
NEW DATES for the WA State Junior Championships NEW VENUE is ... **Belmont Squash Centre**

Once again, the dreaded COVID hit us again and this time the casualty was the Junior State Championships scheduled for the 3rd and 4th of July. We had 3 different types of lockdowns which made for confusing messages from the Government which of course led to confusion for court owners, recreation centres, private clubs and of course the players. With new Government rules on whether a mask needs to be worn whilst doing vigorous exercise indoors it just added to a lot of mixed messages.

I feel for some Junior athletes who were age eligible on July 4th but may not be when we find new dates to hold the **State Junior Championships** and this also goes for the **National AJC titles** to be held on September 25th, if NSW stays in lockdown a new date will be announced on September 1st and this may lead to a few juniors being unable to play for their state and to play in their last individual titles. It is certainly a tough time for those 18-year-olds and that is why WA Squash is staging the first Under 23 State titles to be played on the 3rd and 4th of September at Belmont Squash Centre.

The **State Zone Teams event** also had to be postponed and a new date is challenging as it really has to be in school holidays so as all competitors from WA have the chance to play.

The **WA Masters State Titles** were held at Belmont over 3 days from 23rd-25th of July and whilst the Men's entry was quite evenly spread over all age groups, sadly some of the ladies age groups had to be amalgamated and quite a few Champions were crowned without anyone else in their age group. Somehow, we need to attract the ladies to play as we know we have many players who could qualify but just need them to want to enter.

The Grand Final of the **Men's State Grade Pennant Competition** was played at Belmont Squash on Thursday the 29th of July and it was a great tussle between Mirrabooka 1 and Belmont which saw Mirrabooka 1 win the night on games after being 2 matches all.

Will Curtis def Remi Young 3-0, Glenn Hitch def Mitch Van Heythusen 3-1, Greg Laurence lost to Mark Ardley 1-3 and Chris Chan lost to Pascale Louka 2-3. 2 Matches all, 9 games to 7 .Great final all round and a big thanks to Belmont Squash centre for organising an amazing supper and to Luke Jamieson for reffing all night.

To continue my theme when I was a touring squash professional a couple of rule changes whilst on tour occurred whilst playing due to players exploiting the rules which wasn't really in the spirit of the game but as the matches were long and brutal you had to seek out anything that might give you a legal edge.



One of these was the elimination of the two serves due to players using the first serve as a time waster and purposefully playing a fault which the other player couldn't reach which gave you a breather. So instead of using the first serve to try and ace your opponent it was used as a shot to get an extra 30 seconds rest.

I used this to great effect many times when playing some players who were just runners and when on hot bouncy courts it was difficult to kill the ball I needed a few rests so I would (on purpose) serve it down the wall on my side of the court or play a soft shot across court. You had to make it impossible for your opponent to play it because the rules said that a fault could be played if the player chose to play it !!

Another one was a separate warm up which I used to my advantage in a semi final of the South African Amateur Championship in Jo'Burg in 1977 when I was playing a chap from England, John Richardson, who was not the most pleasant of players on tour and I was not favoured to beat him but I thought if I could get him riled up and lose his focus I might stand a chance. So as we entered the court I tossed the racket which he thought was for the serve but I said you can hit first and I left the court.

Well, all hell broke loose as he was arguing with the ref and he had no idea what to do. I went to an outside court and warmed up. I came back when I was called up for my turn to warm up and as John left the court saying a few obscenities to me I said to him I was ready to play. I won the first two games easily as he spent most of the time trying to hit me and abuse me.

The third was tight and being at altitude I was not as fit as him but it was close so I used my last trick to get some time and pulled out my handkerchief which had a few cents in it and they spilled all over the floor which took us some time to pick up. By this time the spectators were in fits of laughter as John was getting so upset. I fell over the line 10-9 to take it 3-0.

Needless to say the rest of our tour was a bit testy as they elevated me to number one in the rebel tour team to take on the Springboks in a tour I will never forget as we travelled all over South Africa and then Rhodesia playing test matches, tournaments, exhibitions and clinics. After all these sort of time wasting opportunities were in the rules, but then the ISRF changed many rules after that and closed so many loopholes. It pays to know the rules. Great times !!


Teams were very even, with quite a few matches won by one point.





"Time Periods"

There are definite time periods allocated for the various phases of a squash game and it is the responsibility of the Referee to ensure that they are adhered to and of the penalties that are associated with non-compliance.

Warm-Up

At the start of a match the players go on court together to warm up the ball for a maximum of 4 minutes. After 2 minutes

the players must change sides, unless they have already done so.

Already the Referee is involved.

Between the Warm-up and Start of Play

A maximum of 90 seconds is permitted between the end of the warm-up and the start of play.

Between Games

A maximum of 90 seconds is permitted between each game.

Change of Equipment

A maximum of 90 seconds is permitted to change damaged equipment. This includes glasses, protective eyewear or a dislodged contact lens. The player must complete the change as quickly as possible, or Rule 15 (Conduct) must be applied.

Injury or Bleeding

Intervals in the case of injury or bleeding are specified in Rule 14 (Injury).

The time periods allowed for Injury or Bleeding have been dealt with in previous articles.

Players Rights and Responsibilities

Players must be ready to resume play at the end of any interval, but play may resume earlier if both agree.

During any interval either player may strike the ball.







"Time Periods"

Referees Responsibilities

The Referees responsibilities in relation to time:

• may award the match to a player whose opponent is not on court ready to play within the time stated in the competition rules.

• must enforce all the Rules relating to time, announcing "15

seconds," "Half-time" and "Time," as appropriate.

Note: It is the players' responsibility to be close enough to hear these announcements.

Conduct Penalties for Time Violations

The Referee must apply the following penalties in relation to a player or players for being late back on court

A player guilty of an offence may be given a Conduct Warning or penalised with a Conduct Stroke, a Conduct Game, or a Conduct Match, depending on the severity of the offence.

The Referee may impose more than one warning, stroke or game to a player for a subsequent similar offence, providing any such penalty may not be less severe than the previous penalty for the same offence.

A warning or a penalty may be imposed by the Referee at any time, including during the warmup and following the conclusion of the match.

My experience is that once a warning is given for being late back on court the offending player is usually back early next time.

Why do we ensure that the time periods are adhered to?

The Referee is to there to make sure a fair outcome to the match is achieved in accordance with the rules not only for interference and behavior but also that one player does not gain an advantage by delaying play.






