August was a very busy month with many tournaments and Pennants and Leagues all coming into finals in early September.

The month started with the final day of FeNaCING in Dampier which we managed to cover in the last SWAN.

The Cambridge Open was played on the 6th and 7th of August and this event continues to be a highlight on the Calendar with entries capped at 96. At the finals presentation we celebrated the 60th anniversary of this amazing centre and there is a full report on this and the event in this edition of the SWAN.

The week following was the start of the **TOP 8 SHOOTOUT** for the Men's (Sponsored by Security Distributors Australia) and the Ladies (Sponsored by Shark Lake Piggery Esperance) which was held at Mirrabooka on the 13th and 14th with the round robin pools to decide the top 4 for the semis and the 5-8 positions as well.

The following week on the Saturday the 21st we saw the semis and the finals. In a crisscross format the number ones in their pools played the number 2 's and the winners played off in the final as did positions 3/4, 5/6, 7/8. This is a new concept and a lot of great things are being worked on for the current year. A full report with all the results is in this edition.

On Tuesday the 17th I was invited to talk (via Zoom) to the 9 Regional Officers about what squash can do in their regions and hopefully access the ARC funding so as WA squash can visit the clubs when an event is on and promote the sport into schools as well as support the clubs in coaching and reffing. Some clubs are already accessing this grant but not all so it was fantastic to get the feedback from these officers and get squash on their radar for future promotions.

As I'm writing this we are well under way with the 3rd Beerfarm Leschenault Classic which was capped at 72 players and is now one of the go to events held in WA. Its a team-based event and whilst very competitive is a great social event too.

WA Squash (and Squash in general throughout Australia) is well aware of the drop off we have when players turn 19 and are out of Juniors. To try and slowdown that decrease WA squash decided to try and instigate an Under 23 State Championship which was to run over 2 days on Sept 3 and 4. Sadly, this will be postponed until later in the year as not enough entries were received to guarantee players 3 matches. We won't stop trying to encourage players to transition through those years after juniors but we do need this to succeed as we have plans in place to send an under 23 team away (if we can of course) and help with this period of time so



as to keep these talented players in the game.

In days gone past Australia had Under 23 Australian representative teams travel oversees to play Test matches and to compete in major events. Bob Meuleman (4 Times WA Open Champ) and Steve Wall (one WA Open) were official Australian players in touring under 23 teams from WA and in a time when Australia was dominating the world scene it was so important to have players in this under 23 bracket who then gained experience and fitness to compete at the highest level. This in turn made Australia even stronger.


Whilst on this theme, after the presentations of the Top 8 Shootout, the Mirrabooka club had some old vision of the 1988 WA Open held at Curtin Uni courts where WA Squash Headquarters were for 20 years and arguably the best squash court for viewing and playing anywhere in the world.

I had not seen this match when I played Chris Dittmar in the final. It brought back so many memories. I get asked a lot about squash and how tough it was in the seventies and eighties and all I can say is that to win any event in Australia you had to beat at least 3 players in the top 10 in the world in every tournament.


This WA Open was no exception with Rodney Eyles and Chris Dittmar in it. Chris had just been R/U to Jahangir in the World Open and was ranked 2 in the world and it was great to still be able to compete as I took the first game whilst the legs were still OK but it was downhill after that. I had retired from playing on the tour and had no world ranking as Pam and I had our first child in 1985, second one in 1986 and the third in 1988.

To win an Australian open was even harder as Geoff Hunt dominated from 1967 to 1981. I was runner up 3 times in the Aussie Open (1980, 81 and 82) twice to Geoff and the third time to Jahangir. This trend continued for many years with Rod Martin, Chris Dittmar and then Rod Eyles. So to win an Aussie Open you had to be basically number one in the world, to win any State open you had to be in the top 6 in the world. Tough days!!

All this tough competition was brought about by fierce interstate rivalry at the Australian Squash Championships once a year which brought the best players together in juniors as well. If only we could re instate this event and start again with some help from Squash Australia, I'm convinced that Australia could once again be a force to reckon with, maybe in 10 years, but if we don't start now it will be longer.

Dave Morrison was from Perth and in the seventies played in many state teams. Reaching the WA Open Final in 1976 was the highlight of his career.


A real student of the game and with the help of Nigel Champion they produced many coaching books which are still used to this day.

Thank You Dean Williams

On the 14th of August 1961 the Cambridge Squash Academy was opened to great fanfare and little did anybody realise what an iconic squash centre it would turn out to be.

Rod and Ailsa O'Shannassey instigated the syndicate which established the courts in a way that no other centre could do. Major shareholders either bought shares or donated their trades for shares and hence started a wonderful family of squashies. All the wives were expected to do a shift and therefore no wages were paid for many years as the centre built up and became the most popular place to play squash in Perth.

Two more courts were added on a few years later to make 6 and by the mid 1960's the Club was formed and competitions were started with a few other centres that had been built by private enterprises. My Father, Harley Williams, wired up Cambridge and was given shares in the company much to Mums angst as they had 2 small kids and Dad was establishing Williams Electrical Service but as time went on they knew it was a very good investment.

The early rivalry between Cambridge and Oxford Squash Academy remained for decades as youngsters like me played against family members of other courts. The majority of good players were owners' sons and daughters as to play a lot was expensive but being a shareholder, it was free.

Just to name a few players who were owners /operators from other centres and who won multiple State Open and Junior titles were: Lorraine Collins, Joc O'Shannassey, Shelley Williams, Dean Williams, Barbara Wall, Steven Wall, Alan Wall, Bob Meuleman, John Meuleman, John Nankivell, Kevin Andrews, Ian Marshall, Barry Osboine, Ron Jacques, Rod Hughes, Steve Durbridge and many more.

Cambridge produced and is still producing so many Champions and over the many years we have seen Chris Van Nierop, Lorraine Collins, Dean Williams and Sue Hillier (nee Carter) come through and play for Australia.

I remember as a 5 year old going to the courts and being put in the creche as people played but every so often we were allowed on to the courts and I used to love belting that ball so hard against the wall. It was also very handy to have right opposite the centre an RSL Hall with parking for about 100 cars and it wasn't til quite late into the eighties that units were built and parking became a bit of an issue.





As time went on most original investors sold out and at the end in 1978 there were The O'Shannasseys, Williams, Robinsons, Mapps, Tom Dadour, Hawkins family and Collins' left. The Centre was sold to Bill Lawton and then after quite a few owners/operators who have run the centre to this day, I think everyone would agree, that with Kane and Simmo and with the Gow Family as owners the Centre looks like it will keep going for many years .

It is always a threat though when we have privately owned centres as we are in the hands of those owners to not change the usage and redevelop ... lets hope and pray that this iconic centre can remain for another 60 years .

It's a great format with 12 divisions of 8 players playing one match on Friday night and 2 matches on the Saturday. Everyone gets 3 matches for their entry fee which is great value especially if you come 1st or 2nd or win the plate.

Kane Fasolo and his team do an exceptional job and it runs like a Swiss clock . This year saw the 60th Anniversary of the Cambridge Club and after the presentations a few words were spoken on how this club was started and its history.

The next morning Tim had to front up and play Mike Corren in the semi final and this was a little tough as he hadn't recovered from the night before and Mike won 3-0. The other semi final saw a great battle between Dave Ilich and Will Curtis with both players getting a little hot and bothered with some very close calls and in the end Will was too strong and won 11-9, 15-13, 11-8.

The Men's final saw a very unexpected result. Mike Corren simply had no answers to Will's relentless pressure and without taking anything away from Will's win, the word on the street was that the 14 day quarantine that Mike had to undergo as a result of going to South Australia took its toll and his usual fine touch and pin point length was not there and Will ran away an easy winner 11-3, 11-7, 11-2.

This was the first time Mike has been beaten in Perth for about 5 years. The 5v6 playoff produced a great game between Remi Young and Dylan Classen and it went down to the wire with Remi winning 11-6, 4-11, 11-9, 6-11, 11-8 in 51 minutes. Dave Ilich grabbed 3rd spot with a fine win over Tim Cowell 11-6, 11-2, 13-11.

In a first in Perth, players paid an extra \$5 per entry so as to have paid independent refs for each match and this was accepted very well.

Congratulations to the Cambridge Centre for hosting a wonderful event and we look forward to the next 60 years at Cambridge .

"Time Periods"

Time Periods

There are definite time periods allocated for the various phases of a squash game and it is the responsibility of the Referee to ensure that they are adhered to and of the penalties that are associated with non-compliance.

Warm-Up

At the start of a match the players go on court together to warm up the ball for a maximum of 4 minutes. After 2 minutes the

players **must** change sides, unless they have already done so.

Already the Referee is involved.

Between the Warm-up and Start of Play

A maximum of 90 seconds is permitted between the end of the warm-up and the start of play.

Between Games

A maximum of 90 seconds is permitted between each game.

Change of Equipment

A maximum of 90 seconds is permitted to change damaged

equipment. This includes glasses, protective eyewear or a dislodged contact lens. The player must complete the change as quickly as possible, or Rule 15 (Conduct) must be applied.

Injury or Bleeding

Intervals in the case of injury or bleeding are specified in Rule 14 (Injury).

The time periods allowed for Injury or Bleeding have been dealt with in previous articles.

Players Rights and Responsibilities

Players <u>must</u> be ready to resume play at the end of any interval, but play may resume earlier if both agree.

During any interval either player **may** strike the ball.

Referees Responsibilities

The Referees responsibilities in relation to time:

> may award the match to a player whose opponent is not on court ready to play within the time stated in the competition rules.







"Time Periods"

> must enforce all the Rules relating to time, announcing "15 seconds," "Half-time" and "Time," as appropriate.

Note: It is the players' responsibility to be close enough to hear these announcements.

Conduct Penalties for Time Violations

The Referee **must** apply the following penalties in relation to a player or players for being late back on court

A player guilty of an offence **may** be given a Conduct Warning or penalised with a Conduct Stroke, a Conduct Game, or a Conduct Match, depending on the severity of the offence.

The Referee **may** impose more than one warning, stroke or game to a player for a subsequent similar offence, providing any such penalty may not be less severe than the previous penalty for the same offence.

A warning or a penalty may be imposed by the Referee at any time, including during the warm-up and following the conclusion of the match.

My experience is that once a warning is given for being late back on court the offending player is usually back early next time.

Why do we ensure that the time periods are adhered to?

The Referee is to there to make sure a fair outcome to the match is achieved in accordance with the rules not only for interference and behavior but also that one player does not gain an advantage by delaying play.

The 2021 Top 8 Shootout

The final 8 threw up some interesting stats with some of the best players in the state missing out as a result of not having played enough events to make the top 8.

Once the Top 8 had been established 2 pools of 4 were drawn randomly and each pool then had 1-4 placings. The top 2 in each pool played off in the semis and the bottom 2 played off for the 5-8 positions.



With \$1,000 up for grabs as first prize the competition was hot and fiercely contested.

The first round robin matches saw a huge upset when young Oscar Curtis defeated Mike Corren in the fifth to secure top spot in Pool A.

In Pool B Dave Ilich claimed top spot by going undefeated, Remi Young came second as did Mike Corren in his pool. Sadly, after the weekend we had both Mike Corren and Dylan Classen withdraw. That meant we had to ask the 9th placed person on the list in Dan Jones to fill the void and he accepted. The next two players in line were Will Curtis and Heddwyn Brahma but both couldn't play so young Dan Marsh filled in and played very well.

The finals day saw some great squash with the highlight being an amazing semi-final match between Jo Hitch and Pascale Louka where Pascale led 2-0, both games 13-11, before Jo came back in the third to win 12-10,4th 11-7 and in a wonderful 5th game took the decider 11-9.In the Men's Lewis Christie nearly caused a big upset but going down eventually 11-8 in the fifth to Dave Ilich.

The finals of all the placings were fantastic with Erin too strong for Jo in the Ladies and Oscar had too many answers for Dave Ilich to take the Men's title out.

The next Top 8 Shootout is already underway with the first event being played with the Cambridge Open and its expected that WA Squash will extend the Top 8 to Divisions 1 and 2 for Men's and to Division 1 as well for the Ladies. Points will be updated monthly in The SWAN .






SPRING DAY LEAGUE 2021

Australian Masters Games >>> Postponed

As we manage to see live finals football here in the west, unfortunately the same can't be said for the Australian Masters Games. Because of ongoing issues stemming from the COVID-19 situation, the decision has been taken to postpone the games. **They were due to take place from the 9-16 September 2021, they will now take place from the 23-30 April 2022.**

The Australian Masters Games team remains excited to bring the games to Western Australia, and will work to refund those who can no longer participate in the games due to the changed dates. While this is no doubt disappointing for many, particularly for those of you who entered when the clash with the National Masters Championships in Adelaide was no longer an issue, the safety of the Australian community is foremost behind this decision.

Rapid Fire Squash

In light of the cancellation of the National Masters Squash Championships, the Masters Squash Committee has decided to add some extra events to keep Masters players on their toes and out of trouble ... well, on their toes anyway. See below for how the idea of a 'quickfire' tournament developed, came to be, and played out.

Your Masters Committee President explains:

Recently we decided to run a tournament with a difference. We called it Rapid Fire Squash and it was held at Mirrabooka Squashworld on Sunday 29th August.

The idea was to create a format that lets players compete against a number of different people over a short space of time. What we came up with is, 6 players per division, and all players in the division play each other over a couple of hours.

We did it by playing PARS scoring with 10 minute matches. Using two courts per division, players were rostered to play all the others in their division, with the player with the most points at the end declared the winner of that division.

We encountered a couple of problems with the draw that we will correct, but, in essence, players would play 2 matches in a row and have only one match break. The idea was to keep players warm while still having a break to recover. Nevertheless, 50 minutes of squash played over 2 hours managed to take its toll on a few players.

For the morning session we planned two divisions, but unfortunately there was a withdrawal in each so each division only had 5 players. This resulted in a number of byes and a bit of a lack of

flow. Still, a number of good matches resulted, and in the end the top three in each division were all only one point apart.

For the afternoon session we planned three divisions of six players. The format worked well, with everyone managing to quickly pick up the idea and the format.

The two hours went quickly, but seemed like an eternity for a few players in their last matches. It was great to have one of the WA Squash staff take part (thanks Leigh).

We spoke with most of the players and everyone thought the idea and format was great and something we should continue to provide for Masters players. We need to review the draw and that will happen leading into the next event.
