**Mike Cornish** together with **Nigel and Leanne French** managed the series and 4 years later we are bidding farewell (in some way) to that fantastic team. We all thank them sincerely.

Hopefully, 2020 will see a new team step up to manage the series which is vitally important for Country Squash and giving youngsters their first taste of playing tournaments.



November was a very busy month with what seemed endless meetings with Sportwest, DSR, Govt of WA and University of WA. It started with the Australian New Zealand Sports Law Association (ANZSLA) which was introduced by Lord Sebastian Coe and the 2 day conference was a fascinating insight into all the aspects of sports law.

Meetings with Sportwest launching Unisport Games 2020 and The Australian Masters Games in 2021, both major events in Perth with a big squash following. WA was represented at the Squash Australia AGM in late November but we were unable to vote as we haven't settled our membership disagreement with them yet but we are confident that things may change for the better with a new President being appointed and 3 board members being voted off. A very productive month all round.

In keeping with my previous "Dean's Diary" and sharing some thoughts and experiences as a touring squash professional, I thought I would relive the 1984 French Open sponsored by Guy La Roche (The Mens after shave, etc). Like all tournaments when the seedings came out we all wanted to be on the other side of the draw to Jahangir as he was in rampant form having gone about 2 and a half years unbeaten at that stage hardly, dropping any games. I was fortunate to be seeded 4 and was drawn against my old foe Hiddy Jahan (seeded 2) as this was one of the first events we used the random seeding style.

I had a great run through to the semi's where I had a fierce battle with Hiddy (who was after revenge from the "82 semi final in the World Open) and once again, I got the better of him in a very tight 4 games. Waiting for me was JK and it was scheduled for 11am on the sunday morning after getting off the court after midnight the night before and to say I was a bit knackered was an understatement.

I have highlighted this event because what was about to happen was briefly the shortest match ever played. JK was at his brilliant best and in no mood to have long rallies and with my fatigue he won the match 9/0, 9/0, 9/1 in 11 minutes (including the warm up) I would have been beaten 27-0 if the match referee hadn't awarded a stroke to me when it was clearly not ... so thanks!

The worst bit about this final was that the French people had just started getting into squash and they are always late attending sporting events and our match had finished when people were strolling in to see it. I'm sure the sponsors were not impressed but this is what it was like with JK ... he was ruthless and unforgiving.

Sue ran them through the principles of game based squash utilising the World Squash Federation tools.


On day 2, the participants delivered their session plans to juniors with varying abilities to mimic a junior club. This was valuable experience for the participants.

#### **2019 Mini Squash Visits with the Inflatable Squash Courts**



As 2019 comes to an end, I can finally look back on a year which saw my coaching activities shift back to a junior participation focus with the inflatable squash courts and running several junior programs across Perth.

A few years back as one of our regional development officers, there was quite a few kms covered across WA delivering school programs and assisting our regional clubs with their junior and club programs, so it was refreshing to get back into the school system, but without the 4+ hour drives!

This year saw a slight restructure to the funding received from Healthway's **SMARTER THAN SMOKING** which essentially allowed our coaches to provide the squash clinics to primary schools free of charge. Previously the biggest road block for metro visits was their budget, so any cost involved often meant a "no" unless they could source funding from sporting schools.

A number of junior programs benefited from the programs in their area, with juniors attending Mirrabooka, Cambridge, Subiaco Kings, Brentwood and Vic Park programs after the visit with the Inflatable Squash courts. In fact the numbers at Brentwood's program practically doubled within a couple of weeks at the start of term 4 to see a regular 40 juniors attending each week!

Overall I visited 21 schools with the inflatable courts, 19 through Healthway's and a further 2 with Sporting Schools program. Total number of students seen was roughly 5000 students for the year. Including other coaches and on court programs with various highschools and that figure is much higher.

Of course the first step is exposure. A number of these students when first asked never knew what squash was, now they do. The next step is to continue trying to capture more and more into our junior club programs.

Thank you to Healthway's for their continued support. It is great to hear funding is locked in for the next two years so we can continue the exposure effort all across WA to get more juniors playing squash!









The Manjimup Mozzies looked the goods at the final event in the South-West Grand Prix Series on Saturday the 23rd of November.

Dressed in their brand-new shirts, the team ran the tournament entirely using the SportyHQ software as well as supplying a buffet lunch of local produce, large enough to feed a small army.

The tournament was a great ending to the junior squash calendar of the year, with many tightly contested battles and questions asked of fitness and training regimes.

The first match played in the first round of Division 1 really set the scene for the whole tournament with the two eldest Marsh brothers, Daniel and Eric going to 4. All the games were separated by 2 points and it was great to see such a clash so early in the day.

Division one was eventually secured by local boy, Max



Forbes, who showed the local talent is as good as the local produce, defeating Daniel in 4 in the final. The speedy Aled Phillips Johns took home the plate.

Not to be outclassed by Division 1. the first-round match between Alexander Marsh and Harvey Pianta also went to five, with Alexander winning 12-10 in the 5th. This match had many long and quality rallies and it was great seeing the younger kids stepping up to the gauntlet. The winner of this division was Miles Heyward beating Isla McMullen in the final. The plate winner was Ashton Clements, who is appearing regularly on the tournament honours list.

Division 3 was a bit messed up, with only 3 players until late in the day, with reasons beyond ground control's control, leading to some late arrivals. oops! In



the end Tyler Stone was 1st, Charlie Richardson 2nd and Brock Kitchen 3rd.

Division 4 was a round-robin. with some new faces. Jason Tony-Homan won this division, with Michael Kilrain coming second and Ashton Shields finishing third.

As this was the last Grand Prix tournament for the year, the points each played earned from entering and competing in the South-west tournaments were counted and the results were announced. Isla McMullen being crowned the female winner, and young Charlie Richardson being crowned the male winner. Won't be long until Charlie has more bounty in the trophy cabinet than Dad Daniel.

Many, many thanks to the Manjimup team, including Franzine, Bec, the Forbe's and Whittaker's for such a well-run tournament.

Also thank-you to the French's and Mike Cornish, who it was great to see at this tournament, for their backing of this series.
