A BIG congratulations to Oscar Curtis who won DOUBLE GOLD in the two Platinum events conducted in April.

Curtis began by winning the Boys Under 15 Title at the Oceania Junior Championships before beating fellow West Australian Dylan **Classen** at the Australian Junior Open.

Curtis also led the way in the Trans Tasman Test Series winning both his matches. Unfortunately, Australia was beaten comfortably 6-12 (1st Test) and 5-13 (2nd Test).

Eric Marsh won the Boys Under 11 Oceania title but finished 4th at the AJO.

In other results Isla Harris was runner up in the Girls U13 Championship at the AJO whilst Greg Chan had to settle for a pair of Bronze Medals at both championships in the U17 events.

There has been a major change to the State Junior Rankings. Effectively they will now mirror the National Rankings for WA players. The big difference is players will not be ranked in multiple age groups.

Great to have Michaela Pratt back writing for the SWAN. With juniors back in full swing it is always good to get a "behind the scenes" wrap up of the tournaments from Michaela. Her style of writing is fresh and witty.

On 27 March 2019 WA Squash held its Annual General Meeting, which was attended by voting delegates for clubs, Life members and members from various clubs supporting squash in WA.

The AGM was officiated by myself as President, welcoming all attendees and presenting my Report for the previous year including, the move from Terrace and issues surrounding that, the move to Westminster, development of a Strategic Plan, re establishing sub committees allowing members to buy into the future of WA Squash and future plans.

This report was well received by those in attendance and can be viewed on the WA Squash website which also adds to the value of conducting regular information sessions with member clubs throughout the year regarding the issues confronting the Board and decisions being made and reasons why.

Dean Williams, Acting General Manager, presented a report prepared by outgoing GM Don Huffer, plus added a few ideas and issues since he has taken on the task and issues confronting the Board and squash in WA.

All reports of the AGM can be viewed on the website allowing all members to be fully informed as to the past and future direction for squash in WA.

This year again nominations for vacant board positions required an election for the four positions, with five nominations received. The election was adjudicated by Life Members Steve Winch and Ken Watson ... thank you.

The incoming Board members are; Carsten Frederiksen (Subi Kings), Deborah Hoffrichter (Esperance), Katy Scott (Belmont) and Leigh Kaye (Mirrabooka) who join current members Glenn Hitch, Trevor Cruickshank and Neil Butler. Ray Smith has resigned.

At the first General meeting of Board on 16th April 2019, all Executive positions were vacated. The following were then elected: President: Glenn Hitch, Vice President: Trevor Cruickshank, Secretary: Deb Hoffrichter and Treasurer: Neil Butler. New Board members Katy and Leigh were provided with an overview of WA Squash. Further discussions with both will be ongoing allowing them to be informed and brought up to speed regarding WA Squash Operations.

Since the AGM some tough decisions have had to be made by the Board, which are never taken lightly, which will have an impact upon all player members, clubs and WA Squash into the future.

Neil Butler had taken on the task of having the Constitution developed in consultation and with great support from volunteers, making us come in line with State Government requirements and ensuring stability in the future.

Dean and Katy Scott have been in talks with State Government departments seeking out a future facility to assist and allow growth of Squash within WA. More information will be provided at the regular information sessions as they develop.

In closing a big thank you to all who attended the AGM and especially all the people who nominated for Board and congratulations to those who were elected by the members to represent them on the Board.



April was a very busy month with lots happening. Some of our awesome Juniors travelled to NZ to represent Australia in the Trans Tasman and Oceania Junior Open. The results are listed in this report. Many of them plus more from WA then travelled to Sydney to compete in the AJO where once again WA performed well above its weight and we had some great results.

The sad news which WA then broke to the rest of Australia was that we would not be fielding a team at this year's AJC in Devonport, Tasmania. It was not a decision taken lightly but after much deliberation, surveys, meetings and countless hours of looking at ways to get there the Board decided to withdraw from the AJC.

The main reasons were that the timing for us to travel as a team meant that we have to go via Melbourne on the week leading up to the AFL Grand Final and then get to Devonport. The cost per child was quite high and as we have many parents who have more than one child eligible the financial impact was large. Plus sadly, some States do not field full teams so many of our team do not get to play every State. WA won the title last year in Darwin which was a wonderful effort but the cost this year was just too great. I'm hoping that the States can get together and look at the timing and costings for future AJC's .

To continue my stories of when I was a touring pro, I thought I would tell the story of the FIRST ever all glass court. In 1979 a few of us were chosen to play on the all glass court from Ellis Pearson Company in Greater Yarmouth in East Anglia, about 3 hours north east of London.

ITV Channel 4 was to televise a one hour squash show highlighting the all glass court and the different viewing angles for spectators and to experiment with TV angles. It was to be an exhibition between 8 players with Hiddy Jahan and Qamar Zaman headlining the players.

The court played OK but the greatest test for us players was the ball !!! We experimented with a dimple ball with white paint in the dimples, we played with a ball that had reflecting triangles glued on so the bright TV lights would be able to pick up the ball. Well to say it was not easy to play was an understatement with the ball skidding off the side walls and the triangles came off so we all had to put on a great show to overcome these massive problems. We used up to 12 balls per game !!!

The result was quite good and it was aired on a Saturday afternoon to great reviews and the impact was felt in greater numbers watching the games live and more sponsorship came in as it was televised a lot more. It was fantastic to be a part of this new era in squash and to have this at the start of my career was so lucky !!! It was also the start of Jahangir's career !!!

In the school holidays, 15 Western Australian kids and their families and coaches headed to Sydney to play in the Australian Junior Open. The tournament was held at the home base of NSW squash, at the Thornleigh Squash Centre.



Some highlights of the trip included the endless games of Yaniv, (the unofficial card game of the WA state team), Dylan Classen's impersonations of 'housekeeping' (those who know, know) and myself and Caitlin's room, which became the unofficial kids hangout due to its parent free nature and, of course, the squash.

Some of us were lucky enough to stay at the Ibis, which was a convenient 5 minute walk from the squash centre, although it could be done in 3, if you left something behind (like a pair of socks perhaps). Speaking of the hotel, rumour has it that it was the Kiwi kids who managed to bring the elevator to a halt for an inconvenient day. I promise that none of the WA kids were involved.

WA were well represented at the pointy end of the tournament and our players were involved in some fantastic matches. Abel's loss in 5 against Sam Sergo was a brutal affair and possibly the match of the tournament. Although Sam snuck through by the smallest of margins, Abel made him earn it in spades and it was impossible for Sam to be anywhere near 100% for his next matches.

Isla Harris made the final of the U13 girls and finished runner up, going down in four to the current Australian #1. Hannah Slyth finished a very credible 6th with Isla Mac enjoying her first tournament at this level, finishing 10th.

Erin Classen, playing up two age divisions showed she can mix it with the best in the country finishing 4th in the U19s, Greg Chan, the coolest player under pressure I have seen placed 3rd in the U17 boys, with Remi ending his run in the 5-8 position.

Kiran Byles finished in the 11/12 play-off. Yours truly earned her best result at this level finishing a very close 4th in the U17 girls. Eric Marsh backed up his great Oceania results with a strong 4th place finish. His younger brother, Alex Marsh, finished 10th in the U11s. Pascale finished 10th in a strong field.

The highlight however was Dylan Classen and Oscar Curtis, who demonstrated the depth of talent on offer in WA by dominating the U15 division, playing off in the final, with Oscar winning in 3. Oscar having won the Oceania Championships and the Australian Open without dropping a game, simply awesome!

Daniel Marsh finished in the 5-8 slot, also in this age group.

Congratulations all WA players, you were fantastic (and good on the table tennis table as well) and big thanks to the parents who supported and coached and special mention to Tim Cowell and Amanda Hopps who made the trip and helped out all over the place with coaching.

Across 10 matches Oscar didn't drop a game. He was also dominant against the Kiwis in the Trans Tasman winning both his test matches dropping just 6 and 7 points.

Oscar is a fine ambassador of the game and deserves every accolade he receives.
