
We are also very fortunate to be able to cheer for two of our own superstars: Rachael Grinham and Zac Alexander will be in doubles action.

#### **Australian Doubles Open**

**Alex Eustace** combined with newly crowned National Closed Champion and CG Rep Rex Hedrick to win the Australian Men's Doubles title.

They had to fight back from 1 game down in the final to beat Rhys Dowling and Tony James 3-11, 11-8, 11-4 in 28 minutes.

10 teams took part in the Men's Doubles, 5 in the Women's Doubles and 9 in the Mixed Doubles.

**Melissa Martin** combined with sister in law Amelia Martin (Pittock) but were unable to beat Christine Nunn and Selena Shaikh in the women's final going down narrowly 10-12, 8-11.

In the Mixed **Courtney Mather** teamed up with Rhys Dowling but were no match for Christine Nunn and Darren Chan in the final losing 5-11, 9-11. **Tom Calvert** and Alex Haydon finished 3rd.

#### **Australian National Championships**

Whilst Queenslanders didn't enjoy much success in the the ANC PSA Closed Satellite event **Nick Calvert** and **Ella Burge** won their respective Graded events.

The final of the Premier Grade was a battle between two juniors with #1 seed Nick Calvert beating #2 seed Jacob Ford (NSW) 11-7, 11-13, 11-4, 11-6 in 53 minutes.

Another two juniors played in the final of the A Grade Ladies event. Ella Burge won the title beating Victorian Eishaanii Sukunesan 8-11, 11-6, 11-8, 11-8.

# ROBYN PRENTICE

#### **Reflections: Robyn Prentice**

When asked to provide a profile of my life by the QMSA, my thoughts immediately took me back to where Squash started for me. Like many Aussies, many of my base skills started with tennis. Such a great sport too - social, competitive and challenging. But if it rains - well that's another story.

I was an avid tennis player in my youth and could often be seen cycling across Toowoomba in all weathers to play tennis fixtures. Some great ladies at Warraghi Tennis Club in Bridge Street Toowoomba would guide a few keen youngsters like myself and in return we had to roll and mark the courts before we played.

Within a few years of playing tennis, I had reached A grade and probably would have stuck with it – except in 1961, the Austral Motors social club in Toowoomba had a squash night at Russ Brown's squash courts.

My first memory of squash was running into the wall heavily and stunning myself with a nasty knock! I was so used to running over the sidelines in tennis that my spatial awareness was limited!

For all that, the first moment I tried to hold that smaller racquet and the even smaller black ball in my hand, I realised I had discovered a greater passion. Strangely enough, on the same night, I was approached by one of the local women players to play fixtures and, by the way, any chance you could become our Results Secretary?

For the next 27 years I played in the local competitions, both in the mens and womens competition, as well as travelling to Brisbane for many years to get stronger womens matches against the existing Queensland team members.

While achieving my personal squash goals and raising a family well was hugely important to me, my life as a volunteer for Toowoomba Squash began in 1962 and I was fortunate to be a part of keeping Squash alive in Toowoomba and South East Queensland in roles as Coach, Coach Educator, Publicity Officer, Secretary, Treasurer, and then Southern Region Coordinator from 1984-1988.

It saddens me greatly to see that Toowoomba Squash is under threat with the distinct possibility that there may be no courts operating in the very near future. It would be so beneficial if those in positions of authority could see the benefits to the community of continuing to offer squash in a multi purpose facility.

Toowoomba has produced so many sporting legends over the years, in many sports – it would be shameful for the citizens of Queensland's largest inland city to be without the choice to pursue our great game. What other sport offers the opportunity for families to play together in a sun safe and weather proof amenity to maintain their health and well being.

A life highlight for me was being one of a number of Toowoomba sportspeople who

were honoured in 1993 by the Toowoomba City Council for their achievements and contribution to their sport. A sporting oval in Toowoomba was named for all of those who were honoured.

Other proud Aussie moments include being named the Darling Downs Sports Star of the Year in 1985 and receiving an Australia Day Sports Award in the same year. Receiving the Australian Sports Medal in 2000 is another personal highlight.

Late in 1970, I took on a Management position with the Bell Street Centre in Toowoomba and started my coaching career as I was passionate to build Squash at all levels, especially Juniors.

My first Queensland Senior Team representation came in 1971 and it was a busy life with a young child, running a Squash Centre and training and coaching.

Toowoomba squash was booming in those early years with new Centres being built and the competition was very tough. Much training in Toowoomba and travelling to Brisbane tournaments assisted my game improvement and in 1965 I won my first Toowoomba championship and continued to hold the title for 18 of the next 23 years.

During a social visit to Brisbane by my Toowoomba Club, a passing comment from one of the Queensland Squash Committee members, Alan Booker, changed my direction and I set a goal to play in the Queensland team. Quite the task given the players I was competing against were already Australian and World Champions such as Heather Mackay, Jenny Irving, Marion Jackman.

In 1971, after the birth of my first son 15 months earlier, I was selected to wear the Queensland colours and went on to represent the team for 13 of the next 17 years. At the maturing age of 43, I played in my last Queensland team!

#### TIME FOR NEW GOALS!

In 1984 I ventured into my first Masters Squash tournament in Adelaide and absolutely loved the friendly atmosphere with players of all levels and ages coming together to enjoy squash, both socially and on the court. It was still a competitive environment but at a different level to what I was used to in Open Squash and I loved it.

When an opportunity to play for Australia in the Trans Tasman Series presented itself, I was elated. Whilst my career had been extensive in playing against many of Australia's great players, I did not have the opportunity to play for Australia in the early years.

For the next 4 years I played and was successful in Masters events at Local, State, National and International levels culminating with a World 40+ title in Auckland and representing Australia in the Trans Tasman Series from 1984-1988. So many friends made along the way are still a special part of my life.

When asked what was the match that stood out as most memorable I bring to mind the final of the World 45 Plus event in Sydney, when I returned from Canada to challenge Heather McKay. Heather has been and still is my squash idol and to see myself challenging her for a World Masters Title was quite the task! Heather was too good for me on the day but I was comforted that I challenged her in a competitive 4 set match.

In 1984 I was appointed to a Part Time position by Queensland Squash Association as Coaching Coordinator for Southern Region (SEQ including Gold & Sunshine Coast). I spent the next 4 years looking after the needs of 40 Clubs in that region.

I was privileged during this time to be a part of building the Region to its strongest in many years by running Coaching & Refereeing clinics and coach education sessions in outlying areas where little pods of juniors emerged to play a junior tournament circuit in the region.

Toowoomba then boasted a 40 strong junior program with accredited coaches working and travelling with the Toowoomba Junior Team. This Queensland Squash initiative was of huge benefit to the whole State but unfortunately when the government grant ran out, so did many of the initiatives.

In 1989 another big chapter of my life opened up with a move to Canada to take a position as Head Squash Coach at the Royal Glenora Club in Edmonton. Lester and I had taken separate ways and the opportunity to further my professional coaching career and to support my youngest son was a good option.

My life as a Squash Professional in a Canadian club was most rewarding and after setting many goals for their Squash program, I ended my tenure there in 1998 having achieved all I had set out to do.

Great memories of my 9 plus years in Canada:

- 1990 1997 Sport Outreach Coach Canada
- 1993 1995 Squash Canada National Teams Committee
- 1994 Head Squash Coach Canada Winter Games
- 1995 Squash Director World Firefighters Games Edmonton (great scenery that year)
- 1993 Squash Professionals Award Alberta
- 1998 Squash Alberta Presidents Award

With my passion for Masters Squash in Australia, I was keen to get this going in Canada and happy to say that I was a part of implementing the Western Canadian Masters Team Championships which still runs today.

In 1998, I returned to Australia quite burnt out from some very intense though rewarding years in Canada, and found myself on another roller coaster of learning new skills for earning an acceptable living outside of Squash Coaching.

In closing, suffice to say that I feel privileged that my life path has had much joy, many successes, disappointments and disillusionments, but I remain strong in knowing that the friendships I have made along the way will remain strong and special to me and the future remains open to whatever I choose to create for myself.

During my coaching life in both Canada and Australia, I have been privileged to coach and mentor many incredible young players and I have been rewarded with seeing these youngsters put in a lot of hard work and emerge from being barely able to hit a ball to the levels they have achieved. This gratification keeps my love of squash alive.

I look forward to spending many more years contributing to Junior Squash Development and Masters Squash in Australia.

So GET ACTIVE players! Support your clubs! Join the Queensland Masters Squash Association if you haven't already done so! Age is no barrier! There is always another challenge just around the corner. And, who knows, when you wear the green and gold for the first time, you'll be glad you did. There's no feeling quite like it.






