AUSTRALIAN OPEN

Installed as the #1 seed **Rachael Grinham** hit a purple patch of form and beat all her opponents into submission in straight. She even avenged a loss she suffered at the Q Open beating Christine Nunn in the semi final.

In October Grinham lost to Nunn 8-11, 11-6, 11-13, 8-11 (52m) but in Darwin it was a clinical display by the former World #1 destroying Nunn 11-7, 11-5, 11-9 in a brisk 29 minutes.

The 2007 World Champion returned to the winner's podium for the first time since winning the Australian Closed in December 2014. Today at 40 years of age, Grinham is still ranked #32 in the World.

Q SQUASH NEWS CHASE YOUR DREAM

Hi, my name is **Lisa Camilleri** and I'm a squash player, coach, entrepreneur and business owner.

Today, I'm going to briefly explain what I have achieved through squash: I'm a 2 time Commonwealth Games representative, 5 times Australian representative, a former world #28 and I've won 21 professional titles.

I would now like to tell you a little about how my squash career unfolded and what sport has given back to me.

From the age of 8, I had a dream to one day get an Australian Institute of Sport Scholarship and to represent Australia. And so, from that choice my journey began.



But to have a dream is not enough. You must search for the right people that will have maximum impact on your improvement. And you must have an **unshakable desire** to achieve your dream.

My team today, consists of people that surround me with love, positive energy, confidence and they work with me to turn my dreams into reality.

I grew up on a farm in Murray Upper, so I lived 25 minutes from a squash court. At that time, there were no squash academies, coaches or institutes in Tully!

But I didn't let that get in my way. I loved squash and I wanted to become an elite athlete who would one day represent Australia.

How it all began

I played my first Queensland junior state title when I was 9 and I won it. I then went on to win every Queensland state title from the age of 9 to 18. When I turned 18 I was scouted by the Australian Institute of sport and moved to Brisbane to train under the AIS coaches.

I turned Pro at the age of 19 and I have played on the Pro Squash Tour for the past 16 years. In those 16 years I travelled the world, experienced different cultures, lived in Malaysia (Kuala Lumpur), America (Baltimore and New York), New Zealand and most importantly I earned the opportunity to represent Australia on 5 different occasions

I believe what I have really achieved through squash is:

Q SQUASH NEWS DREAM BIG

(1) Opportunity

Having the opportunity to **chase my dream**, compete at the highest level and the ability to do what I love and what I'm passionate about for the past 16 years. There were lots of struggles, blood, sweat and tears lost along the way but when you are doing something you love it's all worth it.

(2) Resilience

Resilience comes a lot easier as you get older. When you're in your late teens and twenties you seem to want everything NOW! But, no one becomes a champion at anything in life unless you fail, fail and try again. Sport is tough in the sense that you train your guts out, you get injured and at times have certain losses that you shouldn't have but sport teaches you to learn from your mistakes, set new goals and get back on track to achieving your ultimate goals.

(3) Personal Growth

I was a very shy isolated young lady, I hated being away from home and I experienced separation anxiety. So, for me to pursue squash as a career was not really an ideal thing to do. But I knew I had to challenge myself, I knew I had to put myself out there if I wanted to one day represent Australia.

Pursuing squash was a path like no other. It has made me the person I am today.

As I come near to my retirement and as I look toward the next chapter of my life, I feel I can take on anything. My journey as a professional athlete has developed qualities in me that employers hold dear: team work, communication skills, leadership skills, time management, working under pressure, goal setting and the ability to work bloody hard to achieve.

I would encourage all junior athletes to <u>not</u> get obsessed with wins / losses, but to push yourself to the best of your ability each and every day. Engage yourself in the moment and have a vision or a dream of what you want from your sport, regardless of the outcome. If you do that, you will reap the benefits in the long run.

So, work hard and dream big!
