The WA Country Championships were a huge success. We will cover the event in detail next month but for now all the results have been listed. The Championship boasted teams down to K Grade!



September was another very busy month for the office with the usual meetings and the start of the Spring season of pennants and Leagues.

We did mention the passing of a great contributor to WA Squash over many years in Dave Morrison and his funeral was a very sad day for the many old squashies who attended. On another sad note we have just heard of the passing of another old squashie in Russell Holmes who played at the Marmion Squash Centre in Padbury for many years and was a huge part of that club as well as achieving his life long dream of playing A grade with the likes of Tony Booth, Peter Selden (dec), Ross Mearns, Geoff Smith, Doug Black, Geoff Dittmar and many more. His son Leon was a fine junior player and has since gone on to be one of the finest artists in Perth. R.I.P Russell.

The finals of the Sunday Junior pennants were conducted on the 19th of September and the new format was a great success. Well done to all the players and parents who embraced this and it was wonderful to see the improvement in all the players.

The 2021 Country week was held at Mirrabooka and once again this was a tremendous success with a full round up in the SWAN. Well done to the newly formed CDC committee for the smooth running of this event.

The State Junior titles were held on the Monday holiday 27th and the 28th followed by the State Junior Zone Championships and a full report is in this SWAN.

The 4th Hall of Fame Night is to be held on Wednesday the 24th of Nov at the Mosman Park Golf Club and this year we will be inducting Sue Hillier and the "Invincibles" ... the 1956 Men's winning Team at the Australian Championships.

It is our night of nights and tickets are selling fast as we have only have a 120. The Hall of Fame is for recognising our players extraordinary achievements. Eligibility is quite simple. The player has had to grow up in Perth and learned their skills here. Ranked in the top 10 in Australia, won an Australian Open title or ranked in the top 20 in the World, or of course won a major World Open title. The player must be retired for a minimum 5 years from open competition.

In keeping with my theme as a touring Pro for over 14 years I came across an old diary from 1981 when we were in South Africa for an extended period as the circuit was some 6 weeks long and it was to be Geoff Hunt's last SA Open which he had won 9 times straight.

I had had a great time and played well and seen most of the country doing exhibitions all over



SA when the great man and promoter Owen Emslie asked me to do one more match with Geoff but he couldn't tell me where but to be ready very early next morning.

Both Owen and Geoff were practical jokers so I was a little on edge however that heightened when the car arrived at 5am and both Geoff and I were bundled into a SUV and made to lie low and asked to put a blanket over us and to not talk. This happened about 30 minutes into the drive and by this stage we were both very anxious.

We heard voices and then we were told to keep low and run into a shed where we took off the blanket to discover that we had been smuggled into SOWETO. Known as **SO**uth **WE**st **TO**wnship it was home to approximately one million Africans in very poor living conditions but unbeknown to many people they had a squash court and Owen Emslie was trying to introduce them to squash.



We coached hundreds of kids and gave a quick exhibition when we were told to quickly get in the car and leave. There is no record of this or photos because if we had been caught by the white police we would have been in a lot of trouble. Owen was before his time in trying to get the local Africans to play squash but sadly, the court was smashed down and as they say the rest was history. Great memories and this is the first time I have ever told this story.

Our annual prestigious State Junior Championships were to be held in the July School Holidays and once again COVID disrupted this and it was rescheduled for Monday the 27th and 28th of September. The draw was basically the same but sadly, a few events were redrawn as some players aged out due to the new dates set.

A few players had to compete in a higher age bracket and sadly, a few had to withdraw, and one player was Remi Young the defending Champion and two-time winner, who was a casualty.

The entries were strong with the Australian Junior Open Champions Erin Classen, Oscar Curtis and Hannah Slyth hoping to win their State Titles. Plus, Isla Harris and Caitlin Pratt who also are ranked highly in Australia and had a very successful AJC last December. So the stage was set for a very competitive tournament and the possibility that it is even harder to win a State title than a National Title!

It was great to see so many country players entering, from Broome to Narrogin. One of the big draw cards to play this event on this long weekend was that Country Week was on at Mirrabooka and quite a few Juniors played in this and therefore were already in Perth to play the Junior Championships. Having finished 2-3 days of Country Week Squash they were still fit and keen for another 2 days.

There were a variety of draws with some a round robin and some Swiss draws to enable players to at least have 2 if not 3 matches minimum. The finals were played in good spirit with notable victories going to Caitlin Pratt in the girls Under 17 defeating Isla Harris, Hannah Slyth defeating Isla Harris in the GU15, Jessica Jellis defeating


Vic Park had a tough final against Bluegum, with the final going down to the last match where Varshan just defeated Josie Jones by 2 points.


