WA Squash will have a new President in mid April. Hence it is important that we recognise and thank Steve Bowen for his wonderful contribution to squash, WA Squash and Squash Australia over many years.

I asked Steve to document his Squash Journey with a focus on what he and his Board have achieved during the time he was

President of WA Squash. I also asked him to outline the challenges ahead for squash in general and WA Squash from his perspective.

My Squash Journey ... By Steve Bowen

I commenced playing squash at the Northam Club in 1977 and after being Club Captain for a year or so became President of the Club in 1980. Northam Club ran Country Week for the first time in 1981 at Curtin with the main committee members being Phil Joppek, my brother Nick and myself. (CW had previously been based at Carine Glades, Balga and North Beach.)

Squash was booming and most country towns sent numerous teams to CW. Over the next 10 years CW peaked at about 700 players and the men's grading had almost used up the alphabet - we were down to division X so had some 24 grades of 5 teams with 4 members per team!

Following on from this The Country Council was formed with Phil Joppek as Chairperson. I was Central Zone Chair and Council Rep and Treasurer for some 10 years.

NB: CW protocol stipulated that the President of the Club hosting CW be appointed as a board member of WA Squash for that year. So this was my first experience with the WA Squash Board. I was facilitator for CW again in 1987 and 2003.

Board member again

In late 1998 I was appointed to the WA Squash Board again and due to the difficulty in filling the position of Treasurer I became Acting Treasurer for most of the next 15 years. It was, I think, 2002 when I first became President and continued in this role for over 10 years.

I became a Board member of Squash Australia in about 2010 and President in 2013 for one year. The Squash Australia Constitution was changed to prohibit joint State and National directorships so I was compelled to resign from the WA Squash Board in 2011. I was invited back to the WA Squash Board to fill a casual vacancy in late 2015 and was elected president.

A few of the milestones the WA Squash Board achieved under my leadership.

Facilities:

Terrace Centre: The takeover of the Terrace Centre lease was a major issue



and opposed by some members. Andrew Stanbury, the General Manager at the time became aware that the courts had been vacant for many years and it was his negotiating, hard work and passion and with strong support from the Board that saw WA Squash take them over some 13 years ago.

While the income expected from the Terrace did not meet expectations we decided to restructure the staffing and since then we have earned substantial additional funds each year.

Don Huffer previously appointed as Court Manager took over the GM role while continuing to manage the courts. Don's hard work, long hours, love of squash and support for me as President over many years has been sincerely appreciated by me and of tremendous value to squash in WA.

Victoria Park, Manning and Como Club: Working with this group to establish the club at Victoria Park and seeing it prosper has been very satisfying. The Victoria Park centre (3 courts formerly 4) was hardly in use.

The former Manning Club was located at Curtin for a short time but these courts were to be demolished. In conjunction with the club the Board approved a loan to help resurrect the courts and bring back the 4th court.

Subi Kings: With the establishment of Next Generation at Kings Park the Kings Park Club decided to seek an alternative venue. Carsten Frederiksen, a WA Squash Board member, was instrumental in refurbishing the non utilised 4 courts at Subiaco Oval and with his committee relocated the club to there.

Marmion: The Marmion Centre was demolished but the club was extremely strong and united. After several years of moving from Scarborough courts and Stirling courts some members pooled their financial resources to construct the Squash Factory. This centre has the only doubles courts in WA. At the time three members of the syndicate were on the WA Squash Board.

Previously, I was heavily involved in the Northam Club's establishment of 4 courts on freehold land in a joint development with the Golf Club and Tennis Club.

Also during this period Glynn Bunting (previous WA Squash Board member) constructed numerous courts throughout inland WA at predominantly Mining Company sites.

Geraldton: The Geraldton Club managed to finance and construct two additional courts some 10 years ago. The WA board did financially assist the Geraldton club in furnishing these new courts.

Referees:

Going back some 8 years or so we had three Referees in WA and one of those retired soon after. Two potential Referees had been waiting for up to 10



years to arrange a mutually acceptable time to be assessed by the WA Head Assessor. We had a record of 2 Referees accredited in 23 years or was it three in 22 years?

The WA Squash Board saw that it was a weak link that we could do something about. With a reasonably urgent need for Referees and succession planning for Referees the Board arranged for and paid

for Chris Sinclair (World Squash Federation Referee) and John Small (Squash Australia Director of Referees) to come to WA for the WA Open and run theory courses and accredit referees.

Within a few years, despite opposition, some 8 state referees were accredited and about the same number of club referees. John Small took the WA system to the Eastern States endeavouring to get them to each arrange Referee training courses at their State Open's.

Inflatable Courts:

At the 2017 Squash Australia AGM the Commonwealth Games Squash facilitator outlined how valuable the inflatable courts were when travelling around Queensland promoting squash for the Commonwealth Games.

Some 10 years ago I copied this idea from UK Squash (Peter Nicol) and brought it to our WA Board. Support was strong and unified and a great example of what can be achieved. Wayne Cowell designed the courts and had them manufactured in China.

Our funds were currently tied up in term deposits so Ed Jennings offered to fund them in the interim, Glynn Bunting continued to push everyone to make sure it happened, Ray Smith manufactured the trailer and Mike Cornish and Tim Cowell carted them all over the State promoting squash.

I think each of these people can be extremely proud of what they achieved and how the inflatables are still being used and valued around WA and Australia.

Country Development:

Due in a large part to the additional funds available through cost cutting at the Terrace (mainly due to Don's dual role) it was decided to spend significant funds on country development.

With Mike Cornish and additional funding from the DSR more money and more time was spent in country areas than ever before. Mike, and later with Tim Cowell, travelled to virtually every club in WA on a regular basis, helped develop clubs and coaches and is the envy of every other State/Territory.

Staffing:

Over time we changed the staffing structure to include more part timers. Leonie Cole and then Linda McBrierty and then Leonie Cole again have performed exceptionally well as finance officers working one day per week.



Sue Hillier as part time development officer, Junior coach, Hall of Fame organiser, and the go to person with any problem (if you want to get things definitely done) was always of immense value. I was part of the selection team that recruited Andrew Stanbury and Don Huffer. Andrew was instrumental in the takeover of the Terrace and Don has been there done everything for 12 years plus. His support and loyalty to me, the Board and squash in WA has been

extraordinary.

Hall of Fame and Hall of Fame Dinner:

5 years ago we began the bi annual Hall of Fame Dinner and have inducted 9 ex players into our Hall of Fame. This is something I'm very proud to have been involved in.

Newsletter:

Some 2 years ago we commenced the Swan Newsletter. This is still going strong and we have for the first time in many years a method of promoting what is happening and informing interested members.

High Performance:

WA Juniors over recent years have been running second to Queensland in the Australian Junior Championships. Large numbers of our juniors are regularly selected in Australia representative teams .This is due to a well organised coaching team led by Mike Cornish and supported by the Board.

It has been my pleasure to work with a great number of hard working squashies who love the sport and support me and help push squash forward. Squash is finding it hard at the moment but we can still focus on the things that we can change. I would like to thank the Board members, many who have served for 10 years or more, who have supported me and worked with me over 12 years and have contributed greatly and made my job so much easier.

Regrets:

I have for many years and will continue to promote the strategy that the future of squash in Australia is dependent on a united effort from court operators, Squash Australia, State bodies, clubs and volunteers to **get every active player registered** even at a minimal amount to attract more sponsors and government funding. I would like to see the additional revenue raised used to promote squash at grass root levels through clubs and centres. Unfortunately, for whatever reason the support for this approach is limited.

In conclusion:

I'm well satisfied that as a result of the contribution made by the people around me and those who have worked with me that Country Week still thrives and is far healthier than any other State, Court numbers have been maintained and even increased marginally in recent years, Country funding and development has increased, Country junior representation at State level has increased and our young players play at a far stronger level in Australian squash than they have for a great many years.



Furthermore, Referee numbers have been increased most significantly, WA has been maintained in a financially secure and stable situation, that the relatively small number of board numbers during my time have worked in a happy unified manner with the objectives of maintaining and where possible improving the standards and operations of squash in WA.

I very much value the friendships made and ongoing support from board members, Clubs and players.

76 Players competed in the 32th SW Squash Masters this year held at the South West Sports Centre in Bunbury (due to the uncertainty of the Busselton Courts) over the long weekend in March in 5 Divisions with ages from mid 30s to late 70s.

The Busselton Club ran the tournament while the Bunbury Club ran the bar. This is the biggest Masters Squash event outside of Perth and one of the longest running. Busselton was able to have representatives in all 5 divisions.



The coveted Division 1 shield was taken out by the Bunbury team of Jamie Herring, Brad Grinter and Dean Reynolds defeating last year's winners Paul Hey, Sean Brockman and Rachel Hey. Bunbury has now won the Div 1 title in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The standard of squash was exceptional in the final with a combination of patient long rallies and incredible shot making and retrieving. All 3 Bunbury players went thru

the weekend undefeated and Dean did not even lose a game.



Bunbury No 3 team of Mark Lush, Diego Hermandez and Mike Genders successfully won Division 2 shield, their third successive title in Div 2, pipping the strong Blue Gum team of Wes Emery, Greg Mills and Ray Bell . Interesting the only team to defeat the Bunbury team was last placed Busselton Team of Graham Bell, Phil Cox and Warren Oliver.

The Division 3 final saw the Bunbury No 4 team of Kelvin Carmichael, Kalev Kutt and Lorraine Grassie defeat



the previously undefeated team Mullaloo Crazy Crabs of Greg Harwood, Bill Jackson, and Louise Donnan convincing 7/2. The Bunbury team had lost to the same team in the qualifying matches 4/5. Lorraine went thru the weekend undefeated.



In Division 4 the team PSN's of **Pat Barker, Sharon Franklin** and **Nikki McCullough** took out the title but there was a 3 way count back to decide the runner up team which went to the SW girls team made up of Busselton and Bunbury players Chris Champ, Kate Martin and Louise Wright. The count back went back to points won, with wins and team points even. Pat Barker went thru the weekend undefeated.

These players were given a Busselton squash club wine goblet as a memento. Over the past 32 years 532 players have played at least once in the tournament.

Friday Night Masters has been going for a few weeks. There have been a few changes this year with the organisation and draws being done by the Squash Centre and coordinated by Kane.




