Irene (Rene) Petkovich was a much loved member of Blue Gum Squash Club for over thirty years and will be sorely missed by all those that met her on and off the court.

Irene learnt to play squash as a young girl at the Meuleman courts in South Perth. Her long squash career began at Bull Creek in the late 70's participating in day pennants and then progressing to nights. In 1985 Irene moved with the club to Blue Gum.

Irene really loved her squash and worked hard to be competitive. In her early years at Blue Gum she had coaching once a week and would spend hours training and doing drills. This hard work, combined with her fitness and dedication, paid off giving her the stamina and skill to come through many a tough match and amazingly win in five.

Over the years Irene became more and more involved with the Blue Gum Squash Club, firstly as a committee member and then for the last six years as the Ladies Club Captain. Even though the number of ladies playing squash was declining, Irene, through her diligence and dedication was able to keep the teams going. In the last year Irene also volunteered her time to assist Sue Hillier with junior coaching at Squashworld Brentwood.

Her culinary skills were well known, even outside Blue Gum and opposition players (as well as her own team mates) were always collecting her recipes. As the number of Blue Gum ladies decreased Irene took over the responsibility of catering for our functions and as everybody involved will attest to, the food was always scrumptious.

Irene participated in many pennant wins for both Bull Creek and Blue Gum with success in numerous Grand Finals right up to 2018 Spring season. In the last two years Irene was a member of three successful Blue Gum Ladies Grand Final wins.

Irene was keen to enter tournaments and also played Masters for a period of time. In 2009 she travelled to Melbourne with Maddy Tushingham, Anna Bowen and Judy Willis where they won Division 19 in the Melbourne Australian Masters in a close fought contest. This was the only time these girls went away together as a team, they had so much fun and vowed 'to do it again' but unfortunately with the very busy lives we lead these days it never happened.

WA Squash players and fans were treated to a wonderful exhibition of squash when the Aussie #3 and #4 decided to hold not one but two exhibition matches at Mirrabooka and Cambridge.

It was a promoter's dream with both matches going to five and after 10 entertaining games it was all locked up at one win each.

Former World #38 Mike "Moose" Corren turned back the clock again to tackle Victoria's Rex Hedrick. Hedrick has enjoyed a career high World ranking of #48 and won all the major events in Australia last year.

It was a case of a 45 year old taking on a 30 year old! Most squash players of 45 years of age are playing Masters and doing their utmost to avoid those energetic "run all day" youngsters.



But for Corren it's just another day at the office. The winner of 52 PSA titles just keeps on winning and competing against the very best on the PSA circuit downunder.

Mirrabooka Manager Tyron Holloway was delighted with the first exhibition "It has been a goal of mine to have an exhibition match event at Mirrabooka Squash Club for some time. Giving everyone the chance to come to the club and see top level squash live".

"After his win at the Esperance Open, the Moose was kind enough to offer his services. But who would be the challenger? Well it was none other than Rex Hedrick, the current Australian #3. So with the support of Squashworld and Mirrabooka Squash Club, we managed to get the young gun in from over east for matches at Mirrabooka (on Friday) and Cambridge (on Saturday)".

"As promised, the lads delivered some seriously entertaining squash! The clashes were most entertaining with Rex winning 3-2 at Mirrabooka and Moose taking the honours 3-2 at Cambridge!

At Mirrabooka there was a 2 tier set up upstairs behind officials Neil and Richard. Downstairs featured 4 rows of seats set up with benches for optimal viewing and a live score screen. The MC Samuel Turner, with his trusty microphone kept things

Although entry numbers were down on previous years the standard of squash was really high and some great matches were witnessed by us all!

Then it was down to business with training before the big event.

As **Maxine** ("Maxi" the Pocket Rocket) **Salter** was the only entrant in the Girls U11s and U13s, Maxi had the huge task of competing in the Girls U17s (15s & 17s merged). With the most commendable attitude our 10 year old took on the girls with style and smiles. Maxi was rewarded with winning a game against Jaimie Mitchell (NT) and finished 4th in this Division.

Maxi also competed in the Boys U11 (changed to Mixed U11s) and was seeded No 1 where she endured the challenges of the boys to win a great final in 3 against the No 2 seed Cameron Rowston (NT)!

In the Boys U13s we had 2 competitors: **Jonathan** ("Jono") **Groenewald** (No 1 seed) and **Cristian Engelbrecht** (No 3 seed). This was Cristian's first age group tournament. Cristian had to play Jono in the semi-final which was played in great team spirit. Cristian finished 3rd. Jono's U13 final against Henry Siviour (his billet family) was epic to say the least. Jono beat Henry in 3 in the Boys U15s semi-final the day before so we were quietly confident that he would win this match too. Having lost the first 2 games in the final however, I was never in doubt that Jono would slowly work his way into the game. Jono's Dad was not quite so convinced! Even at 7-2 down in the 5th I knew that Jono would play just one point at a time and get the job done! This he did to secure the win and the title with an 11-9 win! What a champ!

Both Jono and Cristian also competed in the Boys U15s which was a round robin with 4 players. Cristian's squash improved as the tournament went on and he was valiant in his defeat to finish 4th. Jono played Henry's brother Will in the final match for this age group and put on a great display of squash. Although he lost in 3 and Runner-Up to the more experienced player, Jono has certainly shown he will be a future strong competitor in our sport!

In the Girls U19s event, **Isabella** ("Bella") **Diver** competed against the two local girls. Fending off a scare in the 3rd game of her last match in this Division, Bella won the title with a 15-13 win!

The Boys U17s and 19s Divisions were also merged to create 2 pools of 4. **Remi Young** (No 1 seed), **Sam Menagh** (No 7 seed) and **Bella Diver** (No 6 seed) all competed. Sam saved his best squash for his last match where he scored a win against Nik Amanatidis (NT) 12-10 in the 4th! Sam's smiling attitude and love of being on the court emphasised that you don't have to win all your matches if you are having fun! Bella found the boys competition strong and she was pushed in each match but showed she has some classy shots as well that caught the boys off guard!

The penultimate match of the tournament was the final showdown between Remi and No 2 seed local hero Mitchell Van Heythuysen. With the scoreline at 2-2, the fifth game was a point by point affair with neither player giving into the other. No free points! No serves going out! Every point was a hard rally! Remi finally got the win at 12-10! Simply awesome!!



To finish off the day before we boarded the plane for home, we had to celebrate two of our title winners who were celebrating birthdays on Sunday 5 May: Maxi turned 11 and Jono turned 12! Happy birthday to our champions!



Those intending to enter the teams event only will still need to complete the entry form at the above website and also inform WA Masters as soon as possible by sending an email to



Spotlight on 2019 WA Masters Squash Committee - Ed Jennings

Ed Jennings is a widely known member of the Masters Squash community. He contributes tirelessly to all State Masters events, both on court and behind the scene on the WA Masters committee.





Ed began his squash career in the 1970s at Marmion Squash Centre. His claim to fame in those days was his penchant for extremely long squash games, and even longer showers. The tenacity with which Ed approaches his squash (and his showers) is reflected in the way he tackles any responsibility he assumes for squash. Ed rarely needs to be asked to take on a task; he is always there first with his hand up. However, Ed does decline public recognition for the work, advice and assistance he provides to whoever needs it, preferring instead to keep the extent of his contribution understated.

Ed has served in various capacities on the WA Masters Squash committee for around 20 years or so and continues to do so. His involvement extends from general committee duties to organising tournaments, sourcing prizes and eliciting sponsorships from his many personal and professional contacts. Not just now and then, but for every WA Masters event held.


As well as his involvement in Masters Squash, Ed served on the WA Squash board for many years, looking after the interests of the sport and players in WA as well as the Masters community. This commitment was in addition to his activities relating to his own club and to Masters. In every aspect of the sport, Ed has tried his best to promote and perpetuate squash here in the West. He also qualified as a squash referee to enhance his value to the sport.

Ed has made squash a large part of his life. When Marmion Squash Centre decided to close its doors many years ago, he and partner Linda, together with several other Marmion Squash Club Members, developed a plan to keep the club together. The group negotiated with other clubs for Marmion Squash Club to play pennants out of host squash centres until the Wangara Squash Factory could finally be built providing a permanent home once again for the Marmion Squash Club. This was a brave move in the face of a

widespread downturn of the sport in the West and the closing of many squash centres in WA at that time, and one that has helped the sport to continue here.

Ed's contribution to squash extends to the AMSA Championships where his 'can do' attitude is also widely known. He has assisted with organising the WA teams participating in the AMSA Teams event, and attends the Interstate Teams meetings.

Given Ed's long and generous association with squash, I think it's











more than fair to say that Ed conducts his involvement in Masters Squash the same way in which he conducts his life: with vigour, enthusiasm, concern, and fairness. *And*, very importantly, he continues to thoroughly enjoy his squash.

PLEASE REMEMBER – the more Masters players participating in Masters events, the stronger WA Masters Squash becomes, ensuring a long future of squash not only for our current members, but

for all those youngsters who are fast catching us up.














2019 BROOME INVITATIONAL

The Broome Squash Club hosted their fourth annual Invitational Squash Tournament in May. This is a unique tournament where the club hand picks players from around the country to come up and compete in a three-day tournament.

This year we had 64 athletes competing across four grades. Half of those athletes were invited from WA including Melbourne based squash superstar, Sarah Fitz-Gerald.



Sarah is a five-time World Champion, she has won the British Open twice, she has two Commonwealth Games gold medals, she's been the Australian Athlete of the Year twice and spent a total of 272 weeks as the world number one! She's currently the World Number One in her age group and she was the number one seed at the Broome Invitational.

Sarah went on to win the A Grade Division easily without dropping a single game to any of her male opponents.

"It was such a thrill to have someone of such a high level come to a regional town to promote squash. Our club really benefited and we loved the promotion squash got as a result of Sarah Fitz-Gerald coming to Broome", said the President for Broome Squash Club, Craig Starcevich.

While Sarah was in Broome she hosted a free workshop with members to further enhance their skills and met with key stakeholders to try and get Broome more squash courts.

The Broome Squash Club managed to hold the Invitational tournament on only two courts. Their weekly pennants for senior and junior competitions have been running at capacity for many years and will now turn their energy into fundraising for a further three courts.

With the help of funding from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, the Broome Squash Club also engaged referee guru Neil Butler to be the tournament referee. He also gave members a free lesson on squash rules.
