The Individual events at the Australian Masters Squash Championships have concluded with 22 players crowned the best in Australia for 2019. Queenslanders dominated the National titles played across 3 venues on the Gold Coast between 2-6 September.

The mighty maroons won 11 Open titles whilst NSW and WA shared equal second with three titles each. Victoria had two Open Champs whilst Tassie, New Zealand and the USA each had one.

Former World #45 **Steve Finitsis (Qld)** won the prestigious Australian Masters Over 35 Men's Open title at his first attempt. Simon Carruthers (NSW) was runner up with Big Steve beating him 11-6, 13-11, 11-9 during the 5-person round robin match ups. However, the clash with arch rival Brad Freeme (Qld) provided the highlight in this event with Steve winning the see-sawing clash 11-4, 10-12, 11-9, 8-11, 11-7.

Six players from the Women's 35-39 and 40-44 age groups played in a round robin contest with **Kym Phillips (Qld)** emerging as the Over 35 Champion and **Melissa Martin (Qld)** the Over 40 Champ. It was a repeat performance for Kym who won the same title in Tassie in 2018. Melissa dominated her rivals to secure her 6th Aussie Masters Open title. She finished runner up in the Over 40 event at the 2018 World Championships so she is definitely a force in this age group.

Ten players entered the Men's Over 40 Open with the classy **Danny Woolbank (Qld)** winning all his matches in three including the final against last year's champion Grant Farrant (NSW) to secure his 4th open title in Masters.

Former W#1 **John White (USA but born in Qld!)** showed why he was once the best in the Professional World by destroying everyone including brother David White (Qld) in the Over 45 Open final. David gave it his best but John was

just too good winning the "battle of the brothers" 12-10, 11-7, 7-11, 11-6.

Shannon MacNamara (NSW) was equally as impressive winning all her matches in straight in the Women 45 Open. She beat 5 other players in the RR event to take out her first Australian Masters Open title.

#1 seed **Peter Bastow (NSW)** was a cut above the rest winning all his matches in three in the Over 50 Open. He beat Marc Forster (Qld) 11-6, 11-6, 11-5 in the final to secure his first Master Open title.

It was great to see **Sue Davis (Qld)** win the Women's Over 50 Open title beating another multiple Masters Champion Sarah Nelson (NSW) in the final to win her 2nd Masters Open title. It has been a long time between drinks for Sue who won her first title back in 2008. She must have been glad to see the back of Sarah Fitz-Gerald! Sue was runner up to Sarah at the 2018 World Championships.



The Men's Over 55 Open final was a top contest between **Peter Gilbee (Vic)** and Warren Miller (Vic). The field of 10 boasted two formidable former Masters Champions: Miller 10 titles and Dale Robbins (Qld) 9 titles. So, the expectations weren't high that a player with just one previous title would knock out those two on his way to a second. However, Gilbee had had other ideas beating Robbins in a tight 2nd round match 8-11, 11-8, 11-9, 11-9 before beating the #1 seed Miller 11-8, 9-11, 11-4, 11-9 in the final.

World Champion **Sue Hillier (WA)** denied Sue Williams (Qld) her 3rd straight title with a strong performance to win in three in the Over 55 Open. It was Hillier's 6th Australian title. She made a clean sweep of 5 titles in the over 50 age group but she can't repeat that having missed last year's Championship. She was too busy winning World title #2!

Kelvin Smith (Qld) claimed his 5th Australian Masters Open title when he stopped Jim Mobbs

(Qld) from winning his 4th title on the trot in the Men's Over 60 final. Kelvin simply had all the answers at the business end of each game emerging the winner 11-8, 11-8, 11-7.

Women's Over 60 Open Champion **Anne Richards (WA)** simply destroyed the field of 12 winning all her matches in three. In the process the former World Masters Champ chalked up Aussie Masters Open title #12. She has dominated this age group with 4 out of a possible 5 titles.

Wayne Seebeck (NZ) notched up his second Australian Masters Open title when he won the Over 65 event. He stopped #1 seed Michael Brown (Tas) from winning his 4th National title 11-5, 11-5, 11-7.

2018 World Champion **Gaye Mitchell (Tas)** survived a scare in her semi-final against Khris Wiaceck (WA) blowing a 2 game to love lead to ultimately win in five to secure her place in the Over 65 final. She then had a tough encounter with Freda Walker (NZ) before claiming her 11th National Masters title in four: 11-7, 11-6, 5-11, 12-10.

It was a case of Masters Open title #24 when **Brian Cook (Qld)** won the Men's Over 70 Open. The five times World Champ was too strong for Vic Thomas (WA) winning the final 15-10, 13-15, 15-6, 15-11. Nobody has a better record than Brian in Australian Masters competition. Brian has won a National title in every age group commencing with his first in 1987.

Robyn Prentice (Qld) won an epic encounter against Marilyn Kennedy (Qld)

in the Over 70 contest. Robyn won her 7th Open title by beating Marilyn 15-9, 12-15, 18-16, 15-13. Marilyn had also won 6 previous titles. Robyn was co-chair of the organising committee so this victory was possibly one of her proudest and finest moments in squash. Robyn still gives so much to squash so her achievement is thoroughly deserving.

The Men's Over 75 Open title was taken out by **Mike McDonald (NSW)**. Securing his 10th National Open title wasn't easy. He beat 3 times champion Tom Slattery (Vic) in the semi before clinching the title with a gutsy 15-7, 15-10, 12-15, 11-15, 15-11 win against the 2017 champion Brian Lyons (Vic).

Robyne Bamberry (Qld) claimed her 13th title when she won all her matches in three in the Women's Over 75 Open. In the last match of the 5-person round robin Robyne beat last year's winner Pam Moran (NSW) to secure the title. Denise Storey (Qld) finished runner up.

Dinny Hurley (Vic) won his 15th National title in fine style when he took out the 4-person round robin for the golden oldies! Dinny remained undefeated taking home the Men's Over 80 trophy. It was also his 3rd title on the trot. Peter Zillmer (Qld) finished runner up.
