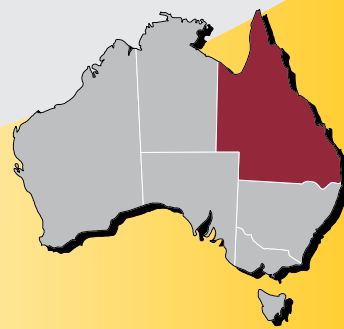

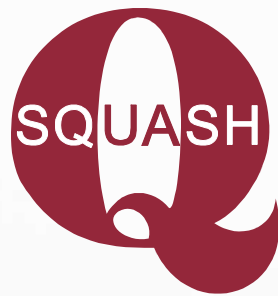

In an event full of surprise results, Japan's **Tomotaka Endo** has been crowned the 2018 Q Open Champion. Endo became the first Japanese player to win a PSA World Tour event.



Born in Brisbane, the unseeded Japanese #2 (WR#356) was too good for Malaysian [9/16] Robert Garcia (WR#295) in the final winning 3-0: 11-4, 11-8, 12-10 in 33 minutes.

Turnbull reached the final but found #1 seed **Low Wee Wern** just too good in the final. The former WN#5 Malaysian was ultra consistent winning 11-6, 11-5, 11-6 in 24 minutes to take the title and her 4th PSA title since returning from injury.

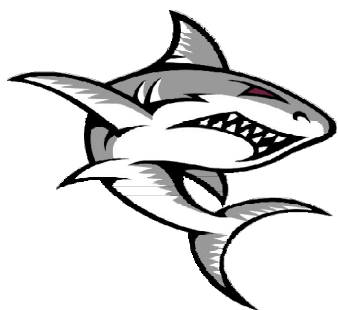

181 Players participated at the 2018 Australian Junior Championships.

28 Boys and 17 Girls participated across 10 events.

2 players won individual titles, 4 players finished runner up and 4 players finished 3rd.

15 players reached the semi finals - 8 Boys and 7 Girls.

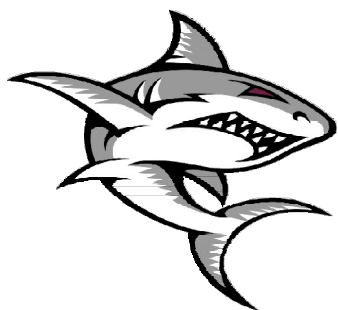

In October Chan had a WR#494 and wasn't looking like he was going to trouble anyone in Cairns let alone the #1 seed **Evan Williams** from NZ.

Chan proved he had a heart bigger than Phar Lap. At 161cm (5'3") and 61kg ringing wet he is very compact. It just proves:

"It's not the size of the dog in the fight, it's the size of the fight in the dog." - Mark Twain

Chan won his first match as a pro beating Harley Lam WR#334. Then he had his toughest test against Aussie #3S Alex Eustace WR#160 prevailing in five before destroying Chris Lo WR#205 in straight.

He then took care of Q Open winner **Tomotaka Endo** WR#356 (who created his own slice of history last week becoming the first Japanese player to win a PSA World Tour event) in four to reach his first PSA final.

Born exactly 7 years apart (20 September) Chan and Williams took the court with most punters backing the Kiwi to win. Not so ... Chan "put the cleaners" through Williams (WR#95) in four.

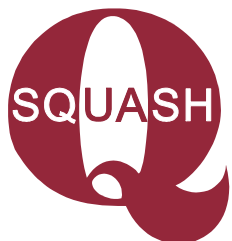

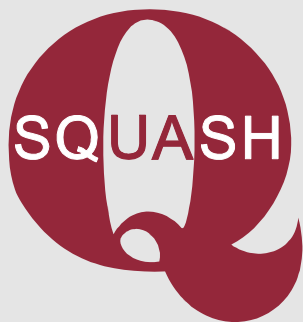

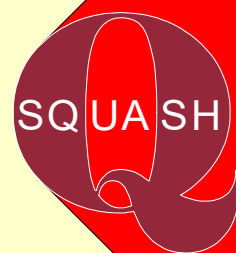
