#### Rankings

I'm confident that Q Squash share our view that rankings are a very valuable and positive reinforcement, and reward for players dedicated to the pathway. With lessons learned from the past, I expect that rankings will be determined and published in a timely way in accordance with long established policy.

#### Redbacks/QJC – Payment Plan

#### **Regional Grants & Sponsorship**

In late December, we were invited to express interest for a bank of 3 courts to be relocated into the Northern Region after the Commonwealth Games. While the courts would be free, other costs are well beyond our reach – namely, logistics (\$80,000 to \$100,000), ready location, planning approval, and constructions costs. Consequently, the Northern Region is not in a sound position to peruse the opportunity.

**Lisa Camilleri**, one of Australia's best squash players recently visited Mackay to help promote junior squash at the Centre.

From Monday 11th to Wednesday 13th December Lisa coached 17 new (never played Mackay Leisure Centre

squash before) juniors. It is a privilege to have Lisa come to Mackay, compliments of a grant from Q Squash for junior squash development.

Even on the first day of the camp one of the new juniors commented enthusiastically *"I have found my new sport ... it was so much fun".* 

Another junior was so disappointed when the training session had finished and just wanted to keep going. Lisa was so blown away by the uncut potential in these children who are participating in the Junior Squash Come and Try Camp. Lisa also stated "17 kids for training ... that's fantastic!"

Lisa's vast experience and knowledge as a squash player (two time Commonwealth Games Representative and a National Talent Development Coach) is not only a huge draw for the development of junior squash at the Mackay Leisure Centre but for the whole of the Mackay region.

Whilst here Lisa coached some of the elite juniors of Mackay. This was particularly important for players like National Junior Champion Hayley Hankinson with the Australian Junior Open and Oceania Championships being conducted in January.

Another bonus has been the announcement that the **2018 Mackay Junior Open** (Compulsory Event) has now shifted to the Mackay Leisure Centre. The Australian Junior Squash Tour Silver Event will be conducted from 5-6 May 2018.

### **2017 Singapore Junior Open**

#### **Mission Impossible 6**

The mission ... if we chose to accept it ... was to raid Singapore of the Under 15 Singapore Junior Open title.

#### The squad:

Brendan MacDonald: One On One Combat expert and Squash Player Alec MacDonald: Coach and Espionage Expert Sasha MacDonald: Medical Officer and Expert Credit Card Demolitions Expert Bridget MacDonald: Apprentice Credit Card Demolition Expert

#### First Day:

We assembled in Mackay at 02:30 hours to get to the airport in time for lift off at 06:00 hours. The departure was delayed for 30 minutes which meant that we had only a bit more than an hour to make the trip to the Brisbane International Airport and get our equipment through Customs.

The flight to Singapore was also delayed and we made our seats comfortably within time. The flight to Singapore was 8 hours and we touched down at 15:30 hours Singapore time (17:30 Mackay time). We then had to wait for other players to arrive from Macau and Malaysia. The Macau team included some players we had met at the Tasmanian AJO!

We finally made it to our accommodation at 19:40 (21:40 Mackay) a very long day over. Luckily BJ had a bye for the first round.

#### 2nd Day:

While the rest of the team slept in and shopped I went for a reconnoitre of the facilities and to attend the Coaches meeting, where we were told the Tournament would be conducted on a follow on basis, but no match would be put on more than 1 hour earlier than scheduled. I also had to get all of BJ's racquets restrung as the "Mackay People" could not get them done before we left. There was a huge back log of restrings at the centre but as his first game was at 15:30 the next day we were going to be able to have at least one racquet strung in time!

When I arrived back at the hotel the team was returning from the shops full of stories of things they could buy and carrying numerous parcels. I was thinking that there must not be much left to buy and that the credit card did not have a Long Expected Lifespan left!

#### **3rd day First Match**

I had breakfast by myself as the team were sleeping in to recover from the shopping expedition of the day before. BJ arose about 11:00 hours and had brunch at Burger Bar (a shop that sells Burgers and Beer - what a great concept). We then boarded the bus to get to the courts in plenty of time for the match against James Nichol (British Citizen

no relation to Peter, living in Singapore). As it turned out all 3 of BJ's racquets were restrung and waiting for him.

The warmup commenced with both players getting a feel for the court (all the courts were air-conditioned, but not the spectator galleries) and at the end the 2 players had a private discussion between themselves. I later found out that James said to BJ "Just Between us How Old are you Really?" I think the question riled BJ a bit and he tore into the first game hitting winners left, right and centre winning the game 11-4.

I told him to not take it for granted and keep playing A Grade squash. Well he must have still been riled up as the winners did not stop, except for a few rallies that BJ seemed to deliberate longer than necessary. He won the game 11-0. I then told him he should rally with his opponent to get a full feel for the courts. He eased up in the 3rd with a lot of rallies and won the game 11-5.

I was later tapped on the shoulder by tournament control and asked to come to the office. I was thinking that James had put in an official query regarding BJ's age, and oh no Sasha had his passport! As it turns out we had over-paid our entry fee and they just wanted to refund the money and have me sign a receipt for the refund – crisis adverted!

#### 4th Day – Quarter Finals

The day started out with a shopping expedition and we only made it back to the Hotel in time to grab a 6 inch sub and catch the bus arriving only an hour before the match started. Coach is facing disciplinary action on the grounds of getting the balance of shopping to squash wrong. BJ was up against the number 2 seed and Singapore's number 1 player Edward Thing and was playing on the all glass court in the main stadium.

The first game started with both players getting acquainted with each other, but Edward exploded into action with a cross between a cross-court drive and a kill shot and won the last 4 points in a flash to win 11-7.

BJ said he was nervous and I said he was loose and needed to cover the cross-court drive/kill as it was hurting him badly, and it was just another game and he should imagine it was Wesley he was playing. Well he covered the cross-court drive and cut them off with devastating drops, so much so that after this game we saw very few of the cross-court shots from Edward. BJ also found his range with his cross-court drive from the backhand front corner with the ball dying in the back of the court. BJ won this game 11-6.

The 3rd game started with both players trading points until 5 all and then BJ seemed to slow markedly and Edward ran away with it 11-6. BJ said he was starting to cramp in the quads. I told him that there was not much he could do about it now and he would

have to battle through it.

The 4th game started with BJ racing to a 3 point lead and then Edward clawing his way back to 5 all. BJ clawed his way to 7-5 and then Edward got a few strokes and it was suddenly 10-7 match ball. Was it all over? Not a chance the next 2 rallies went for nearly 5 minutes each with BJ clinging desperately and running a marathon to win the rallies and narrowly losing the last point that was replayed 3 times due to lets called and awarded to both players. BJ narrowly went down 8-11.

#### 5th Day

We refocused our focus for the playoff for the 5-8 group and arrived in plenty of time for our 17:30 match. In the end we could have showed up nearly 2 hours late as the two matches before BJ's turned into 5 set marathons with the last game of the last match going to 19-17 in the 5th! BJ took to the court and sized up his opponent Samuel Lau. BJ won the match 11-8, 11-4, 11-6, but I guess he was hungry by then.

Well when we returned to the hotel the pile of parcels in Bridget and Sasha's room resembled Mount Everest, and it was decided that Bridget was going to need a bigger suitcase to get her purchases home!

#### 6th Day Playoff for 5 or 6

This was going to be a hard day. The game was to be played at 08:30 hours so we had to catch the 7:30 bus. I started poking the sleeping bear with a large stick and finally, got him up in time for a 7:00 breakfast before strolling down to catch the bus.

BJ sleepwalked onto the court and was 0-4 down before he realised he was playing a squash match and he needed to take it seriously. He started to hit good length and stopped doing the corkscrew boast, which although gave rise to applause when they went up, were considered too high risk and not quite working on the day. BJ battled to a hard fought win 11-8 in the first.

Now awake, BJ took to the court in the 2nd and ran his opponent off his legs and won 11-7. The 3rd game was a repeat of the 2nd with BJ winning 11-7. Tournament over and done with and the shopping and sightseeing to begin.

In the end we needed a larger suitcase for Bridget, BJ's first purchase was a pair of ASIC Gel Rocket 8 squash shoes followed by 10 different Rubik Cubes!

At the end of the day the mission was not as successful as we had hoped, but a good learning experience and BJ got over his fear of heights by going on the Large Sky Wheel and the Extreme Swing. Although while they were winching us and the swing into position BJ exclaimed "I think this is a really BAD idea". At that point I released the swing and he was pretty quiet after that!



Squash 52 has been successful in tendering to host the squash section of the 2018 NQ Games to be held in Mackay on the May long weekend.

With all age groups and standards to be catered for, it was decided to hold the Junior element of the tournament in conjunction with the final Redbacks Compulsory tournament at the Mackay Leisure Centre with the Open / Masters Divisions to be held at Squash 52.

This will ensure that the Juniors who wish to compete in both tournaments will be able to do so. These Juniors will have to nominate for both tournaments and pay the nomination fee for both as well. This will be a fantastic opportunity for Squash to show off the abilities of our Juniors.

Age Divisions on offer will be U9, U11, U13, U15, U17 and U19/21 combined in both the Girls and Boys, with NQ Games medallions to be awarded to the successful players.

Squash 52 will host the Open and Masters Divisions of the NQ Games, with grades from Novice to Open on offer and the Masters will start at Over 45's.

### **2018 OJC Preview**

Whilst it is fantastic having two major events being played in Queensland in January, it has placed a lot of strain on many families to play in both the Oceania Junior Championships and the Australian Junior Open.

Just over 150 players will compete in the Oceania Junior Championships with the Kiwis favourite to secure the most titles.

12 Players will be representing Northern Region at the Championships. We wish them every success.

#### U11B

Cairns's **Michael Lawrence** will be competing in a 6 player Round Robin

#### U13B

18 Players will line up to compete for the title. **Josh Porter** will be representing Cairns.

#### U15B

21 Players are competing with Mackay's **BJ MacDonald** the #3 seed. **U17B** 

27 Players will be striving to win the title. **Wes Dyer** (seeded #3) and **Kyle Hoani Vincent** will be representing Mackay.

#### U19B

25 Players desperately want to win this prestigious title but there can only be one winner. **Corey Condon** will represent Cairns but will face a tough assignment.

### U11G

Mackay's **Kayce Hoani Vincent** will be carrying the hopes of Northern Region when she lines up against 4 other girls in the Round Robin event.

#### U13G

9 Players will use two pools to determine the finalists in this event. Northern Region is not represented.

#### U15G

14 young ladies will be competing in this highly competitive event. Kurstyn Mather (seeded #6), Caitlin Porter and Amy Condon will represent Cairns.

### Ù17G

12 Girls will line up to challenge for the title. Mackay's **Hayley Hankinson** has been installed as the #2 seed. Our 2017 U15 AJO Champion has moved up to the higher age group.

### U19Ğ

14 Players will be competing for this coveted title. Our only chance is **Courtney Mather** (Cairns) who is the #5 seed. She is the only Queenslander in the field!







### **2018 REDSTAR AWARDS**

ORTHERN REGION



In an effort to recognise more NR juniors we have revised our system of performance recognition. From now on every placegetter (1-2-3) will be recognised. Each winner of an aged event will be listed in the Achievement category and every player who finishes second or third will be listed in the Encouragement category.

Once a player has won an event they will be elevated and listed in the Achievement category even if they finish runner up or third in other events. If players are equal they will be listed in alphabetical order.

Players receive 3 points for winning a qualifier, 6 points for winning a Queensland State title and 9 points for winning a National title (AJO & AJC). Players will receive 2 points for finishing runner up in a qualifier, 4 points for runner up in a State final and 6 points for runner up in a National final. Players will receive 1 point for finishing third in a qualifier, 2 points for third in a State final and 3 points for third in a National event. U19 Players will also receive 1 bonus point for each result because they cannot enter 2 events.

Even though the Ingham qualifier was played in October 2017 it is still a 2018 qualifier so the results from that event will contribute to the **2018 NR Player of the Year Award.** A 2019 qualifier played in 2018 will not be included.

The player who accumulates the most points will be declared the Player of the Year. There will be joint winners if 2 players finish on the same number of points. The aim of the points system is to automate the selection and player results determine the outcome. The system is also designed to encourage players to support all events in their quest to accumulate points.

If an event is combined eg U17 and U19 Combined then it will be analysed to ensure points are allocated to both U17 and U19. A direct match up of the best two players in an age group will determine the winner of that age group. Otherwise the highest finishing position in an age group will receive the maximum points. **To be awarded points there must be at least two players competing in an age group.** 

A player can only enter up to 2 events so they can only be rewarded with 2 results. An U9 player who might win a combined event eg **U9**, **U11 and U13 Combined** can only be rewarded for the U13 victory and their own age group U9 providing there are two U9 players competing. If there is only one player in U9 they will earn points for U13 only. If there was one player in U9 and one in U11 they will still only be rewarded for their efforts in U13.
