Here is another opportunity. The Minister for Public Works and Housing and Minister for Sport launched the **Female Facilities Program**. This Program aims to assist sport and recreation organisations and local governments to develop functional and inclusive female change rooms and amenities that meet the current and future needs of sport and recreation participants.

Opportunities are being lost to fund computer hardware and software, upgrades to club facilities, fixtures, tournaments and electronic scoring; cameras or go-pros for coaching and real time telecasting; updating websites; Facebook; etc.

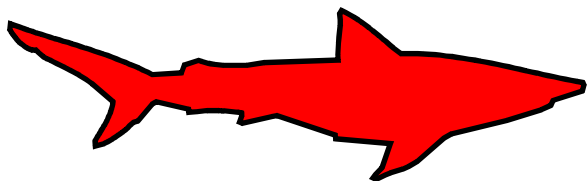
Sporty HQ

Ace Reporter **Jules Condon** interviewed 3 Sharks for Squash media.

Your name and age group

C = Courtney Mather Gu19

J = Josh Porter Bu13

K = Kurstyn Mather Gu15

What has been your highlight(s) for 2017?

C = Playing the World Juniors in NZ

J = Making the Queensland Sharks team

K = Playing QJC and representing QLD at the schools in Rockhampton.

What have you done in 2017 that has helped you achieve your highlight(s)?

C = I've put a lot of effort in on the court with Marc and Steve. I'm playing Division 1 in the Cairns Fixtures and I use these games to work on changes I'm making in my game. I'm working hard to better my game physically and psychologically. I ensure I use all my resources and opportunities to be a better player.

J = Trained really hard, improved my fitness by doing circuit training and kept a squash journal.

K = I'm playing squash up to 7 times a week. I have extended my training off court to include running up mountains. I listen and try really hard when training with coaches Marc Forster and Steve Finitsis.

What are your long-term goals?

C = My goal is to be number 1 in Australia in my age group, improve my world ranking and continue progressing into the PSA.

J = In 2 or 3 years I want to be playing division 1 in Cairns. Continue representing Northern Region Redbacks, Queensland Sharks and play for Australia.

K = My goals are to make the Australian U19 team for the World Junior Championships and the Australian team for the 2022 Commonwealth Games. I'm also working hard to improve my Qld and Australian rankings.





NOT ALL SHARKS ARE THE SAME

What is the most difficult obstacle standing in your way of achieving success?

C = Currently, I'm in year 12 so I'm focused on finishing my exams and assessment and looking forward to graduating in November. Time off from school to play in representative teams has been challenging. Money is a major barrier to achieving my goals. Living in Cairns, I have access to great coaches but it is expensive to travel for tournaments and championships.

J = Keeping up my school work. Injuries can be a problem. I've had a problem with one of my ankles 3 times this year and I recently fractured one of my fingers.

K = The competition in the U15 age group is very tough in Qld and Australia.

What are you doing to overcome this obstacle?

C = I'm focusing on my studies to finish school. In regards to my squash I focus psychologically on my end goals and believing in myself that I can meet my goals. I work to contribute financially to my squash but mostly I have to thank my parents for making it possible for me to play squash at the level I do. I have also applied for grants.

J = To play my best squash, I'm aiming to keep fit and healthy, do lots of training and listen to my coaches. For my school-work I need to be organised and I do my assignments as soon as I get them.

K = I'm training harder and trying to do more than my opponents.

Who are your main rivals?

C = My rivals are all the players I step on the court with.

J = Ben Murray

K = I treat everyone the same on the court and I want to win all my matches.

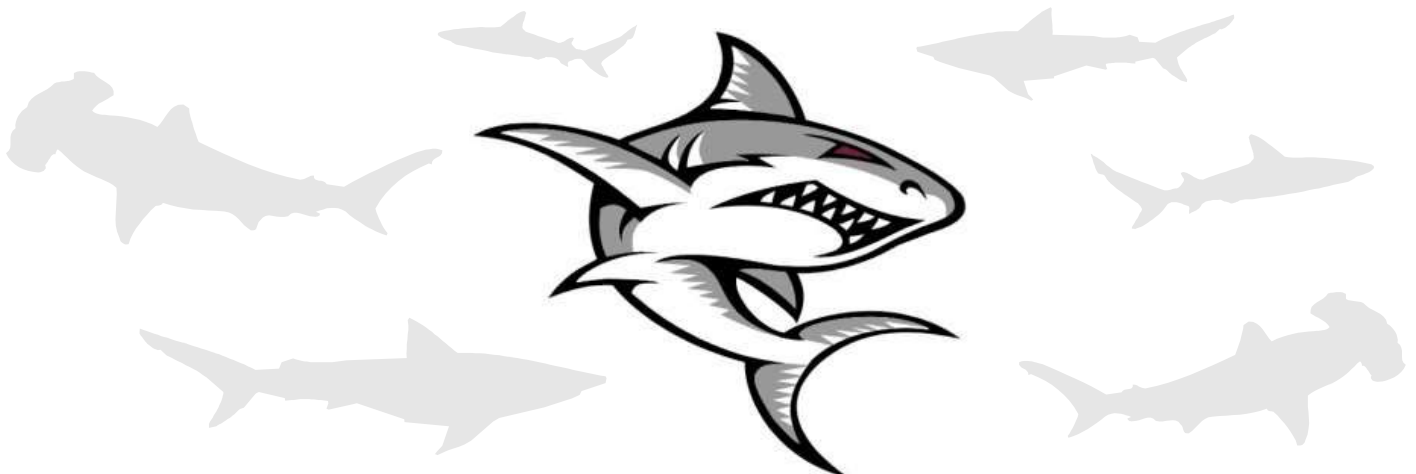

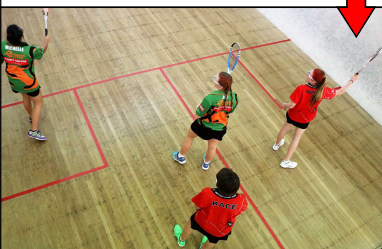

The home of the Squash Fanatic in Mackay was opened in 1968 by one of the Absolute Legends of the sport Heather McKay at 52 Brisbane Street Mackay North Queensland and was promptly known as "Squash 52".



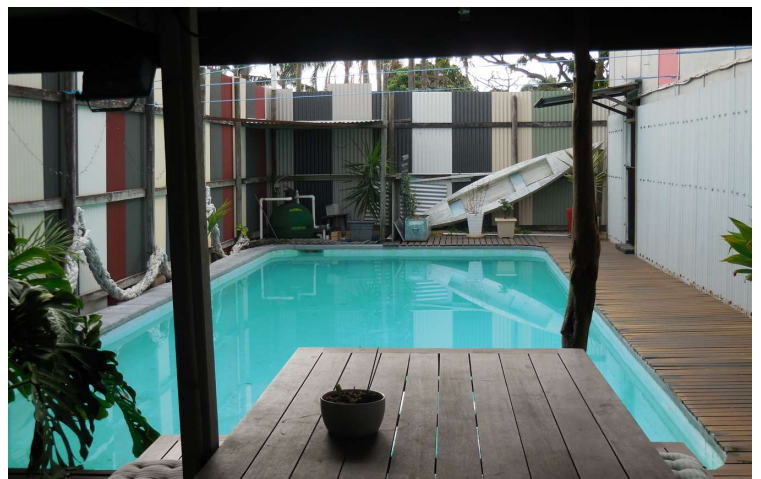
The Centre started out as a 4 court squash club. Two above ground courts were added by building them above the car park in front of the existing centre. I'm not exactly sure when the pool at the back of the courts was added but it seems to have been around as long as most people can remember. It feels like heaven diving into it at the end of a 5 setter in balmy December or January.

The courts were run by Bob and Patty Courtice for 40 years until the mantle was passed to Bob and Patty's son Ben in 2015. The courts were always a place where you could find a cheerful greeting and friendly advice on how to improve your squash and many other areas of your life as well!

The courts have hosted many memorable matches including exhibitions by Heather McKay and Geoff Hunt playing some of the best local talent including Russell Gardner, Ian Carlisle and Ben Courtice.

The Courts have undergone a transformation in recent years with one court being turned into a gymnasium, with a full time personal trainer hosting women only classes under the courts in front of the Centre - her way of attracting attention!

There are still 5 courts with the main court having a double story grandstand which was last filled to capacity when

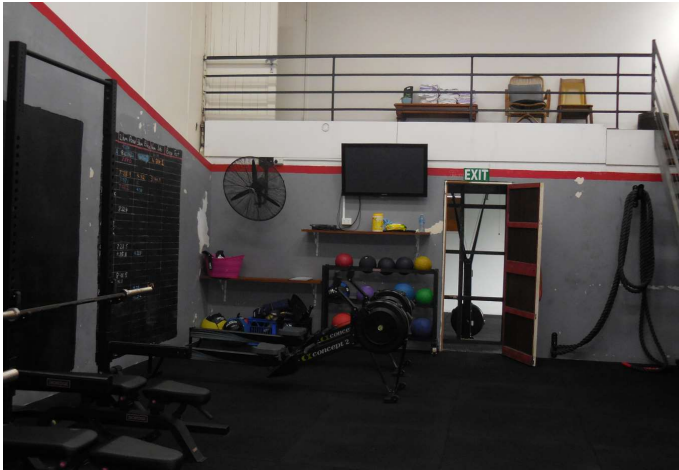

local PSA Player Brad Hindle played Ben Courtice in an exhibition match to mark the 40th anniversary of the opening of the courts.

The Squash is still thriving with a social club night on Mondays boasting 6 teams of 4 with anyone else who shows up sure to get a game. Tuesdays have 8 teams of 6 fairly serious squash players, battling it out using PAR to 15 with it being mandatory to go to 17 if it is 14 all.



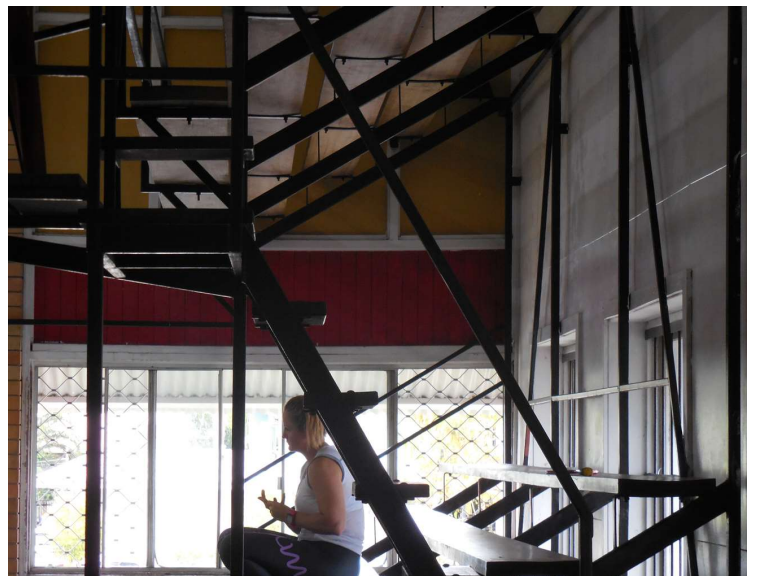
Thursday is the A grade competition with 8 teams of 5 players. When the A Graders get tired there is a stalwart of very social and friendly Doubles players who start about 8:30 and continue playing until nearly 11:00pm. A lot of the players play at least twice a week.

The club travels to most tournaments with **"52 on Tour"** taking part in events in

Gladstone and Rockhampton and of course the 52 Open.

Ben Courtice and Andrew Ollette have started coaching Juniors on a Friday afternoon with assistance from Gillian Nielsen, Chris Chambers, Patty Courtice and Aunty Carmel (currently out of action and on the injury list) with a view to starting fixtures in the new year.

I would like to think that Kay Barclay would be having a chat with Bob Courtice and Ian Carlisle as they watch the developments at 52 helping breathe some hope and life into the squash scene in Mackay.



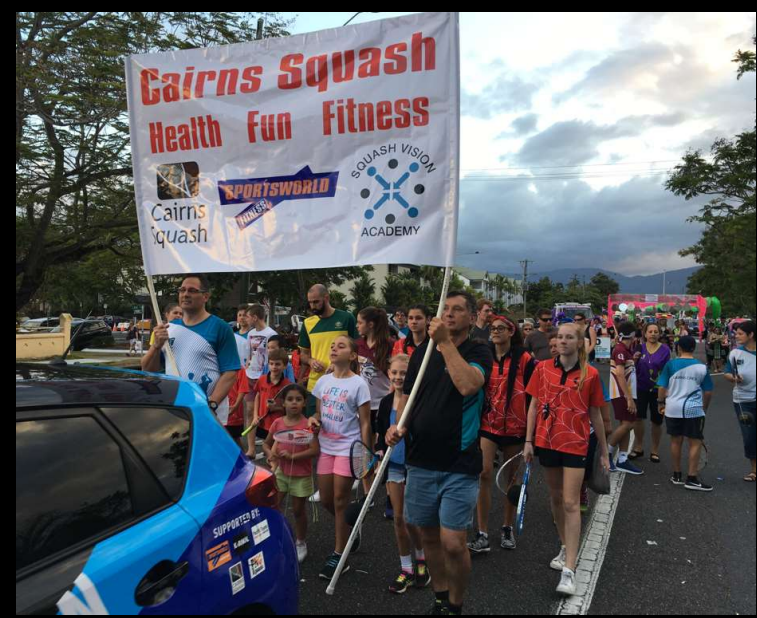

2017 REDSTAR AWARDS

In an effort to recognise more NR juniors we have introduced a new system of performance recognition. From now on **every finalist will be recognised**. Each winner will be listed in the Achievement category and every finalist (runner up) will be listed in the Encouragement category.

Once a player has won an event they will be elevated and listed in the Achievement category even if they finish runner up in other events. If players are equal they will be listed in alphabetical order.

Players receive 2 points for winning a qualifier, 4 points for winning a Queensland State title and 6 points for winning a National title (AJO & AJC). Players will receive 1 point for finishing runner up in a qualifier, 2 points for runner up in a State final and 3 points for runner up in a National final.

Even though the Ingham qualifier was played in October 2016 it is still a 2017 qualifier so the results from that event will contribute to the **2017 NR Player of the Year Award**. A 2018 qualifier played in 2017 will not be included.

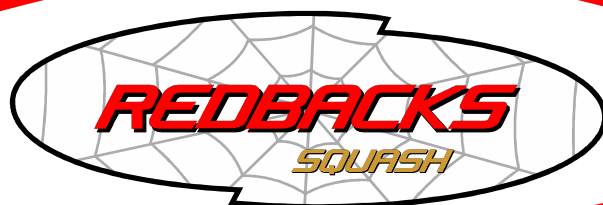
The player who accumulates the most points will be declared the Player of the Year. There will be joint winners if 2 players finish on the same number of points. The aim of the points system is to automate the selection and player results determine the outcome. The system is also designed to encourage players to support all events in their quest to accumulate points.

To be awarded points there must be at least two players competing in an age group.

If an event is combined eg U17 and U19 Combined then it will be analysed to ensure points are allocated to both U17 and U19. A direct match up of the best two players in an age group will determine the winner of that age group. Otherwise the highest finishing position in an age group will receive the maximum points.

A player can only enter up to 2 events so they can only be rewarded with 2 results. An U9 player who might win a combined event eg U9, U11 and U13 Combined can only be rewarded for the U13 victory and their own age group U9. If they were the only player in U9 they will earn points for both U13 and U11.

- 1 Games may be scheduled for Friday evening for available players.
- 2 Otherwise players are expected to be available between 8:30 am and 5 pm on Saturday and Sunday except with prior approval.
- 3 Doubles teams will be determined to maximise experience in that format.
- 4 The Graded draw is intended for new or less experienced players who wish to compete in a separate draw with players of similar ability and proficiency regardless of age/gender. The players will be graded based on ability by tournament organisers.
- 5 Graded events are not eligible for rankings or Redbacks team selection.
- 6 All grading will be made relative to Q Squash guidelines and the tournament committee reserves the right to regrade any player.
- 7 **Best of 5 Games to 11 PARS** - Tie break at 10 all.
To win a game you must win it by 2 points
- 8 XX Yellow Dot balls will be used.
- 9 The wearing of Protective Eyewear is **COMPULSORY** at this tournament.
Players Under 13 must also wear a mouth guard.
