67 Players from the Southwest and Perth participated in the 35th SW Squash Masters Teams event held this year at the South West Sports Centre in Bunbury over the long weekend in March with 5 Divisions with ages ranging from 35 to over 80 years.

The Busselton Club ran the tournament while the Bunbury Club supplied the courts, ran the bar and dinner. This is the biggest Masters Squash event outside of Perth and one of the longest running. Busselton was able to have representatives in all 5 divisions. 14 Busselton players entered over the weekend in 7 different teams with one Busselton player being in a winning team and one runner up in their division.


The coveted Div 1 shield was taken out by the "Bunbury Defenders" team (Sean Brockman (from Busselton), Brad Grinter and Luke Mattaboni) defeating team Maddington (Baz Kucklekorn, Craig Evans and Rob Kiely). Bunbury has now won the converted Div 1 title in 2014, 2016, 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021.

Because there was only 2 Div One teams nominated, the Div 1 teams played the Div 2 teams as well. In the final Busselton's Sean Brockman won 3/0 in a match of brutal force with many power drives and cross courts shots in his match against Baz. Brad Grinter won with some extraordinary retrieving against his Perth opponent Craig 2/1, and at position 3 Luke lost 1/2 in a tight match with the overall team result 6/3.

Div 2 was taken out by the undefeated **Bunbury Horribles** team (Eamon Horrobin,

Busselton's team "Coxless Wonders" (Gys Van Zyl, Warren Oliver and Phil Cox) came 3rd. Phil also won all his matches Bunbury has now won this division in 5 out of the past 6 years.

Div 3 final saw team Bunbury's "Kelvins Killers" team (Ken Doble, Mike Genders and Kelvin Carmichael) go thru the weekend undefeated, with Perth's "Husband and 2 Wives" coming in position 2 with 4 out of 5 wins. Div 5 saw team "Rays Raiders" team (Ken Risden, Ray Edkins and Peter Rinaldi) defeat the SW team "Paynefell" (Andy Fell, Judy Hughes and Busselton's Polly Payne) 6/3 even thou the Paynefell team went thru the qualifying round undefeated but with one player short in the final they were up against it from the start. "The Blood Rule"

This month we take a look at the BLOOD rule which places the onus on the Referee to decide the type and outcome.

From the rules:

14 ILLNESS, INJURY AND BLEEDING 14.4 Bleeding

14.4.1 Whenever bleeding occurs, play must stop and the player must leave the court and attend to the bleeding promptly. Reasonable time for treatment is allowed. Play may resume only after the bleeding has stopped and, where possible, the wound has been covered.

Comment: The onus is on the Referee to stop play immediately there is a sign of blood no matter how small the blood flow is. Reasonable time is determined by the Referee. This rule is unclear whether the time limits relating to Self Inflicted injuries (14.3.1) or Contributed injuries (14.3.2 and 14.3.3.1) apply to bleeding.

- 14.4.2 If the bleeding was accidentally caused by the opponent, then Rule 15 (Conduct) must be applied.
- 14.4.3 If the bleeding is the result of the opponent's deliberate or dangerous play or action, the match is awarded to the injured player.
- 14.4.4 A player who is unable to stop the bleeding within the time permitted must either concede 1 game and take the 90-second interval and then continue play, or concede the match. Comment: Time permitted is the reasonable time as determined by the Referee. There are no guidelines to what a reasonable time is but I would suggest that perhaps the 15 minute period as for a Contributed Injury be applied.
- 14.4.5 If blood is again visible during play, no further recovery time is permitted, and the player must concede the game in progress and use the 90-second interval between games for further treatment. If the bleeding has not then stopped, the player must concede the match.

 Comment: Time restriction now introduced.
- 14.4.6 The court must be cleaned and bloodstained clothing replaced.

 Comment: Clothing includes shoes and socks! Don't forget to check the racket as well.
- 14.5 An injured player may resume play before the end of any permitted recovery-period. Both players must be given reasonable time to prepare to resume play.

 Comment: Reasonable time is again determined by the Referee. This usually is to warm the ball up but time may be allowed for stretching etc.
- 14.6 It is always the injured player's decision whether or not to resume play.

In all cases of injury where the player has required time to recover the Referee must ask the injured player if they are able to continue. The player makes the decision to continue not the Referee.

The Referee makes his final decision based on the players decision to continue or not.






2021 Australian Masters Games entries now open! 9-16 October, 2021
