WORLD DOUBLES CAMPAIGN

Queenslanders **Zac Alexander** and **Rachael Grinham** played in the World Doubles Championship in Manchester in August.

Alexander and partner David Palmer were seeded #3 but lost to the English pairing of Declan James and James Willstrop in the quarter finals. The Aussie pair went down narrowly in 77 minutes - the second longest match of the Championships.

The longest match was the Men's semi final between [1] Alan Clyne & Greg Lobban (SCO) bt [4] Paul Coll & Campbell Grayson (NZL) 11-8, 8-11, 11-8 (82m).

Alexander and Palmer had previously won a silver medal at the 2016 World Doubles Championship in Darwin so it was a slightly disappointing result.

Grinham on the other hand played in both the Women's Doubles (with Donna Urquhart) and the Mixed Doubles (with David Palmer).

Despite having won three World Doubles gold medals previously, Grinham had to settle for two bronze medals at this Championship.

Expectations were high for the Grinham/Urquhart combination following a silver medal at the 2016 World Doubles Championships and all was going fine until disaster struck!

Sadly, after a fantastic quarter final win against England's #4 seeds Laura Massaro & Sarah-Jane Perry, Urquhart suffered a calf injury in a Mixed Doubles match. The injury forced her out of the Championship.

Fortunately, 3rd and 4th place received a bronze medal!

WORLD DOUBLES CAMPAIGN

The Mixed Doubles saw the old pairing of Grinham and Palmer back together again.

The 2014 Commonwealth Games gold medalists were installed as the #4 seeds and reached the semi finals accordingly. They then lost to the current World Champions and eventual winners - #1 seeds Joelle King & Paul Coll (NZL) 8-11, 8-11 in 29 minutes.

So another bronze medal was in the bag with no Playoff for 3rd required to be played.

The **Australian Doubles** will be played in February 2018 (13-15) as a final hit out for our stars just prior to the April Commonwealth Games.



2017 Trans Tasman Challenge



The competitive year for Queensland School Squash has wrapped up for 2017 with the Trans-Tasman Challenge. Capricornia region hosted the tournament at the Scottvale Park Squash Centre in Rockhampton from 21-24 August.

The Trans-Tasman Challenge involves a team each from Queensland, New South Wales and New Zealand. The teams, each of 20 players (5 male & 5 female players in U19 age group & U15 age group), are selected from the states' (and country's, in New Zealand's case) individual school championships.

This tournament has been running since 2012 with the venue being rotated between the 3 teams each year. NSW will be hosting the tournament in 2018.

Doubles & singles are played over 3 days and the fourth day is the 'Test Match' where a combined QLD & NSW team (selected by the coaches of both state teams) battles it out against the NZ team.

Some long and hard fought matches were seen during the tournament but NZ still emerged the victor. Queensland's Hayley Hankinson & BJ MacDonald were undefeated during the tournament, in their respective age groups.


