Please note players living in Mackay, Townsville, Ingham and Cairns and all areas in between along the coast are not considered remote and do not qualify for the Remote Member Registration.

COMMITTEE

The AGM will also be held on the Cairns Tournament weekend 16-17 February 2019. I will be standing down at the next AGM and we will also farewell our longest standing committee member, treasurer and very dear friend - **Karen Dyer.**

Please consider whether you would like to serve on the committee or sub-committees and thereby strengthen our support for players, clubs and centres.

Also send notice of any AGM agenda items. The AGM will be asked to update our By-Laws, discuss the State Ranking policy, explore ways to promote affiliation to increase our squash community, and brainstorm ideas to better support centres and Clubs with marketing & promotion; competition & tournaments, and Junior development & participation.

BY-LAWS

I have drafted proposed amendments for discussion to our Northern Region By-Laws included in this newsletter. Most is a simple tidy-up of language, reform and flexibility, with the major amendments shown in red. See the section at the end of this newsletter.

CLUBS & CENTRES

As the regular fixture seasons open, its time to check your fitness and readiness for safe and enjoyable participation. All affiliated players will have insurance coverage, and will also enjoy watching their progress on SportyHQ matrix.

Please keep recruiting new players to the sport, and promote the sport to your local school, community, and friends. Greater participation has already served us well, and our future prospects of grant funding and sponsorship partnerships will be greatly enhanced with more participation.

RANKINGS

The next state junior rankings will be published (I hope) on 1 February 2019.

The State rankings and associated combined seedings are relied upon by the northern region tournament hosts to set draws. Timely appeals are essential. The appeal process in the policy provides for an internal review (like the old policy to give the

rankers a chance to affirm or change their mind), and if the appellant remains aggrieved by that review decision, the appeal must be decided by an independent decision maker.

An interview with Meglin

Jules Wone sat down with Platinum Sponsor **Meglin Rathnasamy** from Smithfield Dental to learn a little bit more about him and why he is sponsoring the Cairns Junior Championships. Meglin came to Australia from South Africa in 2011.

What makes a champion? Motivation, drive, dedication and learning from failure. Doing the hard work.

What do you think of the junior development in Cairns? Fantastic! Marc and Steve are great motivators to parents and juniors. Cairns is developing the most active junior programs in Australia and the progress of the local juniors is showing the success of what is happening in Cairns.

Why sponsor the junior championships? The juniors are the future of our beloved sport. Squash is not a highly government or private sector funded sport. Squash families need to support squash and take care of our own. So much competition for funding with bigger (not better) sports. We need to work on getting squash funded in the region.

How do you feel about playing juniors and potentially having them beat you? I'm looking forward to it. This is the aim! Older and more experienced players must play our part in developing juniors and welcoming new players of all ages. It is an honour to be involved with the juniors. Me being challenged by the junior players, it's already happening.

Why do you recommend squash as a sport? Here in Cairns, air con and indoors. Not weather dependent (as it is pouring rain and the region is flooding). Healthiest workout you can get in a 30-60 minute session, as reported by Forbes Magazine.

What advice would you give to juniors to balance their academic, sporting and family responsibilities? Take lessons learnt in school and squash and apply across all facets of life. Acknowledge emotional and financial support from your family, remember your origins and do things to the best of your ability. Strive in all things you do.



2018 REDSTAR AWARDS



Our aim is to recognise as many NR juniors as we can with the **RedStar** Performance Recognition System. **Every placegetter** (1-2-3) will be recognised. Each winner of an aged event will be listed in the Achievement category and every player who finishes second or third will be listed in the Encouragement category.

Once a player has won an event they will be elevated and listed in the Achievement category even if they finish runner up or third in other events. If players are equal they will be listed in alphabetical order.

Players receive 3 points for winning a qualifier, 6 points for winning a Queensland State title and 9 points for winning a National title (AJO & AJC). Players will receive 2 points for finishing runner up in a qualifier, 4 points for runner up in a State final and 6 points for runner up in a National final. Players will receive 1 point for finishing third in a qualifier, 2 points for third in a State final and 3 points for third in a National event. U19 Players will also receive 1 bonus point for each result because they cannot enter 2 events.

Even though the Ingham qualifier was played in October 2018 it is still a 2019 qualifier so the results from that event will contribute to the **2019 NR Player of the Year Award.** A 2019 qualifier played in 2018 will not be included.

The player who accumulates the most points will be declared the Player of the Year. There will be joint winners if 2 players finish on the same number of points. The aim of the points system is to automate the selection and player results determine the outcome. The system is also designed to encourage players to support all events in their quest to accumulate points.

If an event is combined eg U17 and U19 Combined then it will be analysed to ensure points are allocated to both U17 and U19. A direct match up of the best two players in an age group will determine the winner of that age group. Otherwise the highest finishing position in an age group will receive the maximum points. **To be awarded points there must be at least two players competing in an age group.**

A player can only enter up to 2 events so they can only be rewarded with 2 results. An U9 player who might win a combined event eg **U9**, **U11 and U13 Combined** can only be rewarded for the U13 victory and their own age group U9 providing there are two U9 players competing. If there is only one player in U9 they will earn points for U13 only. If there was one player in U9 and one in U11 they will still only be rewarded for their efforts in U13. **2019 REDSTAR AWARDS**

DANGEROUS PLAY

- 1. The powers of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and the Northern Region Committee are as follows:
 - (a) Members may warn players for what is considered dangerous and unfair play.
 - (b) The Region may suspend players who fail to heed such warnings.
 - (c) Members may intervene when it is considered that referee and or markers are not correctly enforcing the rules, except where the referees and/or marker is a qualified member for the Queensland Referees Association.

INTERPRETATION OF THE BY-LAWS

2. The Northern Region Executive Committee shall decide any question arising as to the interpretation or construction of these by laws.

PENALTIES FOR BREACH OF THE BY-LAWS

3. The Committee shall have the power to impose penalties for the breach of all or any of these by-laws, including using any Q Squash disciplinary and tribunal procedure, and powers under the constitution, which may result in termination of membership of Northern Region.

APPEALS

4. Appeals against any Committee decision within the ambit of the By-Laws must be made in writing and be in the hands of the Secretary of Northern Region Inc within 14 days of the notification of the decision.

NORTHERN REGION CLOSED TITLES ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA

- 5. Juniors and Seniors who are affiliated with the Region are eligible to play in the Northern Region Closed Championships.
- 6. Juniors wishing to represent the Region in the U11, U13, U15, U17 & U19 Boys and Girls MUST play in the Closed Championships unless exempted by the committee.
- 7. Juniors playing in the Closed Championships must to be under the age as at the completion of the Compulsory tournament to win the Northern Region Perpetual Trophy for their age group. This date will vary year to year depending on the date set for this tournament.

THE SELECTION SERIES FOR NORTHERN REGION STARTS 1stJUNE THE CURRENT YEAR

- 8. To be eligible for an age group juniors have to be under the age as at the completion of the QJC Teams Event in the upcoming year. The date will vary each year due to the school holidays.
- 9. Players must be affiliated (or subject of mutual recognition) and play in two nominated

compulsory qualifying tournaments and at least one non-compulsory tournament, to be eligible for selection for the Redbacks Team to represent Northern Region unless exempted by the committee.

- 10. Exemption is at the sole discretion of the committee if the player shows in writing exceptional circumstances, including senior school and university exams; international and national squash representation; death or critical illness or critical injury of an immediate relative; and incapacity from playing due to serious illness or injury (evidenced by a medical report identifying the condition, severity and period of incapacity). Work is not considered an exceptional circumstance.
- 11. Favourable consideration will be given to players who show a continuing commitment by playing fixtures, competing Northern Region and other tournaments (including any non-compulsory events), and compete in the Northern Region Closed Championships. Talented players who relocate out of the Region for higher competition and training may represent their Region of Birth in compliance with the Q Squash policies.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

12. All matches will be played in accordance with the rules as adopted by the International Squash Rackets Federation or when modified from time to time by these by laws

VENUE FOR JUNIOR QUALIFYING TOURNAMENTS AND NORTHERN REGION CLOSED

13. The dates and venues for the Northern Region qualifying tournaments and closed championships will be determined by the committee each year, but the following will be the default sequence:

First qualifier	Ingham	October
Second qualifier	Mackay	February
Third qualifier	Townsville	March
Northern Region Closed (Compulsory)	Cairns	May

14. The Secretary will seek expressions of interest from affiliated centres and clubs in each host area.

RESPONSIBILITY OF HOST CENTRE & CLUB

- 15. The responsibilities of host centres and clubs will be determined by the committee, and each host must sign and comply with the requirements agreed between the hosts and the Northern Region.
- 16. Generally, the hosts of the qualifying tournaments are responsible for supply of trophies, balls, and entry forms and must provide its members to help with the running of the tournament. The host centre and club must also obtain sponsorship for tournament administration, prizes and trophies, account to Northern Region for any levy, and dedicate any surplus to junior development.

- 17. The hosts centres will also facilitate the Northern Region raffle at each qualifying tournaments to help fund sending officials with the team to Queensland Junior Championships and other major events.
- 18. Hosts of the Northern Region Closed Championships will receive payment of court hire and balls from entries and supplemented by Northern Region.
- 19. Tournament hosts must seed players for Regional Junior Selection Series Events in accordance with the Q Squash combined seedings. Failure to do so may result in the results being excluded from ranking at the discretion of the Q Squash Board.
- 20. Tournament hosts must administer the tournament using SportyHQ, and ensure all event results are accurately recorded in SportyHQ and available for the selection committee and chairperson within seven (7) days of completion of the tournament for selection and ranking purposes.

ENTRY FEE

- 21. Each year the committee will decide on the cost of entries for the current year, including levy for each player in the graded/novice events and each player in the age events will be charged by Northern Region for administration and travelling officials. These must remain the same for all tournaments in the season.
- 22. The Northern Region committee will determine a levy to be charged per entry to be ratified at the Annual General Meeting. The levy will be applied to assist players, coaches, managers and officials travelling on behalf of Northern Region to the Queensland Junior Championships and other major events as determined by the committee.

NORTHERN REGION SELECTION COMMITTEE

- 23. Three (3) Selectors are appointed by Northern Region Committee with a preference of each from different areas. The Selection Committee will decide representative teams members on results obtained from all tournaments in the current year. The criteria to apply for position of selector being Current Blue Card, knowledge of the sport, have an intimate knowledge of the current standard of each player, be prepared to attend the qualifying tournaments, be aware of any inconsistent results, and must be totally unbiased.
- 24. The Chairperson has the casting vote for any unresolved issues and is also responsible to be the Q Squash Northern Region representative on the Q Squash ranking committee and carry out the duties required by the Q Squash Ranking Policy, including applying the Policy to decide and update regional rankings, combined seedings, and State Rankings within 14 days of each Northern Region tournament.

NORTHERN REGION TEAM SELECTION

25. A valid Team Member is generally a player who resides in Northern Region permanently, is affiliated with Q Squash, and has competed in the necessary qualifying tournaments unless

exempted by the committee. Players who change residency within 3 months prior to the QJC will have the option to play for the Region of their choosing.

- 26. Players wishing to play the qualifiers for selection in the Redbacks Team must be under the age as at the completion of the QJC Teams Event. A player who has turned 19 is eligible to represent the Region in any Senior Representative Team.
- 27. The top four players selected in boys and girls, providing they have satisfied the selection criteria will be chosen to represent Northern Region from their overall results Players must compete in their own eligible age group as first option.
- 28. Players may compete in an additional age group. It is recommended that they compete in the next highest age group or if they wish to represent the Region, they should strive to compete in the two age groups in which they are eligible for selection.

For example a player already competing in the 15 year age group may compete in the 17 year age group to enhance their chance of selection.

- 29. When selecting the Northern Region Team the Selectors will focus mainly on the results achieved within the player's own eligible age group. However, a player may be selected to represent Northern Region in a higher age group if necessary.
- 30. Players selected to represent the Northern Region, and associated responsible adults, must sign and comply with the code of conduct and accommodation rules relevant to the event.

TEAM UNIFORMS

31. The Northern Region Representative Teams will be known as NORTHERN REDBACKS. Specified uniform must be worn during any teams event. Only members of a team representing the Region is entitled to order the Team Uniform. The Travel Shirt may be purchased by anyone wishing to do so, in order to support the Region.

AFFILIATION

32. Players, clubs and centres must maintain current affiliation with Q Squash. Only affiliated players will be eligible to compete, and only affiliated centres and clubs are eligible to host, Northern Region qualifying tournaments, Northern Region closed championships, Queensland Junior Championships or Queensland Open.

PLAYERS RISK

33. It is compulsory for Juniors under 19 to wear protective Eyewear and also for Seniors playing Doubles.

ACCOMODATION FOR REPRESENTATIVE TEAM

34. When travelling to the QJC it is preferred that team members stay at the Northern Region booked accommodation for the duration of the individual tournament, but it is compulsory for

team members to stay at that accommodation for the duration of the teams event, unless exempted by the committee for team members to stay with friends, relatives or parents.

- 35. Absolutely NO ONE outside Northern Region will be allowed to stay overnight and any visitors to the accommodation must be approved by the Team Manager. Players wishing to leave the Officials care on the free day must give Northern Region written permission from a parent.
- 36. Accommodated players, and associated responsible adults, must sign and comply with the code of conduct and accommodation rules relevant to the event.

COACHES & OFFICIALS FOR QJC

- 37. Position for coaches to travel with the Northern Redbacks team will be advertised and appointment made by the Northern Region committee on receipt of resumes.
- 38. Minimum requirements will be holding a current blue card, be an accredited Level 1 coach or higher, been working with juniors 9 19 age group in the current year, be available for the duration of the individual and teams event plus any other criteria deemed necessary by the executive of Q Squash Northern Region Inc. Accommodation costs for selected coaches to be paid by Q Squash Northern Region Inc.
- 39. A member of the Q Squash Northern Region Inc. executive, or its nominee, is to be appointed as a representative to attend the Q Squash Ltd Annual General Meeting as spokesperson for the Region and be available for election to the Board of Q Squash Ltd. This representative is appointed at the Annual General Meeting of Q Squash Northern Region Inc. each year.
- 40. The committee will determine the nature and extent of any subsidy for costs of travel, accommodation and meals of coaches, managers and officials travelling on behalf of Northern Region to the Queensland Junior Championships and other major events.

RANKINGS

41. Eligibility, determination and appeal in relation to rankings and seedlings will be in accordance with the Q Squash Ranking Policy.
