The 2017 Sharks team has been announced. Congratulations to all the players who were chosen especially those selected for the very first time.

The Sharks will be aiming to win their 14th National Title in succession when

they participate in the Australian Junior Championships in Geelong in September.

Queenslanders Nick Calvert, Lachlan Coxsedge, Ethan Eyles and Courtney Mather then represented Australia at the World Junior Championships in New Zealand.

# **Q SQUASH TALKS TO ELLA BURGE**

Firstly, Congratulations Ella on your fantastic win this year!

Last year you dominated the U13 event and now you find yourself winning the U15 title as a 13 year old.

How does it feel?

I am very proud of how much I have improved since aging up from U13 last November, I have trained very hard and played many fixtures and tournaments to improve my game.

The win speaks volumes about your

development over the past year.

What improvements do you think have contributed to your rise to the top?

I think mostly the mental side of my game has improved the most. I used to get very anxious and intimidated when playing against players who I knew would be difficult to beat. I tended to freeze up. I have developed a routine I go through before each match and I find that this helps me focus and enjoy my squash more.

## Was that your first win over Katie Davies?

When Katie first started playing squash, I used to beat her. However, she improved very fast due to hard work and commitment to her game and then she started beating me. I have beaten her occasionally, however it had been a while

since I had beaten her before my win at the QJC.

I recently beat Katie in a very tough 5 game match in the U17 finals of the 2017 NSW Junior Age Championships. We both played extremely well and I won the 5th 13-11.

You beat the 2016 QJC U15 champion Hayley Hankinson at the Secondary Schools. Was that a break through win for you?

Most definitely, Hayley has always been

the highest ranked player in my age group, Everyone wants to beat the number 1 player. She is a really good player which is why she has held the number 1 position in my age group for so long. The win against Hayley helped my self confidence.

It was pleasing to see you were also runner up in the U17 event. That probably gave selectors the confidence to select you for the Sharks U17 team. How does that sit with you?

I am really looking forward to the challenge and I'm grateful to the selectors for giving me the opportunity to play in the Sharks U17 girls team with Mackenzie and Lauren. This also means that I have to continue working hard with my training to ensure that I play well at Geelong and do my part

to help the Sharks win again in 2017.

## Have you won any other titles that you are particularly proud of?

Yes, in addition to the 2017 QJC U15 and 2017 Queensland Schools U15 titles, I won the U15 and U17 titles in the 2017 South Australian Junior Age Championships and the U17 title in the 2017 New South Wales Junior Age Championships.

My school (Indooroopilly High) awarded me the school's 2016 Junior Sportsperson of the year in October last year based on my selection in the Australian Schools' team to play against New Zealand and participation in other representative sport for the school.

# Congratulations for also winning the Rachael Grinham Achievement Award. Did that come as a shock? What does it mean to you?

It definitely came as a shock, it means that all my hard work has paid off. It is a prestigious award and I'm honoured to be the 2017 recipient.

#### Your toughest opponent so far?

This is a good question and it is difficult to answer because most of the players I play are in Brisbane or in Queensland. In Queensland I would say Katie (just over Hayley). I have to play my best squash to have a chance to beat Katie.

But from the other states, I have had tough matches against Erin Classen from WA and Jemma Besant from NSW. Erin has just aged up to U15 so I think it will be interesting to see how I play against her at Geelong if the opportunity arises.



## Your coach is Robyn Prentice. What does she bring to your game?

Everything. Robyn has always helped me whenever I have asked. Robyn has lots of experience as a player and coach. She has really helped me out with managing my mental game, technique, fitness and many other aspects of my game.

#### How did you get started in squash?

My dad played socially and he frequently took my brother and me to the courts for a hit. He took me to Robyn's junior squash group training and the rest is history.

## Do you have any brothers or sisters? If so do they play?

Yes, I have an older brother named Jack, he does play fixtures but not tournaments. He is a friendly player and likes to joke around on court and have fun (he used to beat me, but not anymore). I want my brother to play squash tournaments again because he was good at playing.

### Do you aspire to play on the professional circuit?

Yes, I love the game and even if I don't do the professional circuit, I want to pursue the game as much as I can.
