





MY AJC EXPERIENCE





Well finally the AJC is back in Queensland. This great event rotates between all the States and Territories. Queensland last hosted the AJC back in 2007.

If you start young you could actually visit every State/Territory during your junior squash years!

I was fortunate to have been involved with 12 AJC's from 1999 to 2010. I loved every one of them and I'm confident you would too.

The Championships run for 8 days during the school holidays in September/October. The first 4 days are dedicated to the individual championships from U11 to U19. On the night of the 4th day the players celebrate the new champions at a presentation function.

Players who have been selected to represent their State/Territory then enjoy a day off to take in the sights or rest up in preparation for the Australian Teams Championship for U13 to U19 over the next 3 days.

In my opinion, the Teams Championship is the ultimate event on the National junior squash calendar.

Representing the **Queensland Sharks** should be your ultimate aim. The Sharks have won the last 11 Team Championships!

Some parents don't think their child is up to the standard of a National Championship. If there isn't a chance of their child winning they find it difficult to justify the expense.

If this is the situation I can only encourage parents to have a rethink. Participation at the AJC is something to aspire to and representing your State/Territory is the ultimate regardless of your standard.

Participation is so important and contributes significantly to a child's growth in terms of squash development and confidence.

I have seen so many kids get a taste of what the Nationals are all about and return every year to challenge themselves whether they are the best or not.

Some return home and train the house down before returning the next year to see how their squash has improved over the last 12 months.

Sure it costs money to attend and I appreciate some families do struggle but if you plan ahead it is surprising just how well you can do.

Attending an AJC is a life experience. You learn to travel, take in the sights and experiences of a place you may have never been to, meet new people and enjoy playing some competitive squash. You grow.

All in all I'm confident you would have a fantastic time. So I urge you, especially if you live in Queensland, to attend this year's AJC in Cairns. Cairns has so much to offer and it could even be turned into your family holiday!
