It got easier as the years went by as I had a base in London and in Zurich so mail was collected and it was not as stressful. Anyway I digress.

One of the most interesting years was 1983 and until now I have never really told this story as it is still quite painful to re tell it. The year started great as I had just finished 1982 with a bang as I was seeded number 2 in the world after being runner-up in the World Open. Apart from Jahangir Khan, of course, the only other player that I had a lot of problems with was the little

Egyptian Gamal Awad.


I played Gamal in the semis of the Chichester and led 2-0 but poor tactics saw me lose in the 5th after 2 hours on the clock. The British Open followed and once again I went down to Gamal in the semis, this time 3-0.

Fast forward to mid year when I was back in Perth briefly and training hard and I was doing some clinics for Swan Brewery who were a sponsor when I had a car accident which saw me out of action for awhile. I have the photos still of my RX7 Mazda which I wont post as its pretty bad.

The problem I had was that I was due to fly to South Africa to defend my SA Open and Owen Emslie was not happy that I had to withdraw at this late stage but I had no choice as the Australian Open was on soon and the Aussie team was being picked for the World Teams in NZ

and I had to get right.

The two major problems I had from my accident was my right knee which had to undergo many arthroscopic "clean ups" (thanks to the legendary orthopaedic surgeon Tim Keenan) and my clavicle which was causing me grief when running. I slowly came good and played in the Aussie Open still not 100% but I had to show I was playing and that I was still on track for the World's.



I made the semis but I was struggling against Chris Dittmar and Ross Thorne. The team was picked and I convinced the selectors that I would be 100% by the start of the teams event and I was, but sadly, I had to withdraw from the individual where I was seeded #3.

Australia had a very strong team with Dittmar, Thorne, Ricki Hill and myself. We won a bronze medal just going down to England who had announced quite controversially that Hiddy Jahan would play for England.



Pakistan won the title quite easily with Jahangir, Zaman and Maqsood. We beat Egypt to take the bronze.

The highlight for me was when we played the Kiwi's and with Ross Norman and Stu Davenport the local team had high hopes of upsetting us in the quarter finals. We were 1-1 all as I took on Davenport the Kiwi #1 and in a very fiery match with a lot of controversial reffing decisions I got him in the fifth much to the local crowds dismay.

It is still the only match I have ever played where I was hit deliberately by another player and I decided to retaliate which caused this huge controversy. Great memories of playing for your country which I did again 1985 in Egypt.

This event was the last of the ISRF World "Amateur" Titles which was causing great confusion as in 1981 all the Pro's had boycotted it. Luckily Jahangir not only won this one but he also won the 1983 World Open played in Munich to avoid confusion, so once again squash was still struggling with its identity as the power struggles with ISPA and the ISRF played out.



After NZ we played many big events in Europe, and none was bigger than The Swiss Masters where the top 8 players in the world play. By then my knee was OK and I reached the final against Jahangir to finish off a very strange year!

A TRAVEL NIGHTMARE!

From Kalgoorlie to the Geraldton Open

This is the story of how it cost me nearly \$1,000 to travel to and from Kalgoorlie to the Geraldton Open and the headache that went with it!

Deciding to forego the 8 hour drive, I booked connecting flights from Kalgoorlie through Perth and up to Geraldton. This wasn't too expensive as I could get Qantas flights on the way to Geraldton using points and just had to take Virgin on the way back.

This is where the issues began. My flight from Kalgoorlie to Perth was supposed to leave at 8am so I could catch the connecting flight to Geraldton at 4:00pm. I went to the airport, however, the staff let me know that the flight is running late and will be taking off at 9:30am. Deciding its not worth going home I stayed. 9:30 came around and an announcement was made that the flight is now delayed further to 12:30pm ... with no way to get home I stick around at the airport.

Eventually we see the plane land in Kalgoorlie at 12:00pm and I go through security. 12:30pm comes around but there is another technical difficulty with the plane, and they delay departure further to 2:30pm.

At 2:30pm the staff make an announcement that the flight is delayed until 6:00pm. Meaning I won't get to Perth in time for my flight to Geraldton. Qantas re-book my connecting flight to Saturday morning at 7:00am. Finally, I board the 6:00pm flight after spending 11 hours at the airport realising if I drove I would have got to Geraldton 3 hours ago!

The next morning, I book an Uber at 6:00am and get to the airport, fortunately no more delays. However, I get an alert from Virgin that my flight on Sunday has been moved to Monday which means I also wont make my return flight from Perth to Kalgoorlie on Qantas.

I landed in Geraldton at 8:30am and after some waiting, I finally get a taxi and get to the courts. This is when I ran into my next issue. I went to use Apple pay to pay for the taxi, but the transaction declined. I look at my account and \$250 has been spent on my card at an IGA in Perth an hour ago. My whole wallet had been stolen.

Needing to get to the courts to play my game, I transfer some money into my other card on my phone and pay for the taxi.

I was unable to get a lift from Geraldton to Perth in time for my flight to Kalgoorlie at 5:30pm since the finals started at 12:00pm so I booked a bus ticket. It left Geraldton at 9:30am and was expected to arrive in Perth at 4:00pm. I thought that was plenty of time to get to the airport by 5:30pm.

I rescheduled for 8:30am and I got to the bus still sweating as I didn't have time to shower. The bus left Geraldton and everything was going smoothly. I continuously checked my phone to make sure the bus was on time which was going well until the bus pulled over for lunch.

By the time we took off again google maps said that we would get to Perth by 4:45pm. I was confident this would still be enough time to get to the Airport.

I messaged my dad and asked him to pick me up from the bus station. Unfortunately, with some more delays the bus pulled into East Perth Terminal at 5:00pm. I run off the bus, grab my bag and quickly get in dad's car. We speed to the airport and while in the car I'm taking anything out of my bag that would get picked up at security.

I sprint up to security, throw my bag through the X-ray and continue running towards the gate. I finally get to the gate ... just as the plane is reversing away.

Dad came back to pick me up and finally with no other option I pay for a flight back to Kalgoorlie for the following morning. **What a nightmare!**



ERIN'S EXCELLENT EFFORT

City Tattersalls Australian National Championships

Recently I travelled to Sydney to play in the Australian National Championships from 17-20 June. It was my first time stepping onto the national senior stage and I had a great experience playing against some of Australia's top ranked women.

In my first round, I played against the fifth seed Collette Sultana from QLD. Went into the match feeling confident in my abilities and told myself that I had nothing to lose. I came back in the first game from a big deficit to win 18-16. I then took a 2-1 lead in games and was 7-4 up in the fourth game. As the game went on, I began to lose my rhythm and Collette came back at me evening up at 9-9. She eventually won the fourth game 11-9.

As I turned around to walk off the court to prepare for the fifth game, Collette unfortunately had to forfeit as she had hurt her calf. It was a strange way to win the match but I was happy to have the chance to play in the quarter finals. I ended up winning 18-16, 3-11, 11-6, 9-11, 11-0 (Opponent Retired) in 43 minutes.





In my second match, I was up against NSW's Tamika Hunt, the second seed and eventual champion. There was no doubt that this match was going to be really challenging but I was looking forward to the experience. I lost to Tamika 3-0 but I thought I played well.

Tamika played very aggressively, hitting the ball hard and fast and cutting balls off quickly across the tee. I felt like I was continually stuck in the back corners while she was dictating play on the Tee. I tried to combat against it by lifting the ball high over Tamika's head but as the game went on, I lost my nerve a little bit as I hit occasional silly errors.

Tamika proved too tough on the day but I was happy with staying in rallies and making her work hard for her win. She ended up winning the match 11-5, 11-4 in 21 minutes.

Overall, I learnt a lot from both my matches and I have realised that I'm not too far away from beating the top Australian players. I just need more experience playing at this level and need to keep going with my training schedule and hard work ethic back at home with my team.

The 2021 South West Open was held in Bunbury at the South West Sports Centre on the 25-27th of June and hosted by the Bunbury Squash Club.

It was the tournaments 40th year, and the Club was inundated with registrations which led to entrants needing to be capped at 128 players. The players were split into 13 divisions, including seven men's divisions, five ladies divisions and one junior division.

The Men's Open, as usual, was a battle of experience vs youth, with Mike Corren taking on Oscar Curtis. An enthralling 1st game saw youth come out on top with Curtis taking the game 11-9 in just under 12 minutes.

The 2nd game was just as tight with Curtis playing inspired squash to reach 10 first. A hush came over the crowd as everyone contemplated if this was going to be the day that youth finally defeated experience. Mike "the Moose" Corren dug deep and after a breathtaking 18 minutes of intense rallies, won the 2nd game 15-13 to square it up.

The 3rd game saw a similar pattern emerge with Curtis breaking away and being 10-9 up before Corren, using all his patience and experience, clawed his way back to take the game 12-10.

In the 4th, Curtis gave his all before the experience of Corren shone through, with Corren taking out the 4th game 11-6 and winning the match 9-11, 15-13, 12-10, 11-6 (54 minutes).

The Women's Open was a battle between Erin Classen and Joannah Yue. Classen got off to a quick 6-0 start before Yue found a way back into the game to force deuce and take the game 12-10 in just over 8 minutes.

The 2nd game saw Classen regroup and take her first game,

The 4th game began with Classen dominating and getting to a commanding 10-5 lead, eventually taking out the game 11-7. A great final to end the weekend with Classen victorious after 4 games (10-12, 11-5, 11-9, 11-7) in 38 minutes.

The junior division was taken out by Andreas Christou, who defeated Tyler Stone 3-1 (8-11, 11-9, 11-8, 13-11) in 22 minutes. Christou and Stone showcased a superb level of skill and showed that the future generations of squash are going to be a handful in the coming years!

Overall, the tournament was a huge success with an awesome atmosphere complementing great games of squash played throughout the divisions. Congratulations to all the division winners and well done to all players who played in good spirit.

"Blood Rule Part 2"

Reasonable Time Periods

Throughout the rules there are references to "Reasonable" or "Unreasonable".

"Reasonable" or "Unreasonable" is in the eye of the match referee controlling the particular match in which the following instances may occur and will vary from referee to referee.

Given this, the overriding factor has to be "commonsense" in each particular situation.

Remember as the match referee you have a duty of care to the players in all these matters.

Warm-Up

The players must have equal opportunities to strike the ball. A player retaining control of the ball for an *unreasonable* time is warming up unfairly and Rule 15 (Conduct) must be applied.

Interference

After completing a reasonable follow-through ...

Racket swing

A **reasonable** swing comprises a **reasonable** backswing, a strike at the ball and a **reasonable** follow-through. The striker's backswing and follow-through are **reasonable** as long as they do not extend more than is necessary.

Blood Injury – Contributed

Where the Blood Injury is caused by both players' actions, the injured player has *reasonable* time to stem the flow of blood and cover the bleeding. *Reasonable* time is determined by the referee, who can be assisted by the on-site personnel, if available.

If the same Blood injury reoccurs, through no fault of either player or by both players' actions, the injured player shall have further *reasonable* time to address the Blood Injury. If the injured player cannot resume play within the *reasonable* time or extended periods allowed the Referee will award the match to the injured players opponent.


Blood Injury – Opponent Inflicted

Where the Blood Injury is caused by the opponent's accidental action, the injured player has **reasonable** time to stem the flow of blood and cover the bleeding. **Reasonable** time is determined by the referee, who can be assisted by the on-site personnel, if available. If the injured player cannot resume play within the **reasonable** time allowed, the Referee will award the match to the injured player.

If the same Blood injury reoccurs, through no fault of either player or by both players' actions, the injured player shall have further *reasonable* time to address the Blood Injury. If the blood flow cannot be stopped in a *reasonable* time the referee will award the match to the injured player.

If the same Blood injury reoccurs, due to an action solely by the injured player, the player shall have no further time to address the Blood Injury and must concede the game and take the game interval, if available, for further recovery. If the injured player cannot then resume play within the *reasonable* time or extended periods allowed the Referee will award the match to the injured players opponent.





JUNIOR SQUASH-A-THON 2021

A squash-a-thon is where a squash ball must be in continuous play on a minimum of one court for 24 hours straight.
