying majority of supervisors. All supervisors will have a current Working with Children Check. This event is an alcohol free event.

The event will be on the 14th of July 2017, starting at 6pm and finishing at 12 noon the following day.

Squash will be played continuously on one/two/three courts, depending on the numbers.

As this is a sizable initiative, we are hoping to attract the media to the event, and possibly manage an article in the local papers.

To kick off the evening, we are planning to host a pot luck supper for the parents and members to come and enjoy. Details will follow.

There will be consistent adult supervision throughout the night, with help from many of our older juniors?

Vic Park Squash Club Coach, **Sue Hillier** has joined the **CoachMade** project, which is led by experts in sport motivation and anti-doping.

The team was led by Prof Nikos Ntoumanis (Psychology and speech pathology) and Prof Daniel Gucciardi (physiotherapy and exercise science) from Curtin University. The project is being undertaken in conjunction with the International Olympic Committee involving Curtin University, Aristototle University of Thessaloniki and Leeds Beckett University.

The workshops promote healthy athlete development and sustained engagement in sport, with a specific focus on:

- 1) Effective motivation strategies that promote high quality motivation and adaptive outcomes associated with performance and well-being and
- 2) Proactive and anti-doping strategies that minimize athletes' willingness to engage in doping activities and other immoral behaviours (eg: cheating)

"Before I attended the workshop, I needed to complete a survey, so too did the players I coach, with the intention of completing a further survey 6 weeks and 3 months after the workshops" said Hillier.

Motivation:

The first workshop in May was on Motivation strategies. There were coaches from Hockey, AFL, Cricket, Tennis and Rugby; interestingly Hillier was the only female coach. The workshop focused on the words used as a Coach exploring how/why subtleties in communication styles and how to apply motivation principles to support athlete motivation.

"Following this workshop, I had four weeks of homework putting these skills into practice. Although I was not looking forward to doing the homework it was very beneficial and ensured that I focused on how I was communicating. We have had lots of laughs during my coaching sessions where, with input from my juniors, I have tried to change some of the words I generally use when coaching. Although, most of the principles I already follow I wasn't aware that it leads to a players motivation. Having recently witnessed bad behaviour on the squash court I'm more determined to help those I coach to have intrinsic motivation" said Hillier.

Anti-Doping

The second workshop was on Anti Doping, with some very interesting facts and websites to help part with the information.

"I learnt for the purpose of anti-doping information and education any person who participates in sport under an organisation is an athlete and any athlete can be tested, at any time".

The group looked at what motivates athletes to dope and some of the points the attendees came up with were:

- To be #1
- Injury recovery
- Take the easy way
- To be famous (or most likely infamous once you're caught!)
- Pressure from self or others
- Money

We looked at what it means to be a clean athlete:

- Playing by the rules of the sport
- Not putting prohibited substances in their bodies
- Upholding the spirit of sport and
- Prioritizing athlete welfare over performance (my biggest concern)

Question: If we took away the rewards would you still play squash?? The answer for most players is "yes". So we wonder why some athletes try to cheat.

The group then discussed medication and supplements.

"My advice to any of you is to check all medication on the **GlobalDRO app** - its easy, even I managed it! Make sure you tell your doctor you are an athlete as they too can check what they prescribe for you to ensure its not banned and they can also recommend something else" explained Hillier.

FACT: Did you know 1 in 5 supplements are contaminated with banned substances? You can check **www.informed-sport.com** for supplements, but still there is a risk. Best supplement ever is FOOD, but if you are prescribed supplements look up this website.

Hillier still has another four weeks of homework on Anti-doping/cheating ahead of her: "I think this will be difficult to achieve, but will see how I go. My first suggestion is to try and own up to our double bounces, play fair and have fun!"

WA (3) has the second largest State representation in this TTT series behind QLD (6), with NSW (2), VIC (2) and SA (1). We should be proud of these squash players, whose stellar performances have earned their TTT selection.

So what is the background of our three Golden Girls?

Sue Volzke has won her age division at the Australian Masters Squash Association championships 10 times and also been chosen to represent Australia for Trans Tasman Tests 7 times. A triple World Masters Squash champion, Sue was runner-up in two other World Masters finals and also in the World Masters Games in Auckland this year. Sue is a member of Subiaco Kings Squash Club WA

Anne Richards has won her age division at the AMSA Championships 9 times and was selected to represent Australia 6 times in the TTT. Anne is a multiple World Masters Squash and WMG champion, was runner-up in WMS at Johannesburg last year and became WMG Squash Champion in Auckland in May 2017. Anne is also a member of Subiaco Kings Squash Club WA

Sue Hillier is a former WA State Open squash champion who

has excelled in Masters Squash since entering this form of competition four years ago. Sue has won her age division at the AMSA Championships over the last four years, has been selected to represent Australia twice in the TTT series and became the Over 50 World Masters Squash Champion in 2014 (Hong Kong) and the WMG Squash champion in 2017 (Auckland). Sue is a member of Victoria Park Squash Club, conducts coaching programmes for juniors and is an executive officer of WA Squash.

Masters' Trans Tasman Test Series History

The inaugural TTT (best of 3 tests) was conducted in Southport Qld in 1984. Initially there was a total of only nine men and women's age divisions that year. Current AMSA President and past World Masters Squash champion, Peter Wright AOM, represented Australia in that first series in the Men's O/40 division.

There have been 22 TTT series held between 1984 and 2015, with Australia winning 18 times and New Zealand 4 times.

It was very close to a draw in Napier NZ in 2015 with the Test match results being: 5/7, 7/5, 6/6 with Australia narrowly winning by a single game in the last test, in a remarkably exciting and enjoyable series.

With the TTT series alternating between countries and played every two years, Australia hosts New Zealand in Ballarat this year.

The TTT has been expanded to include the O/65 age division in 2017, so there will now be 14 matches per TTT.

Whilst fiercely contested on court, great camaraderie is enjoyed off court, with both teams participating in social occasions, that typically include an opening ceremony and dinner, a local landmark tour and lunch, then a wind-up dinner dance. Team supporters are welcome to attend the matches and the social outings.

AMSA Life Member Garry Irwin has again been selected as Team Manager in 2017, a role he has capably held since 2003.


Two TTT will be held on Sept 1 & 2, just prior the AMSA Singles Championship, with the third TTT being held on the following Saturday, 9 September.


