Pilley Overcomes Cuskelly in All-Australian First Round Battle at the PSA World Championships

Australia's World No.21 Cameron Pilley earned his place in the second round of the AJ Bell PSA World Championships after defeating compatriot Ryan Cuskelly 3-1 at the National Squash Centre in Manchester.

Pilley opened up a two-game cushion as he took control from the outset in the opening two games, before World No.14 Cuskelly battled back to dominate and take the third.



However, Yamba-born Pilley managed to regain control of the fixture as he returned to the game plan that had served him well early on in the match to close out an 11-8, 11-7, 4-11, 11-6 win and secure a second round berth, where he will face Egypt's Karim Ali Fathi.

"Mentally it was very tough," said Pilley following the gruelling encounter.

"We are pretty good mates and we grew up in the same part of Australia and it's always tough putting the friendship aside when you get on court. To make it worse we were teammates last week at the World Teams and we were sharing a room all week, so, it was kind of one of those ones where you just have to put it aside and focus on the game.

"I thought I played well in the first two, I made it tough and lengthened the rallies. Tactically, I thought it was pretty good and then I changed my game a little bit and he capitalised and dominated me, so then I had to go back to what I was doing in the first two and try to implement my game plan more than he implemented his and luckily it paid off."

Donna Urquhart's Thrilling Finish to Monte Carlo Classic

Australia's #1 squash player **Donna Urquhart** was installed as the #1 seed at the 2017 Monte Carlo Classic and won a tense final 11-9 in the fifth.

Urquhart had to work for the title from the very word go. Her first two matches went to five, the semi went to four and the final was yet another gruelling five setter.

In the final Urquhart needed 53 minutes to outlast 19 year old Egyptian Zeina Mickawy.

Unseeded Mickawy beat three seeds to reach the final including #6S Rachael Grinham.

During the **OJC** and **AJO** you will see one of the best squash photographers taking lots of photos to capture the action both on and off the court. **Toni van der Kreek** is no stranger to many of the junior players as they have probably seen her previously at many of the major events with her sons Ben, Jon and these days Robbie.

Squash Media loves Toni. Her photos make our publications come to life! She volunteers her time to capture memories and she is a delight to deal with.

This interview looks to uncover her motivation and get some much needed tips from her so everyone can learn how to take better squash photos! It also looks back at one of her most significant achievements of 2017 ... being an official photographer at the Rugby League State of Origin Decider between Queensland and NSW.

How did you get into photographing squash?

My kids started to play junior comps more often and I noticed that no photos were being taken and if they did they were using an iphone / ipad so the quality was not that good and we all wanted to see some photos after the event.

At that same time I had recently upgraded my camera, so I thought I would give it a go and try take some squash photos. I had no idea what I was doing, but it was fun and I managed to get some good shots. I've always liked to help out but being stuck in the kitchen was not my thing so I found I was able to help by just taking photos. After the first comp I took photos at, I did some research and purchased a few different lenses and got totally hooked into photography.

I've had lots of help along the way from other Squash parents including John Lockton and Tim Harradine.

What advice would you give to anyone taking squash shots that would improve their results quickly?

- Toni's Top 5 Tips -

1. Try shutter priority or full manual mode on your camera. (Shutter speed anywhere from 1/160 to 1/250, ISO leave as Auto, however if you don't like the grainy look see if you can set a max ISO setting eg anywhere from 1000 to 3200. Hint: Set your camera to overexpose by 2-4 stops ... the white squash walls can trick the camera.

- 2. Use continuous auto-focus mode and maybe try back button focus
- 3. I like to get photos with the players face and if possible the ball in the shot
- 4. Take lots of crowd shots they are always great to see
- 5. Have fun!!!

You spend many hours taking shots and uploading them to the internet. What motivates you to do this?

Good question!!! I must be mad, but I honestly do love taking sport photos, I like the colours, the movement of players, the challenge of getting a different type of shot, the natural expressions of the players, they are not fake but real emotions. Also, trying to pick the moment when some action will happen and when the desperate shots get played.

One of my favourite comps of 2017 was the BJO at Alex Hills on Mother's Days it was really nice to get some Mum and son/daughter photos.

What camera do you use?

Nikon D500 now, which is a semi pro sports camera and shoots 10fps.

My go-to lens would be the Nikon 24-70mm 2.8, it's fast to focus and at f/2.8 you can have faster shutter speeds as more light can get in.

The camera lens is just as important as the camera body.

You won a competition to officially photograph rugby league players from the sideline in the State of Origin Decider? Did you enjoy the experience? Can you describe how it felt?
