



30 years of Country Week history from 1966 to 1996 - By Steve Bowen

Prior to 1966 there were significant numbers of squash courts spread throughout country WA but no structured arrangements existed for any relationship with the Squash Rackets Association of WA or for competition between towns.

The first Country Teams Tournament (on the inspiration of Aub Hickey of Bunbury) was held at the South Perth Squash Centre on the March long weekend of 1966 with a rather shaky start with a ladies and men's team from Bunbury and Albany playing off for what was to become the inaugural Country Teams title.

Other invited towns of Kalgoorlie and Geraldton while not sending teams did provide representatives to meet with Bunbury and Albany to develop the concept of the Country Teams Championships for future years.

Results: Ladies: Albany (Norma Lange, Roselie Hickling, Jenny Offer, Kath Marshall) defeated Bunbury (Myra Earshaw, Sue Smith, Sue Campbell, Vicki Lucy). Men: Bunbury (Aub Hickey, Terry Alder, Barry Depiazzi, John Stanley) defeated Albany (Fernando Crugdale, Alan Wells, Geoff Cooke, Laurie Blurton) Aub Hickey donated the first perpetual shields for A grade.

After steady growth during 1967 and 1968 the representatives decided that future development and growth needed to follow a more manageable and structured plan. The management was passed to the Tournament Committee of the SRA of WA.

The 1969 championships were a disaster and the 1970 championship did not occur. So the country clubs took back management and in 1971 the championships were conducted at the Katanning Squash Centre under the guidance of Aub Hickey and the Bunbury Club.

Sixteen teams competed from Kalgoorlie, Esperance, Geraldton, Katanning and Bunbury. The Country week SRA was formed with delegates Aub Hickey and Peter Earnshaw of Bunbury, Stan Foster of Kalgoorlie, David Phillips of Esperance, Peter Manlein of Geraldton and Geoff Ogden of Katanning.

1972 saw the Tournament return to Perth to be held at the Maylands Squash Centre which remained the home until 1975 when the 10 court Carine Glades Squash Centre (managed by Ian Marshall) became the Championship Headquarters.

The five team grade system was introduced with teams generally playing two matches on Saturday, two matches on Sunday and a final on Monday.

The boom in construction of squash courts throughout country areas saw ongoing number growth with 75 teams in 1976 and then 96 teams in 1977.

In 1976, in endeavouring to see further development of country squash, a country council was formed with the chairperson to be appointed as a director of the SRA of WA and represent the interests of country squash.

Rules and procedures for the management of the Championship had been developed and clubs were working much more closely with each other and Carine's Ian Marshall to improve the structure and growth of the event. One of the new rules instituted in 1977 was a team entry limitation of 101 teams.

Support for the country Council although strong initially declined rapidly and this organisation soon became virtually inoperative.

1978 proved to be a testing time for the tournament. With large numbers of active players in Country areas and towns the SRA of WA determined that these players and their clubs should be registered with the SRA of WA and pay a fee as decided by the SRA of WA which would make them eligible to compete at Country Week.

This was a new concept for many clubs and players and several Clubs considered non affiliation. Combined with nominations of 120 teams requiring some withdrawals due to the imposed limit of 101 teams this was a year of ongoing turmoil.

The Warwick Hall was the venue for the first organised combined social event and the buffet meal and drinks were well supported. Provision of meals was discontinued in 1980 due to ongoing catering difficulties for unknown numbers of attendees, although free drinks, venue and music continued.

Point of interest: The Goldfields Squash Club, in 1956 (the year of their formation), was the first country club affiliated with the SRA of WA. The Affiliation fee was one shilling each for male members. Presumably at that time they only had male members. The first Goldfields Championship was held on 2nd and 3rd of June 1956. This is the same date for 2018. I'm unsure if this has been continuous since 1956.

Ken Legge President of SRA of WA in 1979 encouraged Ross Prout of Geraldton to become County Week chairperson and Country Council Chairperson. He was followed in 1980 by Leon Jamieson of Albany.

In 1979 limitations on numbers were withdrawn and other centres (Balga and North Beach) were used due to considerable increases in team registrations with team numbers reaching over 130 in 1980.


Note: Mundaring on application to the SRA of WA was accepted as a country member and was therefore eligible to enter country week. On appeal to the organising club (Albany) this ruling was reversed.

Country squash organisation (including selection of the Country Week managing club for the next year) during the years 1978-1980 was determined at a meeting of club delegates on the Friday evening prior to Country Teams Championship at the SRA of WA offices at Perry Lakes Stadium.

The new WAIT (now Curtin University) 13 court centre was opened in 1981 and Country week with 146 teams was able to utilise the free court hire negotiated by the SRA as part of the construction/ownership deal. The gallery of the main court allowed some 400 players and spectators to view matches and the presentation of trophies.

Country clubs registered considerable numbers if not all of their players and the relationship between country and the SRA had improved significantly. Other squash centres utilised were Canning Bridge, Karawara, Manning and Kensington. The social function which now took the form of a disco at the Karawara Hall attracted huge support. Team shields were introduced to take the place of individual trophies.

Following on from this tournament (1981) the Country Council was totally restructured with 6 zones with Chairperson Phil Joppek (Northam), Central Zone (Steve Bowen), Albany Zone (Max Loveridge), Bunbury Zone, (Laurie Blurton), Geraldton Zone (Geoff



Jamieson), Kalgoorlie Zone (Lesley Lalich) and North West Zone (Ronnie Adams).

From then on Country squash management became much more organised and country week management was rotated from zone to zone in a six year rotation. Country Council meetings were held during the year and on the Friday night prior to Country week.

Phil Joppek remained Chairperson of the Country Council until 1987. Followed by Dave Smallwood of EGSRA (1988/9), Bernice McSwain EGSRA (1990/1) and Geoff Jamieson of Geraldton (1992/6).

The country Teams Singles Championships was introduced during 1981 and continued in one form or another until 1989 when it was cancelled due to considerable difficulties and declining numbers.

Point of interest: One serve rule introduced in 1988.

In 1993 the first Australian Country Squash Championships were held in Adelaide. The WA team of Jodie Buchan, Candy Roberts, Julie Down, and Marg Prout won the ladies event. The WA team of Lee Sorfleet, Geoff Jamieson, Danny Bowen and Ron Hayward lost the final by one point.

Each year prior to this and since a Combined Country Team of four men and four Ladies has been selected. This attendance in Adelaide was brought about by the hard work of Geoff Jamieson. Unfortunately, due to cost and lack of interest from other States after a few years this failed to continue.

As more country clubs participated and regular clubs fielded more teams the growth continued with 188 teams in 1986 and the high point reached in 1987 of 807 players from 190 teams competing in men's A - V grades and Ladies A - O grades. A new record of 34 clubs entered the championships in 1988 although overall numbers declined slightly.

The above is due in no small way to Nick Bowen who has provided the Country Week magazines from 1977 to 2004 (missing 1979 and assisted with many of the comments). If anyone has a copy of the 1979 magazine it would be much appreciated.

Our current objective is to use the SWAN newsletter to develop a history of Country Week and related country management issues.

After this summary it is hoped that each SWAN from now on can include comments, points of interest and results year by year from these magazines i.e. from 1977 onwards.

WA MASTERS NOTABLE MASTERS

CHAS RENNER – NONAGENARIAN

On July 30 2018 the WA Masters Squash community will have in its active player ranks a nonagenarian. But this is really no surprise to us considering who it is; we just would not expect anything less from this great inspiration and role model to many, but it's just so hard to believe – Chas Renner turning 90!



Chas has had a life-long involvement in sport, achieving much success along the way. He lived in East Fremantle close to the river as a youngster and consequently has been a successful competitive swimmer all his life. He continues to be involved in the sport at many levels, including competing and coaching up and coming champions. Chas has recently competed in the Australian Championships held here in Perth and came away with a swag of medals, amongst them a Gold Medal. Chas was also an excellent cyclist, and consistently competed in long distance and other cycling races. Chas' father owned a bike shop, so no doubt this sparked the initial interest in cycling, but Chas' love of sport and competing and his drive to always do his best has led to his successes, both in swimming and cycling, and later, in squash.

After meeting his partner Joyce Barnett in 1987 ('changed his life' according to Joyce), Chas became involved in squash. Prior to meeting Joyce, Chas was always known to his old friends as Charlie, but 'Chas' was Joyce's preference so Chas it was from then on. Through Joyce's long-time involvement in squash, from coaching juniors to playing and her committee work with WA Masters, Chas also became just as involved. Chas and Joyce have both been awarded WA Squash Life Membership for their tireless contribution to squash in the state, spanning around eighty-odd years between them.

In line with his constant desire to help and develop young people in their chosen sport Chas went on to become the Chair of the Junior Squash Committee, and remained in the role for many years, helping numerous enthusiastic youngsters on to successful squash careers. Although Chas was based at Hilton squash courts, this didn't prevent his influence extending throughout the State, and there are many top juniors, and now senior players, who can thank Chas for his continuous support and care over the years. This includes top ranked player in WA, David Illich, who also ran the Hilton Juniors for several years and still plays there. Chas was also the manager of the State Junior team that travelled each year to the Australian Junior Championships. While in this role he encouraged parents to become actively involved in the development of junior squash, for example by becoming members of the Junior Committee. Consequently, Chas is not only responsible for the development of a large number of junior players, but also for recruiting and encouraging administrators working for junior and senior squash.

Roger Campbell relates an amusing but typical 'Chas' anecdote. Chas used to drive the Juniors' bus, ferrying the players to various competition venues. On one occasion the bus, travelling along the Kwinana Freeway just before the Narrows Bridge, got a flat tyre. Chas called the RAC, but when they didn't turn up within five minutes (three

minutes too long), decided to change the tyre himself. He was only about 70 at that time so no problem at all! Relating the story to his son who was one of Chas' past juniors, Roger's son commented 'Yeah! That's Chas – a bloody legend'.

In 2007 Roger asked Chas to assist in running the tournament desk for the Perth based Australian Masters Championships. Until that year Chas had never won an Australian Age Group squash title, and his



win in 2007 was to become the first of many. Roger credits the win to his keeping Chas so busy with administration chores that he didn't have time to think about his matches. Roger cheekily accused him of being a bit of a 'slow learner' as it had taken him so long to learn how to win. However, Chas' administrative assistance at the Championships was invaluable – so it was really a win/win situation. Chas also assisted at the 2015 Perth Championships, and we look forward to his continued future involvement.

Roger, through his squash administration roles, has been involved with many of the top WA players over the years, and he says that so many of them credit Chas and Joyce with their early development and ongoing commitment to the sport. Chas has also been responsible for getting others involved in the development of squash, and continues to provide support at the Friday night Masters.

On a more personal level, Chas has been undeniably active and healthy all his life. An electrician by profession (something that has been put to good use by family and friends over the years according to Joyce), Chas is able to put his mind to anything. For example, his time as a driving instructor came in very handy for all the family kids



learning to drive and each getting their licence. Chas has a loving family, and has two grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

The fact that he loves nothing better than pottering around in his garden growing his veggies, then giving them away to all and sundry, epitomises Chas, the man: hardworking, positive, generous and giving, striving to always do his best and better and assisting all around him to achieve the same. **Chas is a true, living legend!**




