



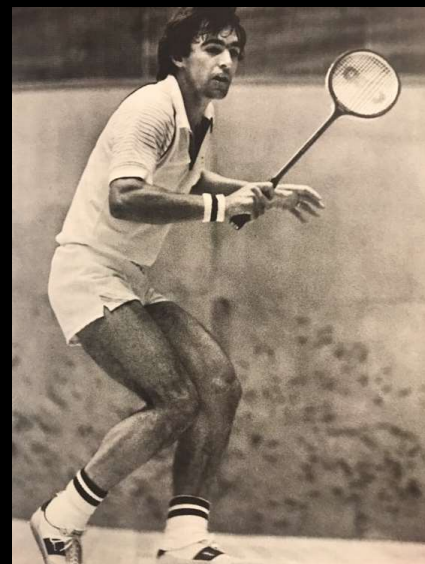
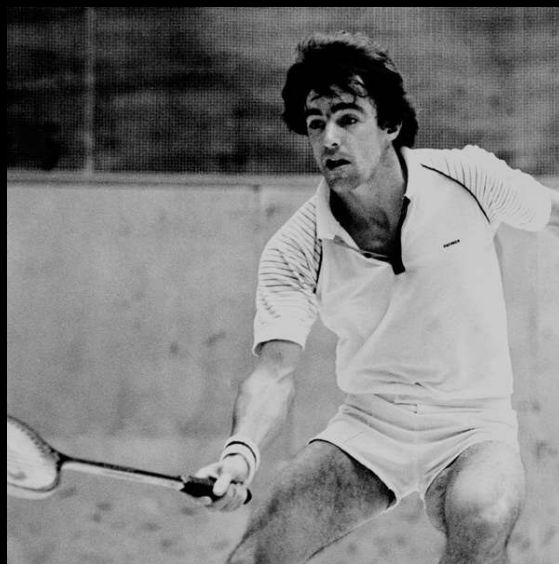
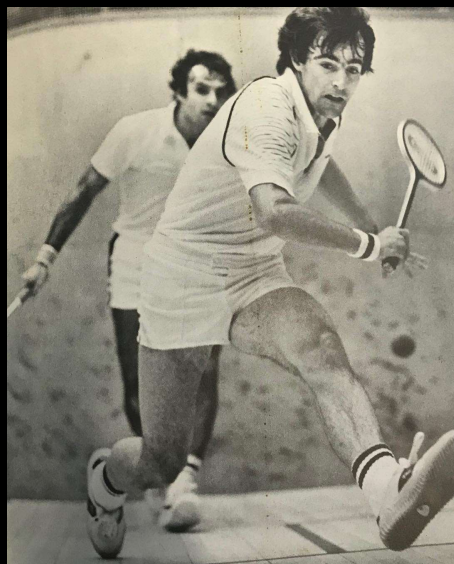

## DEAN WILLIAMS ... Those GLORY DAYS!



**Dean Williams** (born 22 April 1956 in Perth, Western Australia) was one of the leading players in the game in the late 1970s and 1980s, reaching a career-high world ranking of **World # 3 in 1984!**

In 1982, Williams finished runner-up at the World Open, losing in the final to the legendary Pakistani player Jahangir Khan 2-9, 9-6, 1-9, 1-9.

### 2018 President's Report WA Squash

#### **Terrace Squash**

The first priority in 2018 was to resolve WA Squash's home at The Terrace Squash Centre.

Due to our sub-tenant vacating, and not having approval by our landlord to replace the sub-tenant this placed significant financial stress on WA Squash. Several options were discussed with the landlord, and this resulted in a break lease being negotiated where both parties agreed for WA Squash to vacate by the end of 2018.

This in the Boards view was a good outcome that enabled WA Squash to stop the cash flow loss of staying in this facility.

WA Squash are now based at 15/ 386 Wannaroo Road Westminster

#### **State Junior Team**

Our juniors won the Australian Junior Championships for the first time. This result reflects a significant achievement due to the result of many years of hard work from our Coaches, Coordinators and Development Officer.

Proudly, it was noted the True Sport values were reflected in our junior's behaviours, which is a credit to the players, parents and administrators.

#### **Facilities**

A facilities working group has been established to work with the State Government on a business case for a State Centre.

The scope and potential locations for a State Centre are still being worked through. The business case will help guide any future investment decision. We are hopeful the business case will be finalised in the coming months.

This has been a monumental effort by the working group, and would like to thank them for their efforts.

#### **Communication**

WA Squash will continue to seek improvement on its communication to members.

# Busselton SW Squash Teams Masters

## Warren Oliver Reports

73 Players from the southwest and Perth competed in the 33<sup>rd</sup> SW Squash Masters this year held at the South West Sports Centre in Bunbury (due to the imminent closure of the Busselton Courts) over the long weekend in March in 4 Divisions with ages from 35 to 80 years.

The Busselton Club ran the tournament while the Bunbury Club ran the bar. This is the biggest Masters Squash event outside of Perth and one of the longest running. Busselton was able to have representatives in all 4 divisions. 14 Busselton players entered over the weekend in 5 teams with Busselton successful with one of those teams.

The coveted Div 1 shield was taken out by the Bunbury Bandits team of Jamie Herring, Brad Grinter and Dean Reynolds defeating 2017 year's winners Busselton's Just Cruizin Team of Paul Hey, Sean Brockman and Rachel Hey.

Bunbury has now won the converted Div 1 title in 2014, 2016, 2018 and 2019. The standard of squash was exceptional in the final with a combination of patient long rallies and incredible shot making and retrieving. The team won all its matches over the weekend with both Dean and Brad going through the weekend undefeated while Jamie's only loss was to Paul Hey.

Division 2 was taken out by the Hilton Iron Lungs team of Graham Follington, Roy Woelke and Shean Bond who went through the weekend undefeated beating last year's div 2 winners the Bunbury Bad Boasters team of Mark Lush, Mike Genders and Kelvin Carmichael who had won the title for the past 3 years. Both Graham and Shean won all their matches over the weekend.

The Div 3 final saw the Busselton Mixed Champ's team of Dale Maytham, Ed Jennings and Christine Champ take out the title going undefeated; with Bunbury Leschenault Legends team of Aaron Hughes, Erin Zolnier, Barbara Murtha, Kevin Wells, and Dave Crump coming 2<sup>nd</sup>. In fact the Busselton mixed Champs had the biggest margin over any 2<sup>nd</sup> placed team in all divisions. Both Dale and Christine won all 5 of their matches over the weekend.

Div 4 ended up being the closest of all divisions with the Perth Captain Cooks team of Terry Brookes, Nikki McCullough and Di Cook winning on a count back from the Perth Jac of all Trades team of Chris Reston, Anita Bull and Janis Haswell, with both teams on 4 wins out of 5 matches, but the Captain Cooks winning more games. There was also a count back for 3rd which went right down to points after both matches and games were equal.

Sat night saw 50 people socialise at an Indian function at the Bunbury Badminton Centre which recognised 24 players who have entered the tournament 10 or more times with one player, Joyce Barnett, having entered an incredible 29 times out of a possible 33, and 4 other players have played 20 or more times. These players were given a Busselton squash club wine goblet as a memento. Over the past 33 years 543 players have played at least once in the tournament, and it was great to see 11 players make their first appearance at this iconic event.

The Busselton club would like to thank its many sponsors Hillzeez Down South Surf Shops, Swings and Roundabouts Winery, Margaret River Cheese Company, Busselton Discount Drug Store, Wayne Evans for supplying the very popular Crayfish in the raffle, Ron Clayton and Brian Roby for compiling the draws, tournament director Warren Oliver and the Bunbury Squash club for sponsorship of the Saturday dinner.

Overall the tournament was a huge success with the combined efforts from both clubs and not far from the record attendances of 84 in 2012, 83 in 2010 and 80 in 2015. The Busselton Squash Club will continue to play its weekly pennants out of the Sebel Courts in Busselton.

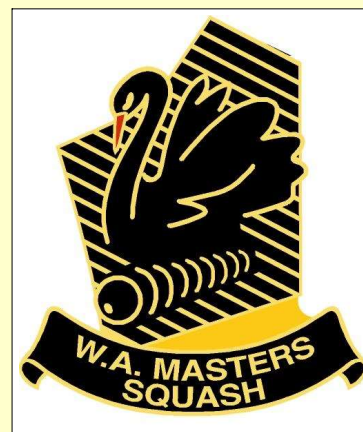
# WA MASTERS UPDATE
