Dear Sir.

We have been informed that the **Belmont Squash Courts** are being sold.

The owner advises us that he intends closing the courts at the end of the year and selling the property. He does not intend to sell the property as a going concern and the courts will no longer remain as a squash centre. We have been advised that the property will then revert to a residential zoning.

The Belmont Squash courts were opened by the Wheatley family in 1973 when the Australian Squash Championships saw the official opening of the Centre. At that time, they were the most up to date courts and the pinnacle of all centres in W.A. Over the past 45 years, the squash centre has been an integral part of the Belmont sporting community.

We do not want to see our sporting community lose this very important part of history.

The courts are used by the Belmont Squash Club, as well as many individuals in the Belmont community. We operate as a club playing many other clubs throughout the Perth metropolitan area which brings many individuals into the Belmont area. There is also a seniors group that play squash on a weekly basis, which caters for the older people in our community. There are always school groups that use the centre as well, for their sports facility, mainly throughout the winter months.

We have many members that are devasted at the planned closure of the centre as well as many individuals that have indicated that they will lose a facility that they regularly use as part of their keep fit regime.

Is there any possibility that the City of Belmont might look at keeping the squash centre operating as an active part of our community?

The Busselton Squash Club would like to




WA MASTERS UPDATE By Janis Haswell


