Only 9 Players will be representing WA at the Championships. We wish them every success.

Greg Chan and Remi Young have been installed as #1 seeds but Oscar Curtis and Abel Jin (both #2 seeds) in the same events will be striving to create two all WA finals.

U11B

Eric Marsh will be representing WA in this 6 player Round Robin event.

U13B

18 Players will line up to compete for the title. **Daniel Marsh** is the #6 seed.

U15B

21 Players are competing for the title. WA is a strong chance of winning this event. **Greg Chan** (#1S), **Oscar Curtis** (#2S) and **Kiran Byles** (#6S) are the leading contenders.

U17B

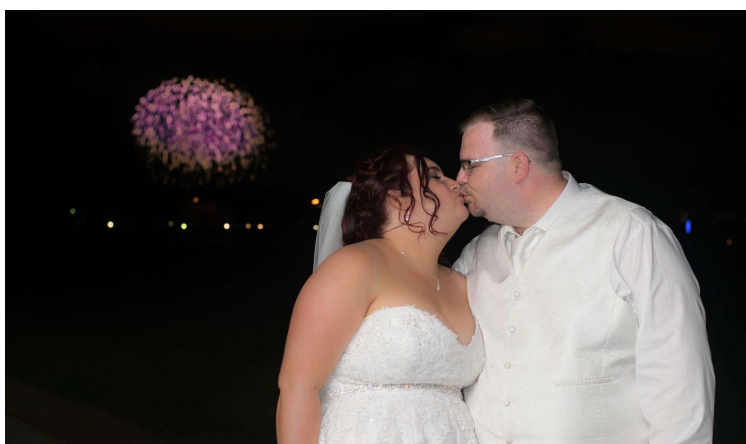
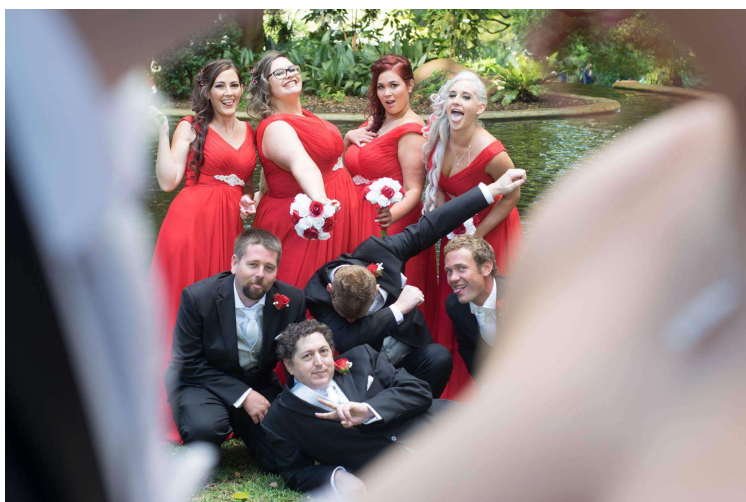
Chantelle and Brenton

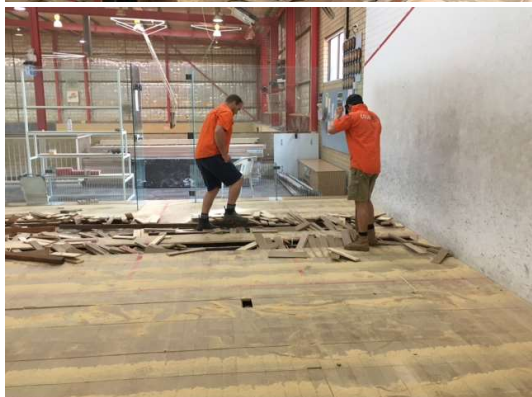

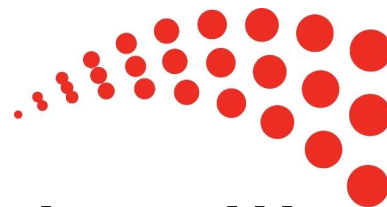

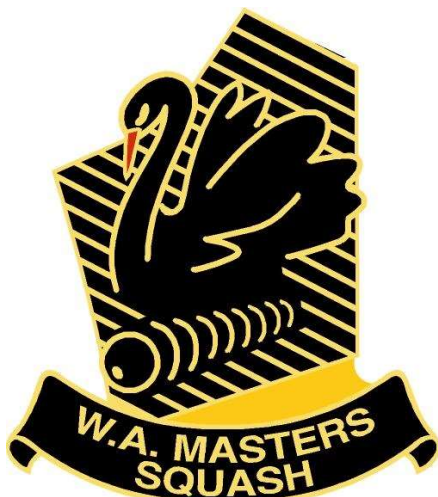
