

Please note Mackay and Cairns are the compulsory tournaments. To qualify for selection to the Redbacks team, juniors must play three (3) of the four (4) NR Junior tournaments. A junior must play both compulsory tournaments in Cairns and Mackay and at least 1 tournament in Ingham or Townsville. Juniors who meet this criteria will be given priority consideration when the Redbacks are selected regardless of strength of an individual who has not fully qualified or strength of the overall team. Please do not assume you will be selected to the Northern Redbacks if you have not qualified by attending the required tournaments or have not provided medical evidence to remain eligible.

AFFILIATION WITH Q SQUASH

Affiliation fees: \$73 for a full 1 year; or \$44 for seasonal (6 months).

Please remember affiliation comes with all sorts of benefits – especially personal insurance with participating in the game or related activity. Affiliation is compulsory for all juniors to compete in the NR Junior tournaments and in the State and National Championships. Affiliation status will be checked prior to all 2020 season NR Junior tournaments and the Queensland Junior Championships.

Please note players living in Mackay, Townsville, Ingham and Cairns and all areas in between along the coast are not considered remote and do not qualify for the Remote Member Registration.

RANKINGS

The July 2019 Queensland junior rankings are available on the Q Squash webpage. These are the most recent QLD junior rankings. The next update will be October 2019, just in time for the Ingham Junior Tournament.

The State rankings and associated combined seedings will be relied upon by the NR tournament hosts to set draws. Timely appeals will be essential. The appeal process in the policy provides for an internal review (like the old policy to give the rankers a chance to affirm or change their mind), and if the appellant remains aggrieved by that review decision, the appeal must be decided by an independent decision maker.

FUNDING/GRANTS

The NR committee are considering using a professional Grant Writer. If you have any knowledge in this area or any contacts please contact me with details.

QLD Gambling Community Fund - \$7775 - NR are currently purchasing IT equipment to live stream. Thanks to Rhys Mountford-Jones who has volunteered his IT knowledge and skills and his time to purchase equipment and build a computer suitable to do this job.

Rhys has been so patient and more than understanding of my very limited knowledge about IT. It is intended live streaming of matches will take place at club fixtures, junior and open tournaments, PSA events, coaching clinics and any events to promote squash, sponsors and supporters.

The NR recently applied for the Qantas Regional Grant for financial and flight support for existing players, to encourage new participation and building the networks in the region beyond the current boundaries from Cairns to Mackay. I'll be sure to advise the outcome of this grant. Thanks also to President Dean Morzone and Treasurer Dan Ackroyd from Sportsworld Squash Club in Cairns who also made a submission for this funding.

SPORTYHQ

Squash Australia (SA) has advised SA will cover subscription cost for affiliated clubs. Please do not pay for any SportyHQ subscriptions prior to discussing your clubs status and encourage all your club members to pay their affiliations to take advantage of this. In regard to SportyHQ, SA announced a number of other improvements are coming to provide a better user experience and there will be 6 monthly updates.

NR VOLUNTEERS

As we move into the 2020 squash season, I start to think about the junior tournaments and this means lots of work. Our tournament standards have lifted over the past 2 years. We now have sponsors for each tournament, we sell tournament shirts and other merchandise to promote our sponsors, we have Saturday night NR sponsored dinners and SportyHQ is the official platform for managing the tournaments.

We need more people involved in the administration of our tournaments to increase our tournament standards and make the work load achievable. All volunteers will be welcomed. Let's remember the rest of QLD are watching the NR, so let's be great at everything we do in the NR.

If you would like to get involved with your local club or the NR, you have ideas to promote squash, can write grant applications or have fundraising ideas please get in touch with your club's committee or myself or Rob Fadaely and we will help you find your way.

COACHING

NR is currently experiencing limited coaching across the region outside of Cairns. Cairns is very fortunate to have coaches Marc Forster and Steve Finitsis. I wish we could clone both and pop them all over the NR. It is very unlikely quality coaches are going to move into the NR and offer



Has it been a dream come true? Yes, it has been one of my goals for a while now.

Once the dust settled what were your expectations before you left? I just wanted to play as well as I could over there as it was my first year and hopefully, I will have more to come.

2018 REDSTAR AWARDS



Our aim is to recognise as many NR juniors as we can with the **RedStar** Performance Recognition System. **Every placegetter** (1-2-3) will be recognised. Each winner of an aged event will be listed in the Achievement category and every player who finishes second or third will be listed in the Encouragement category.

Once a player has won an event they will be elevated and listed in the Achievement category even if they finish runner up or third in other events. If players are equal they will be listed in alphabetical order.

Players receive 3 points for winning a qualifier, 6 points for winning a Queensland State title and 9 points for winning a National title (AJO & AJC). Players will receive 2 points for finishing runner up in a qualifier, 4 points for runner up in a State final and 6 points for runner up in a National final. Players will receive 1 point for finishing third in a qualifier, 2 points for third in a State final and 3 points for third in a National event. U19 Players will also receive 1 bonus point for each result because they cannot enter 2 events.

Even though the Ingham qualifier was played in October 2018 it is still a 2019 qualifier so the results from that event will contribute to the **2019 NR Player of the Year Award.** A 2019 qualifier played in 2018 will not be included.

The player who accumulates the most points will be declared the Player of the Year. There will be joint winners if 2 players finish on the same number of points. The aim of the points system is to automate the selection and player results determine the outcome. The system is also designed to encourage players to support all events in their quest to accumulate points.

If an event is combined eg U17 and U19 Combined then it will be analysed to ensure points are allocated to both U17 and U19. A direct match up of the best two players in an age group will determine the winner of that age group. Otherwise the highest finishing position in an age group will receive the maximum points. **To be awarded points there must be at least two players competing in an age group.**

A player can only enter up to 2 events so they can only be rewarded with 2 results. An U9 player who might win a combined event eg **U9**, **U11 and U13 Combined** can only be rewarded for the U13 victory and their own age group U9 providing there are two U9 players competing. If there is only one player in U9 they will earn points for U13 only. If there was one player in U9 and one in U11 they will still only be rewarded for their efforts in U13.
