Zac may not have achieved World #1 as a junior or as a senior but he achieved a GOLD medal at the Commonwealth Games!

For the record: **Joseph Kneipp** remains the only NR player to achieve GOLD at the CG. He won Mixed Doubles gold with fellow Queenslander Natalie Grinham at

the 2006 CG in Melbourne.

REDBACKS

A reminder that the selectors will be at the A&L Smash Repairs Mackay Junior Squash Tournament as they consider Redbacks teams representatives.

Thanks to those wonderful people who have offered wiliness to serve as manager, coach and operational support for our Redbacks at QJC. As the saying goes - 'many hands make light work', but we were restricted by minimum qualifications for coaches.

The Redbacks management will be led by me, with Marc Forster as head coach and Jules Condon as manager of operations. Logistics and roles of coaches and support will be finalised over the coming weeks.

In keeping with the spirit of competition and boasting our strongest players within their age group, selectors will fill Redbacks positions as follows:

- 1. The first four players within their age group will be offered selection for that age group;
- 2. If there are insufficient numbers in a higher age group, then the vacancy will be offered to the fifth highest ranked player from the lower age group;
- 3. If the offer is not accepted, then the vacancy will be offered to the next ranked player and so on in that age group; and
- 4. Any vacancy in a lower age group will be filled by the next ranked player in that age group, and so on.

As usual, all players, parents and volunteer support crew will be required to abide by codes of conduct and team rules. Please be familiar with those to avoid undue embarrassment.

RECOGNITION AWARDS

Remember to cast your nominations for the annual junior 'best & fairest' players. The Mackay Northern Region Championships will be the last opportunity to nominate.

An Alec MacDonald Expose

Biography of James Zac Toohey - Passionate Squash Coach Birthdate: 04/03/1960 Place of Birth: Orange the "Apple City" of NSW. We have forgiven him for this!

In 1984 James obtained a temporary visa for entry and residence to Gods Country - the 2nd Biggest Country in the Continent of Australia - Queensland (almost a full blooded Queenslander – we will wait to see who he supports at State Of Origin time!).

James spent 4 years out of the game due to tumours but on his comeback made the top 16 in Queensland in 9 months, training with Tristan Nancarrow on the Gold Coast. Nancarrow himself reached World#5. He then had to sit out for another 3.5 years when the tumours returned.

After his recovery was complete he started training with David Murray (#1 in Tasmania) and relaunched his game in Britain, where he played in the British Teams Championships for Corriham Racquets Country Club. His team won and James never dropped a match.

James then moved to the USA, where he played in the first 16 Professional Tournaments ever played in the USA and achieved a career high World#97 ranking. James played in the US Open the following year and was Head Referee (still seems to be a nice guy and reasonable?) He was eliminated by the World#39 (Robert Graham) in a tight 4 setter.

While in the USA James played an exhibition match against Jahangir Khan, and went as well as most players did against the formidable Pakistani - losing in 3. James said he was in massive oxygen debt, but did not need a defibrillator or an ambulance, but took 2 weeks to recover!

James then turned his hand to coaching the sport he loved. While in the US he coached at 3 clubs: Centre Courts LA, Sports Club LA and Sports Club Irvine. Sports Club LA and Sports Club Irvine each had over 10,000 members whilst Centre Courts LA had only 280 members.

At Centre Courts LA James started with 39 squash players, 1 designated squash court and 10 designated racquet ball courts. Within 2 years there were 10 designated squash courts and 1 designated racquet ball court and over 270 squash addicts – the power of passion?

During his time coaching in the USA James coached a number of players to National Championships.

James then returned to Australia and was just playing socially. This was when he moved to Yeppoon to help out a mate with his business. It was either fate or his reward for being such a big hearted and giving bloke that while in Yeppoon, he met Waling who became his "Great Woman that stands behind a Good Man!" Waling was a teacher and talented painter (not houses but Art Painting like Picaso).



They moved over to Western Australia and that's where the next squash chapter of James' life would begin.

Waling found a Gym Instructor who wanted to make the Top 10 in Western Australia in the next 12 months.

Waling told David Clegg that her partner was looking for someone to train with.

James ended up coaching David for 6 months over a 2 year period. This resulted in David rising to #8 in Australia and #176 in the world. David is currently coaching in Russia.

James then took a sabbatical in Sydney (people only survive in Sydney not live) then moved back to Gods Country to live and settled in Mackay North Queensland. He then met Ben Courtice and some of Mackay's juniors.

James and Waling were embraced and adopted by the 52 Family (we will not let him leave) and is now working with the Family (Bigger than the Mafia) to rebuild junior and seniors programs in partnership with Ben Courtice.

This involves the setting up of a Squash Academy with Sally Courtice (a highly qualified Dietician), Ben Courtice (Diploma of Personal Fitness and Squash Coach) looking after strength & conditioning and squash technique, Elizabeth Eales (Yoga/Muscle Co-ordination and Flexibility Instructor) and James.



The Academy will cover all bases required to give each member everything they need to become the best squash player and person they can be.

James has recently returned from running a number of training camps with Tristan



Nancarrow at Palm Beach. Tristan was a bit sceptical at first but after the 1st day was so impressed with what James teaches he has adopted the program himself.

Tristan is also happy to be associated with the Squash 52 Academy.

The 52 Academy of Sporting Excellence is fully supported by the Grandmother, Father and Mother of Squash known collectively as the Courtice Family.

James thinks he is the luckiest guy in the world to discover a group of juniors with so much talent and potential - he is VERY EXCITED!

He also recognises and appreciates the work both Bob Courtice and Kay Barclay did toward developing the juniors of Mackay.

James's partner Waling says James' best attribute besides his big heart is his holistic approach to coaching. He almost becomes not only a squash coach but also a life coach.

Ben and James are looking forward to the future working together to restore the game of squash in Mackay to the status of the Premier Indoor Sport in Mackay, and developing the players to be the Best Players and People that they can be.

2018 REDSTAR AWARDS



In an effort to recognise more NR juniors we have revised our system of performance recognition. From now on every placegetter (1-2-3) will be recognised. Each winner of an aged event will be listed in the Achievement category and every player who finishes second or third will be listed in the Encouragement category.



Once a player has won an event they will be elevated and listed in the Achievement category even if they finish runner up or third in other events. If players are equal they will be listed in alphabetical order.

Players receive 3 points for winning a qualifier, 6 points for winning a Queensland State title and 9 points for winning a National title (AJO & AJC). Players will receive 2 points for finishing runner up in a qualifier, 4 points for runner up in a State final and 6 points for runner up in a National final. Players will receive 1 point for finishing third in a qualifier, 2 points for third in a State final and 3 points for third in a National event. U19 Players will also receive 1 bonus point for each result because they cannot enter 2 events.

Even though the Ingham gualifier was played in October 2017 it is still a 2018 gualifier so the results from that event will contribute to the 2018 NR Player of the Year Award. A 2019 gualifier played in 2018 will not be included.

The player who accumulates the most points will be declared the Player of the Year. There will be joint winners if 2 players finish on the same number of points. The aim of the points system is to automate the selection and player results determine the outcome. The system is also designed to encourage players to support all events in their quest to accumulate points.

If an event is combined eg U17 and U19 Combined then it will be analysed to ensure points are allocated to both U17 and U19. A direct match up of the best two players in an age group will determine the winner of that age group. Otherwise the highest finishing position in an age group will receive the maximum points. To be awarded points there must be at least two players competing in an age group.

A player can only enter up to 2 events so they can only be rewarded with 2 results. An U9 player who might win a combined event eg U9, U11 and U13 Combined can only be rewarded for the U13 victory and their own age group U9 providing there are two U9 players competing. If there is only one player in U9 they will earn points for U13 only. If there was one player in U9 and one in U11 they will still only be rewarded for their efforts in U13.




