


I encourage as many NR players to compete in the 2015 Mackay Open to please do so. It is critical that this event is successful if it is to be maintained on the Calendar.



MACKAYOPENW5PREVIEW







Aussie **Sarah Cardwell** is the highest ranked female to enter the PSA W5 event.

The talented Victorian was runner up in the 2014 Mackay Open.

Cardwell is striving to win her second tour title and break into the World Top 50.

Her highest World ranking was #51 achieved in December 2012.

Cardwell is an ultra consistent performer and reaching the 2015 final is well within her grasp despite her immediate threats being ranked between #64 and #71.

Standing in her way is a host of players including #2 seed Vanessa Chu from Hong Kong, #3 seed Cheyna Tucker from South Africa and former Mackay Open champ Lisa Camilleri (seeded #4).

20 year old Chu (WN 64) has already won two tour titles this year. Her 3-2 win against Christine Nunn in the quarter finals of the Bendigo International was full of merit and suggests Chu is in form and will be a serious threat in this year's Open.

South African Tucker (WN 66) will be hoping to recapture the form that helped her reach the

final of the Tasmanian Open in July.

Back then Tucker beat Cardwell in four 7-11, 11-8, 15-13, 11-6 (55m) to reach the final.

Interestingly the top 7 players in this year's open have Top 100 World rankings. It will be highly competitive with all 7 players ranked from 61 to 86.

One player who is more than capable of upsetting the top 3 players is Lisa Camilleri.

The former WN 28 has the skill and experience to bounce back and win her first tournament for 2015.

Camilleri knows exactly what it takes to win a title in Mackay having won the Mackay Open on 5 previous occasions.

Keep a look out for rising star Lakeesha Rarere. Australia's best junior is beginning to make her mark on the senior tour and pushed Cardwell all the way in the South Australian Open in May.

Cardwell eventually won that battle 11-3, 9-11, 12-14, 11-5, 11-7 (51m) but Rarere has improved since then.

Recently, Rarere pushed Milou van der Heijden (2013 Mackay Open Runner Up) all the way in their quarter final match up at the NSW Open 6-11, 11-6, 8-11, 11-4, 11-9 (44m). Milou van der Heijden went on to win the title.





Innisfail's **Barry Hall**, has just returned from Perth, after playing in the Australian Masters Squash Championships, which were held from the 7th to 11th September.

There were over 500 entries for the Nationals which catered for players aged from 35 to 85.

Hall played in a round robin event of 6 players in the Open Division of the 70 - 74 age group in which he has finished third.

Hall began well winning his first two match ups 3-0 before it was time to take on the #1 seed.

The #1 seed was Mike McDonald from NSW. McDonald has won his age group 7 times so it wasn't going to be easy!

McDonald won the match 9-5, 10-8, 9-1 and the age group but Hall secured more points against McDonald than the runner up!

Hall's 4th round match was against the #2 seed Brian Lyons from Victoria. Lyons won 9-7, 8-10, 9-1, 9-2.

The 5th and final round was critical. Hall needed to win to secure 3rd place.

He was up against Ken Todd from WA. Hall began well winning the first two games

comfortably 9-4, 9-4 before Todd commenced a minor fight back.

Fortunately, Hall weathered the storm and emerged victorious in four 9-4, 9-4, 4-9, 9-7.

Hall commented, "Would have loved to be #1 but there's always next year when the tournament will be held in Darwin. Know how hard I have to train now for the 2016 championship.

However, I'm pretty happy to be #3 in my age bracket."

One of Hall's victories was against WA State Champion Jim Woodall who he beat 9-5, 9-6, 10-8.

There were 16 participants overall in the 70-74 age group including Divisions 2 and 3.

Congratulations Barry on a fantastic effort.

IMPROVEYOURGAME





Lisa Camilleri has put together a series of guides to help you improve your game. We will bring you a new guide each month.

Guide #1: Breaking down the swing of the **forehand drop shot**. Main things to think about:

Early racket preparation - open racket face - transfer body weight forward - stay balanced during impact with the ball - keep your wrist cocked - hips to stay square (no swivel just forward transfer) - racket does not finish behind your body just straight towards the front wall.

Hope this helps ... good luck!






REDSTARAWARDS



- 3. Dunlop Double Yellow Dot balls will be used for the event
- 4. All matches will be PAR11 best of 5 games
- 5. Players to mark/referee the match immediately following their own
- 6. All junior players (19) and below must wear protective eyewear
- 7. Some billets MAY be provided
- 8. The Tournament Director's decisions are final.
- 9. The TD has the right to:
