Curtis's performance was the second best by an Aussie behind Nick Calvert who finished 32nd.

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Squashworld Mirrabooka hosted the 2017 WA Junior State Titles over four days. The individual event took place on July 1st and 2nd and the team event took place on the July 3rd and 4th. The Gold ranked junior tournament showcased many astonishing and nail-biting matches over the four-day period.

Over 73 juniors, parents and coaches travelled from both metro and regional areas to compete in the tournament. It was encouraging to see a large proportion of entrants from regional areas, some travelling from as far as Exmouth and Kalgoorlie. This year's tournament had a different format with juniors restricted to entering only one age event. This ensured that matches went ahead on time and that players were not fatigued before important games.

For the third consecutive year, there was a Northern Territory presence. Darwin squash coach, Jarrod Ashcroft travelled to the WA Junior State Titles, bringing with him a group of five talented juniors from the Darwin Squash Centre, all hoping to take home some titles.

On the first day of the tournament, juniors began to arrive at Squashworld prior to the 9am start. The spell of cold, rainy weather during the tournament did not prevent any of the juniors from playing their best. All juniors underwent two action-packed days, with some juniors playing up to six matches in the two-day individual tournament!

Congratulations to **Remi Young**, being only 14, one of the youngest juniors to win the WA Boys' U19 title and **Jade Woods** for winning the WA Girls' U19 title.

Congratulations to the **Northern Nicks** team who took away first place in the team's event for their fourth consecutive year. A special mention to the South West Smashers, for coming runner-up in the team event. They are in their second year of their 'Three Year Plan' determined to defeat Northern Nicks in 2018.

All the juniors would like to thank **Emma Cornish** who organized the tournament. Emma worked tirelessly behind the desk for the full four days, coordinating the match times and ensuring a successful tournament.

JUNIOR SQUASH-A-THON

Squashworld Mirrabooka hosted their first annual **Junior Squash A Thon** on July 14th starting from 6pm through to 12 noon the following day.

The Squash A Thon was a continuous **18-hour event**, designed to help raise junior squash funds. Overall, there were 28 juniors aged from 10 through to 17 participating in this long, eventful night, **raising over \$4,000!**

All participated in various activities which were conducted throughout the night. One of the most memorable challenges that took place was the 'Weetbix' challenge; participants had to eat a full Weetbix biscuit without the aid of water.

Each dry weetbix sucked the moisture from everyone's mouths, making it very difficult to chew and swallow. This resulted in many of the juniors breathing out the Weetbix flakes, making the challenge very entertaining to watch.

All juniors played their fair share of squash throughout the night. Many played

Day 1

The camp had a focus on some letters of the alphabet, the number 4 and the colour blue. We immediately got into the warm-ups with the number 4 in focus, which was followed by some court movement practice (the number 3 got a huge mention here), trying to get them to be more efficient around the court.

The players then went into a squash challenge so we could gauge their level of play. From here groups were formed and they tried some shot practice calling out letters of the alphabet whilst trying to avoid the blue area.

Lunch was a welcome break and a great chance to chat and make friends. Back on court for another alphabet challenge utilising the letter 'Y'. Following on from the movement exercise in the morning players quickly learnt how to be more efficient, with all showing improvement at the end.

Taking these efficient, pivoting movements it was back on court challenging them to hit some targets, again avoiding the Blue.

We finished the day with a concentration challenge ... I've never heard a squash centre full of children so quiet!

Day 2

On the second day, we lost one player and coach to illness, but everyone else was keen to get some more knowledge. The first session was on "Squash Etiquette" - emphasising the importance of respecting the court operator, fellow competitors, referees, coaches and parents.

Still going with the alphabet, number and colour themes, the players used the 4 "warm-up principles" to complete a good warm up. We then continued on from the previous day's theme adding some decision-making training using Patterns, then spent some time on Serve and Return.

The 'Tough Mudda' challenge was next, challenging us all ... with the eventual winners having the loudest voices!

The WA State Masters Championship is our biggest tournament of the year. On the weekend 21-23 July, 96 competitors, aged from 35 to 83, participated in the 2017 Championship. The three days of age based competition saw 18 Open events and 8 Division 2 events.

Players came from near and far to participate. The West Australian country was well represented with players from Geraldton, Bunbury, Busselton and Collie. Blair McKenzie added an international flavour, arriving from Scotland during the week, playing over the weekend before travelling home again. A big thank you to those who travelled to support the tournament.
