who has won the 2017 NR RedStar Player of the Year.

Hankinson accumulated 17 points over 7 events to win the Junior Award from Wes Dyer on 14 points and a group of 4 players on 12 points.

It was the first time the Award was determined by the players themselves.

Reflecting on the year it was highlighted by Hankinson winning the AJO and finishing 3rd at the AJC. The emergence of youngster Kayce Hoani Vincent who won a State title as did Courtney Mather and BJ MacDonald. Mather also represented Australia at the World Juniors.

Junior Tournaments

By now players will be looking toward competing in the Oceania Junior Championships on 11-14 January 2018 at Redcliffe PCYC, closely followed by the Australian Junior Open on 18-21 January 2018 at Nerang Squash and Fitness.

Enter "Events" via the Squash Australia Website. Its time for athletes to ramp up the fitness and training for these annual events.

Then, of course there is the first compulsory qualifier for the region – the Cairns Junior Championships on 17-18 February 2018 at Sportsworld. I'm thrilled to advise that the Cairns Club is poised to forge partnerships for all recommended sponsorship categories (below).

All clubs and centres hosting 2018 regional tournaments should have their respective letters of engagement for the 2018 tournaments. This marks the launch of our highest awarded tournaments in the Country!

Ranking Appeals

Some players and parents have expressed concerns about state and regional rankings. The few NR ranking concerns have all been resolved. I thank our Selection Committee for the proper and timely resolution of all appeals under the appeals procedure.

There remain concerns about the State ranking procedures. I will continue to lobby Q Squash to retrospectively publish rankings so that players can be publicly recognised for their post QJC journey - both in their own age group, and other eligible events. Rankings are a very valuable and positive reinforcement, and reward for players dedicated to the pathway.

Representative Selection - Redbacks/QJC

The committee have introduced a payment plan for QJC whereby players can make periodic instalments towards the costs of the Redbacks Team food, accommodation and coaching staff. The payments can be customised based on estimated costs. Any excess payments or non-selections will be accounted for and refunded.

A reminder to any parents and carers for QJC volunteer support – you need to have a current BlueCard. NR assure parents of the highest standards and compliance.

It is a timely reminder that players are expected to always show good sportsmanship and behaviour, and coaches and clubs should make every effort to identify players who could benefit from behavioural instruction and support.

Apart from qualifying for the annual award for best and fairest player, good sportsmanship impresses selectors, parents and spectators alike.

2017 REDSTAR AWARDS

It has certainly been a roller coaster ride for **Hayley Hankinson** in 2017. The year began well with Hayley winning the Australian Junior Open in January.

The passing of her coach Kay Barclay in February was very sad and left Hayley feeling she needed to honour the memory of her coach. Back on court Hayley won the Cairns Qualifier in her age group and finished runner up in the higher age group.

March saw Hayley recognised as the 2016 Q Squash Junior Player of the Year. She also won two age groups at the Townsville Qualifier. She repeated that achievement in April at the Mackay Compulsory to take her points tally to 17 - 5 points clear of Wes Dyer.

April also saw Hayley travel to NZ for the Oceania Junior Championships and Trans Tasman Series. Hayley lost in the semi finals but bounced back in the TTS to win both her matches.

May saw Hayley reach the final of the State Secondary Schools but fortunes didn't go her way and they didn't improve in June either. Hayley was forced out of the QJC on medical grounds. Despite the setback she was still chosen to represent the Sharks.

August saw Hayley help Queensland win the Secondary Schools Interstate Challenge against NSW and in October Hayley finished on the podium at the AJC with a bronze medal. She remained undefeated in the teams event helping Queensland to win the overall combined team title for a record 14th time.

So the 2017 junior squash year was over. Hayley remained on 17 points to take the inaugural **REDSTAR** Player of the Year Award **based on performance as opposed to selection**.

Congratulations also to **Sarah Brazier** and **Francis Morove** who shared the **REDSTAR** Encouragement Award.

Players travelled from Brisbane, Gladstone, Rockhampton, Moranbah and Townsville to compete against our locals. The weather this year was much kinder than the 2016 Open, with lower temperatures and humidity making playing conditions more ideal than last year.

With the Xmas party to be held on Saturday night, games kicked off on Friday afternoon and play started early on Saturday morning to make sure everyone was on time for the party. A big thank you must go to everyone who travelled and to all of the local players who helped make the tournament a resounding success. Also, full credit to everyone who worked tirelessly for the weeks leading up to the weekend and for their support during the tournament. Without your help, the 52 Open wouldn't be half as good as it was and will continue to be in the coming years.

2018 REDSTAR AWARDS



In an effort to recognise more NR juniors we have revised our system of performance recognition. From now on every placegetter (1-2-3) will be recognised. Each winner of an aged event will be listed in the Achievement category and every player who finishes second or third will be listed in the Encouragement category.

Once a player has won an event they will be elevated and listed in the Achievement category even if they finish runner up or third in other events. If players are equal they will be listed in alphabetical order.

Players receive 3 points for winning a qualifier, 6 points for winning a Queensland State title and 9 points for winning a National title (AJO & AJC). Players will receive 2 points for finishing runner up in a qualifier, 4 points for runner up in a State final and 6 points for runner up in a National final. Players will receive 1 point for finishing third in a qualifier, 2 points for third in a State final and 3 points for third in a National event. U19 Players will also receive 1 bonus point for each result because they cannot enter 2 events.

Even though the Ingham qualifier was played in October 2017 it is still a 2018 qualifier so the results from that event will contribute to the **2018 NR Player of the Year Award.** A 2019 qualifier played in 2018 will not be included.

The player who accumulates the most points will be declared the Player of the Year. There will be joint winners if 2 players finish on the same number of points. The aim of the points system is to automate the selection and player results determine the outcome. The system is also designed to encourage players to support all events in their quest to accumulate points.

If an event is combined eg U17 and U19 Combined then it will be analysed to ensure points are allocated to both U17 and U19. A direct match up of the best two players in an age group will determine the winner of that age group. Otherwise the highest finishing position in an age group will receive the maximum points. **To be awarded points there must be at least two players competing in an age group.**

A player can only enter up to 2 events so they can only be rewarded with 2 results. An U9 player who might win a combined event eg **U9**, **U11 and U13 Combined** can only be rewarded for the U13 victory and their own age group U9 providing there are two U9 players competing. If there is only one player in U9 they will earn points for U13 only. If there was one player in U9 and one in U11 they will still only be rewarded for their efforts in U13.


