CLUBS & CENTRES

Player numbers are still at critical lows. Clubs rely upon participation for their viability and, in turn, centres rely upon viable clubs.

I have completed an informal census of squash centres and players in our region. Thank you to all those who provided information, which can be summarised:

vast majority have been renovated to reduce the number of courts resulting in squash being a minor use in the centres.

Associated Clubs

Only the major centres in Cairns, Townsville, Mackay and Ingham have associated clubs. Otherwise events are simply organised by passionate older players.

Competitions

Included weekly fixtures, ad hoc tournaments, international, club and junior championships (in the major centres), and social competitions.

Facilities

22 centres operate in the region. The A range varies from 1 to 8 courts, gym, group fitness, function/meeting rooms, pool, allied health tenancies, bowling, skating, shop & café. Few affiliated.

Coaching

Apart form the major centres, only a few centres offered coaching for seniors and juniors. Often provided by coaches with low or no formal qualification.

Players

Approximately 1400 comprising - 687 regular players in organized competitions; Regular social 590 members; and 148 Juniors.

Too many Clubs and Centres are disengaged from Q Squash which has lead to the dismantling of Clubs, and unaffiliated players, centres and clubs. Q Squash records show that less than 350 players are affiliated; therefore, those unaffiliated players do not enjoy any insurance cover under Q Squash.

Centres and Clubs (if any) need more support: with marketing & promotion; competition & tournaments, and Junior development & participation. Junior participation is at critical lows with little or no engagement between schools sports programs and centres, or other regular coaching or competitions.

It is painfully obviously, that we must all play our individual parts to re-energise clubs, players and centres to increase and maintain participation, develop juniors, and reconcile clubs and centres.

RANKINGS

The chair, Alec MacDonald, will now take up his role as a Q Squash Selector. Thank you to Lucas Nielsen for his conscientious effort in his term as state selector; made even more difficult by the nature of the role balanced with study and work commitments.

FUNDRAISING AND GRANTS

I've just received some very exciting news from Jules Condon, Chair of our fundraising and grants sub-committee - Our grant application to the Gambling Community Benefit Fund was partly successful. We will receive a whopping \$15,000 to buy four







defibrillators for four affiliated Squash clubs/centres.

Any interested clubs/centres should send an expression of interest so that these lifesaving devices can be meritoriously allocated based on membership demographic and need.

Our application also sought \$6500 for IT live streaming equipment but it was not approved this round.

Jules has also applied to the Holden Home Ground Advantage for \$10,000 towards Redbacks uniforms and accomodation at QJC. This is very timely in the wake of my inability to secure Dominos for the proposed premium sponsorship. But not all is lost.

My talks with the major pizza brand Dominos franchisees (especially Townsville and Mackay) has also successfully resulted in an ongoing commitment to partner with Northern Region to host a Free Gala Pizza Dinner at our regional tournaments.



Townsville Junior Qualifier

84 entries were received for the 2018 Townsville Junior Open making the 3rd Redbacks qualifier the most successful in terms of participation numbers

The Compulsory qualifier in Cairns attracted 70 entries whilst the first 2018 Qualifier held at Ingham last October received 71.



Wes Dyer completed the double double! He won the U17 and U19 title in Cairns and repeated that effort in Townsville.

Kurstyn Mather probably caused the biggest upset of the tournament beating Hayley Hankinson in four to set up a final against her sister Courtney in the U19 final. Kurstyn won 9-11, 11-6, 11-8, 11-3.

BJ MacDonald won the U15 title but couldn't get past Brody DiBella in the U19 semi losing 11-3, 11-9, 14-16, 6-11, 11-13.

Josh Porter U13B, Michael Lawrence U11B and Kayce Hoani Vincent continue on their merry ways dominating their respective age groups.



Queen's Baton Relay

The **Queen's Baton Relay** began its journey on 13 March 2017 at Buckingham Palace. The plan was for the Baton to travel for 388 days through all nations and territories of the Commonwealth.

The Baton will arrive on the Gold Coast for the XXI Commonwealth Games Opening Ceremony on 4 April 2018, where a representative for Her Majesty, will remove the message from the Baton and read it aloud to officially open the Games.

In Australia alone some 3,500 runners will be involved in relaying the Baton to the Gold Coast. The QBR is a Games tradition that celebrates the Commonwealth's diversity, inspires community pride and excites people about the world-class festival of sports and culture to come.



Lisa Camilleri and **Steve Finitsis** have been fortunate honoured to represent their communities and participate in the Relay.

I have personally known both athletes since their teens and they have always been first class ambassadors for their home communities, NR, Queensland and Australia.

Both Camilleri and Finitsis represented Australia at the 2014 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow.

"It was an amazing experience. Nothing better then coming back to grass roots where my squash journey began to represent the Tully Community " said Camilleri.

Finitsis on the other hand ran in Cairns but felt he also represented his home community of Innisfail. Ironically, Finitsis (Runner # 96) handed the Baton over to his cousin Peter (Runner # 97).

"It was a special moment being handed the Queen's Baton by my cousin Steven Finitsis. It's a day I won't forget, spending time with so many dedicated people who contribute so much to their community. Thank you to the Organisers and the Police for making this such a special day. I consider it a special privilege and honour, that I was allowed to be part of this historic day - with Steve Finitsis" said Peter.



2018 REDSTAR AWARDS



In an effort to recognise more NR juniors we have revised our system of performance recognition. From now on every placegetter (1-2-3) will be recognised. Each winner of an aged event will be listed in the Achievement category and every player who finishes second or third will be listed in the Encouragement category.

Once a player has won an event they will be elevated and listed in the Achievement category even if they finish runner up or third in other events. If players are equal they will be listed in alphabetical order.

Players receive 3 points for winning a qualifier, 6 points for winning a Queensland State title and 9 points for winning a National title (AJO & AJC). Players will receive 2 points for finishing runner up in a qualifier, 4 points for runner up in a State final and 6 points for runner up in a National final. Players will receive 1 point for finishing third in a qualifier, 2 points for third in a State final and 3 points for third in a National event. U19 Players will also receive 1 bonus point for each result because they cannot enter 2 events.

Even though the Ingham qualifier was played in October 2017 it is still a 2018 qualifier so the results from that event will contribute to the **2018 NR Player of the Year Award.** A 2019 qualifier played in 2018 will not be included.

The player who accumulates the most points will be declared the Player of the Year. There will be joint winners if 2 players finish on the same number of points. The aim of the points system is to automate the selection and player results determine the outcome. The system is also designed to encourage players to support all events in their quest to accumulate points.

If an event is combined eg U17 and U19 Combined then it will be analysed to ensure points are allocated to both U17 and U19. A direct match up of the best two players in an age group will determine the winner of that age group. Otherwise the highest finishing position in an age group will receive the maximum points. **To be awarded points there must be at least two players competing in an age group.**

A player can only enter up to 2 events so they can only be rewarded with 2 results. An U9 player who might win a combined event eg **U9**, **U11 and U13 Combined** can only be rewarded for the U13 victory and their own age group U9 providing there are two U9 players competing. If there is only one player in U9 they will earn points for U13 only. If there was one player in U9 and one in U11 they will still only be rewarded for their efforts in U13.
