Four Queenslanders reached their respective finals but had to settle for a silver medal.



QUEENSLANDERS at the TTTS

Queensland was represented by 7 athletes at the recent Trans Tasman Test Series where the 18 member Australian team was aiming to beat the Kiwis.

The current format of the TTTS was introduced in 2014 and Australia took the honours on that occasion. Since then it has been a bleak time with NZ dominating the series winning the last three.

Expectations were high that we might just be able to knock off the Kiwis but whilst a great effort being shown New Zealand emerged victors for the 4th year on a row.

Nick Calvert (U19B), Joel Arscott (U19B), Mackenzie Sleep (U17G), Ella Burge (U15G), Katie Davies (U15G), Madison Lyon (U13G) and Ben Murray (U13B) were our representatives.

On the first day Calvert, Arscott, Burge and Davies all recorded good wins. Calvert especially showed sheer guts and determination to win an 83 minute battle in five. NZ won the first test series 10 matches to 8.

On the second day Calvert, Sleep and Davies all recorded good wins. Unfortunately for Australia, the Kiwis won the second test 11-7 to take the overall tally to 21-15.

The Australian Junior Open Championships were played at Nerang Squash Centre on the Gold Coast.

Despite a number of Kiwis returning home after the OJC and TTTS the competition was still just as strong with a good mix of Kiwis and players from Malaysia and Singapore.

Australian players performed well winning 5 of the 10 titles on offer. Madison Lyon and Mackenzie Sleep flew the Queensland flag winning the U13 and U17 Girls titles.



Lyon took a little time to shake off the challenge of her opponent from Singapore but she won the title in style 11-6, 11-9, 9-11, 11-1 (23m).

It was a major achievement and turnaround for Sleep. She lost to the Kiwi Winona-Jo Joyce at the OJC in four: 6-11, 8-11, 11-9, 4-11 (26m) but this time Sleep recorded an awesome 12-10, 11-3, 8-11, 11-7 victory in 28 minutes.

Zane Wolpers, BJ MacDonald and Nick Calvert finished runners up whilst Shona Coxsedge, Ella Burge, Katie Davies and Lachlan Coxsedge secured 3rd place finishes.

Getting to know our champions

Q SQUASH TALKS TO NICK CALVERT

You are a multiple Queensland and Australian Junior Champion. You have also represented Australia at the World Junior Championships. What has been the highlight of your junior career and why?

The highlight of my junior career is winning the Australian junior Championships in September last year. It was my first under 19's Australian title and it was an event I've always wanted to win since I started in under 11's.

Thinking back can you remember the hardest match you ever played?

The hardest match I've played is my recent match against Lwamba Chileshe in this year's Trans-Tasman Test Series. It was a brutal 83 minute 5 setter and I was extremely happy to win 11-8 in the 5th. The 4th game was by far the longest game with the score being 18-16, and he had multiple match balls against me.

Who has/have been your main rival(s) over the years?

Will Curtis has been a main rival for me during most of my junior career. I've played him in multiple national finals and semi-finals over the past few years. He's now living in the USA playing high school and college squash.

When does your junior years officially end?

24th of August this year is when I turn 19

You have just returned from an overseas trip to the US and Britain. What was the motivation behind the trip?

As I turn 19 later this year, this was my last chance to play the US and British Junior opens. My main goal was to gain experience playing against the best juniors in the world and to see which parts of my game I need to improve on.

Where did you go?

I spent the first month of my trip in Greenwich, Connecticut in the United States where I stayed with Rod Eyles and his family. I then went to New Haven for a week which is where the US Junior Open was played. I then returned to Greenwich for another week until it was time to leave for England for the final leg of my trip. I spent a week in Birmingham playing the British Junior Open until I finally came home midway through January.

What events did you play?

I played the US Junior Open and the British Junior Open.

From a tourist perspective what were the highlights in both countries?

In the USA I got to see most of the main sights in New York City. I saw the Brooklyn Bridge, Statue of Liberty, Times Square and Central Park which was my personal favourite. I also went to see the New York Jets and the LA Chargers in an NFL game, the atmosphere was amazing. Unfortunately, I did not do any sightseeing in England as I was mostly just playing the tournament.

Did you travel with anyone?


I didn't travel with anyone from Australia,

but I stayed with the Eyles family in the USA and I travelled to both tournaments with them.

You reached the last 16 at the US Junior Open Championships. Were you pleased with that result considering it was a 128 draw with 128 entries!?

I was very pleased with my results since I was seeded to lose 2nd Round (Last 64). I beat one of the top US juniors 3rd round which was a great win for me, then I lost 4th round to the number 1 seed from Mexico. I played well but he was a very strong player and went on to win the whole tournament.

What was it like playing in the US (Courts/Climate/Competition)?

Obviously the main difference between Australian and US climate is the temperature. Even though all the squash centres are heated, the ball bounces less. This means that good length dies in the back corner and short balls stay further up the court. Under these conditions it was really important to hit good length and take as many volleys as possible.

The British Junior Open is probably one of the toughest events in the World (besides the World Junior Championships). The main reason being the Egyptians are usually there in force! How tough was it?

The standard of squash was outstanding. The tournament attracts the worlds best players, so it is very rare to get an easy match, even in the first round! Even when I watched the under 11 age group I was amazed at the standard that some of

these kids were playing at.

What was it like playing in the BJO (Courts/Climate/Competition)?

The BJO climate was slightly warmer than USA, so the ball had a bit more bounce to it. The courts I played at were quite quick as well. Like I mentioned earlier, the competition was unbelievable. Every match I played was tough and every player didn't give away points easily.

You got to play the #1 seed and the eventual winner Marwan Tarek. What was that experience like?

It was a great experience to play Marwan, I'm almost certain he will do really well on the PSA world tour. I got to play him on the full glass court, which is by far the best glass court I've played on, which made it an even more enjoyable experience.

What did he do that was different?

He didn't do anything too different, he just did everything a lot better. All of his shots were accurate and his movement around the court was quick and smooth. Players like that are very hard to win points against.

Comparing styles of play what could the Aussies learn from the Egyptians?

The main difference between the styles of play is the short game. Many of the Egyptians take every opportunity to attack the ball and are so accurate at it. I think Australians (including myself) could adapt this attacking style into their game.

If you were given the chance to play him again ... what would you try to do differently?

I wouldn't change much about my game plan against him to be honest. My length was good and I kept it mainly straight to avoid opening up any angles for him. The main thing that let me down was my short game. He was far too quick and he got onto many of my drops very early.

You are a member of the PSA (Professional Body). You joined in July 2015 gaining an initial World ranking of 428. You have enjoyed a career high 316 and you are currently 350. What are your goals for 2018?

My main goal is to make the Australian Under 19's team to travel to India for the World Junior Championships. I'll also be playing the PSA events around Australia to try and increase my world ranking.

Longer term, do you have any aspirations to further your studies or play professionally or coach or all three?

I would like to play full time professionally but obviously I still have a lot of work to do to achieve this. I will continue to study alongside training for the next few years.

Finally, what advice would you give to any young junior starting out in squash and wanting to get to the top?

Hard work pays off. Set a goal and do everything you can to achieve it.

Nick, you have had many supporters over the years especially your family. Here is an opportunity to thank sponsors / people / organisations that have helped you.

Firstly, I'd like to thank my sponsor Karakal for their excellent support over the past six years. Also, a big thank you to the Eyles family for hosting me for six weeks in the USA. Finally, thank you to my parents Jim and Julie Calvert for supporting me with my squash, without them I wouldn't have been able to achieve any of this.

About Masters Squash and QMSA

As this is my first article in the Q Squash newsletter, I thought I would give a bit of a background to the Queensland Masters Squash Association.





QMSA is based around the 'Spirit of Masters' philosophy,

that is friendly competition on the court and friendly social interaction off the court.

After starting as Veterans or Mature Age Squash, QMSA was formed in 1979, affiliating with the other State and Territory Associations and the Australian Masters Squash Association (AMSA) to organise and formalise their tournament calendars.

We ensure that tournaments are run to a high standard and that social events are organised so that the 'Spirit of Masters' endures through all aspects of these tournaments.

Masters Squash has a minimum entry age of 35 years and championship events (such as the upcoming Queensland State Titles and Australian Titles) are held in 5-year age bands e.g. 35-39, 40-44 etc. We aim to cater for players of all standards, so don't be afraid to try Masters Squash just because you're not a champion!

QMSA holds a tournament approximately every 3 weeks and are run under various formats e.g. team events, timed events, and are graded on ability (rating) irrespective of age or gender. These tournaments are open to anybody over 35.

A get-together is organised for the Saturday evening, usually at a licensed club or hotel, where you can enjoy a meal, socialise, and maybe have a dance or two. You'll find the atmosphere at these tournaments very friendly, with most players spending

their spare time at the courts catching up with old friends and making new ones.

The next tournaments for this year will be held at Southport (24th and 25th February) and Stafford (10th and 11th March).

The QMSA State Titles attract players from all over Queensland and interstate! The Titles are held at a different centre each year and players must be financial members of QMSA or an affiliated body to enter.

About Masters Squash and QMSA

This year's State Titles are to be held at Acacia Ridge Squash Courts (Brisbane) on the May long weekend. (4th to 6th May). Competition will commence on Friday night, followed by two full days of matches, culminating with a BBQ presentation on the Sunday night. There will also be a Saturday night dinner dance, which is included in the entry fee.

We are expecting a guest speaker from the world of squash to join us on the night, and along with them will be a host of 'Queensland Masters Squash Royalty', including several former and current World Masters Champions. A highlight of the night will be the presentation of QMSA Life memberships to those who have helped QMSA become a leading force in Australian (and possibly the World) Masters Squash competition.

The Australian Titles will be held this year at the Bellerive Squash Centre in Hobart, Tasmania, during the first two weeks in September. The first week of competition is the Individual Championships, where some of Australia's best Masters players will be competing in age groups from Over 35s to Over 85s.

QMSA is usually the stand out association, with many of our members aiming to win Australian Titles again this year. The Second week is focused on the Interstate Teams Event, where teams of 3 QMSA players compete against other States in graded divisions, regardless of age or gender.



Besides the competition, there are many and varied social activities planned for the two weeks of the tournament, including the ever popular QMSA Pool night – (Eight Ball not Swimming!!), the themed party night, the Victorian seafood dinner night, and two gala dinner dances (held at the conclusion of each weeks' competition.

QMSA will be responsible for hosting the 2019 Australian Titles, and work has already begun on securing venues for both on-court and off-court activities.

The QMSA website has a wealth of information including a bi-monthly newsletter, tournament calendar, results and photographs. Once you are a member, you can log in and have access to all these great resources.



If any of this takes your interest feel free to visit our website, or catch up with one of our members at your local squash courts (I can almost guarantee someone at your centre will know about Masters Squash) to find out more about QMSA. That'll do for now, See you round the courts,
