Sue has been a force of nature in this role and Squash in WA will be the poorer without her. The role is varied and broad and it takes someone who knows squash and understands the limitations we work under, with sadly a diminishing playing base due to facilities disappearing, to succeed.

Her passion for juniors and especially the tier of juniors who are under the better kids is remarkable. She creates opportunities for these kids to have the chance to play competitions and learn how to play with the correct etiquette. The instigation of new club comps, a B grade Zone teams event and the assistance in getting some clubs to form a junior club has been her legacy.

At the same time keeping all the Coaches up to speed and assessing budding coaches with quite a few coaching courses has been a task she has delivered well. It's a tough job to keep all the people happy all the time but Sue has done an outstanding job and will be missed by so many people. Her last day will be the 10th November and all the staff and volunteers wish her well. Sue will still be involved as a master's player and as a coach, so we will see her around the squash courts for some time yet. I certainly hope so.

Kane Fasolo from Squashworld decided at the 11th hour to organise 4 PSA events where the calendar was a bit light on in the back half of the year. The first one was at Cambridge which saw for the first time the Curtis brothers play off in the final with older brother Will defeating Oscar 3-1. Erin Classen continued on her way with a win against Jo Hitch 3-0 and all players gained valuable PSA points. Full round up is in this edition of the SWAN.

The 4th Hall Of Fame night is well underway and as I write this article I have had to stop all sales as it's a 100% SELL OUT with 130 people attending on Wednesday the 24th of November. This year we will see the "INVINCIBLES", the 1956 Winning State Team of the National Teams titles admitted to the WA Squash Hall of Fame.

The team of Dawson Hamilton, Clark Johnson, John Freedman and Ross George went undefeated to win and become the first WA Men's team to win this prestigious title. Little did they all know that they would become the ONLY Men's team to ever do this from WA. True champions and they are all deserving inductees into the WA Squash Hall of Fame.

The other inductee is Sue Hillier who is a very worthy inductee indeed. She achieved ranking high of #6 in Australia in an era which saw basically the top 5 women in Australia all world ranked. A very tough era but with a record of 8 WA Titles, Sue is a very deserving inductee. It should be a night to remember!!!

One other notable challenge being undertaken by a lady named Kat Taylor is the possible emergence of wheelchair squash. Kat is working on this with the WSF, PSA and many other squash bodies in the world. There is a long way to go but like everything in life you must start somewhere. Can't wait to see where this will go because if squash is going to be considered for an Olympics, we will need to be a para sport as well. Good Luck Kat.

Just to continue my theme as a touring Professional for some 15 years, I see that the World Teams Championships are on in Malaysia shortly and it brought back some amazing memories when playing for Australia in these Championships.

My first official team was the 1977 World Titles in Montreal where we came 5th. My second was the 1983 Titles in Auckland where we came 3rd and my third was in 1985 in Cairo where we came 3rd again.

I missed the 1979 titles due to turning pro and when the game went "open" in 1980/81 I was looking forward to teaming up with Geoff Hunt and having a real chance at winning the teams event.

Due to politics and no prize money Geoff asked all players to boycott the championships in Stockholm, so sadly no pro's went except for the Pakistanis lead by Jahangir and Zaman. Needless to say they won it. But it was the only chance I had to be in a team with Geoff and it didn't happen because he retired in 1982.

Good luck to the Aussies this year as we will need it as sadly, the team isn't strong. Egypt could field 3 teams and still come 1st, 2nd and 3rd!

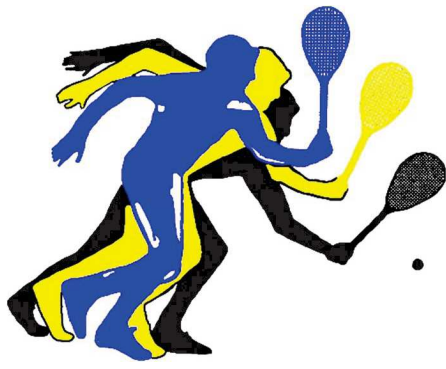

Records were again broken this year!

The Busselton Squash Club again hosted its annual Tournament at the Sebel Resort Busselton on the last weekend in October 29th-31st. (We had to convert the event into an invitational tournament in 2020 rather than an Open due to demand outstripping court supply).

72 players across 2 courts! As a ratio of players to courts in a single event it's a WA Squash Record – (As verified by Dean Williams)

40% of tournament entrants are female. A Busselton Squash Record for this event, a consequence of the growth of women in the sport. 108 individual matches played in 48 hours. 1pm Friday kick off. Tournament matches concluded 1pm Sunday.

Players competed from the following clubs: Belmont, Brentwood, Broome, Bunbury, Esperance, Exmouth, Kalgoorlie, Katanning, Leschenault, Mandurah, Marmion, Mirrabooka, Moora and Victoria Park.

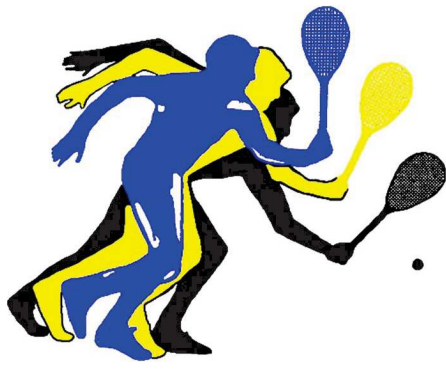

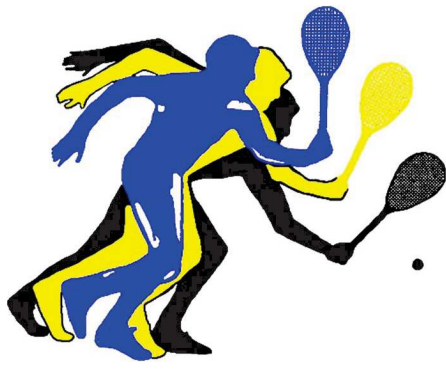

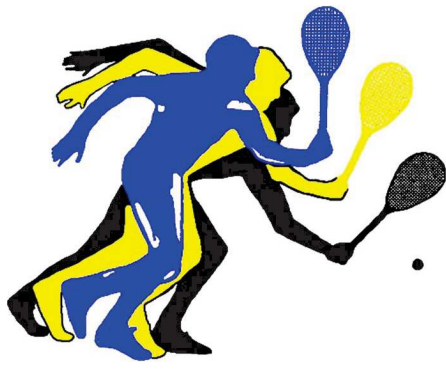

“Marker Calls”

How often do you hear *“No you mark because it is easier!”*

As a referee I have three people to control: 2 players and 1 marker.

The Marker has a responsibility to tell the story of the game from the beginning with

The match introduction: “Smith to serve, Jones to receive, best of 5 games, love-all.”

To the end of the match: “11-8, match to Jones, 3 games to 2, 3-11, 11-7, 6-11, 11-9, 11-8.”

And everything in between:

End of the game: “11-3, game to Smith. Smith leads 1 game to love.”

“11-7, game to Jones. Smith leads 2 games to 1.”

“11-8, match to Jones, 3 games to 2, 3-11, 11-7, 6-11, 11-9, 11-8.”

Start of successive games:

“Smith leads 1 game to love. Love-all.”

“Smith leads 2 games to 1. Jones to serve, love-all.”

“2 games all. Smith to serve, love-all.”

Calling the score:

“Not up. Hand out, 4-3.”

“Fault, hand out, 8-3.”

“Not up, 10-all: a player must win by 2 points.”

“10-8, Game Ball.”

“13-12, Game Ball.”

“10-8, Match Ball.”

“13-12, Match Ball.”

“Game Ball” and “Match Ball” are repeated every time they occur.

The Marker repeats the decision of the referee together with the score:

“Yes let, 3-4.”

Order of calls:

The Marker has to make the calls in the following order:

i) Anything affecting the score (eg Stroke to Brown).

ii) The score with the server's score always called first.

iii) Comments on the score (eg Game ball).

“Stroke to Jones, 10-8, Game Ball.”

“Marker Calls”

Marker Don't's:

The Marker does not make any decisions on Lets and Strokes

The Marker does not make any decisions on Times

The Marker does not make a call on Out, Down or Fault if they are uncertain.

In a good Marker/Referee relationship the Marker will communicate with the Referee about their uncertainty. This may be verbal or with a hand signal.

Finally the Markers Calls:

DOWN	<i>To indicate that a player's return hit the tin, or the floor before reaching the front wall, or hit the front wall and then the tin.</i>
FAULT	<i>To indicate that a serve was not good.</i>
HAND OUT	<i>To indicate a change of server.</i>
NOT UP	<i>To indicate that a return: was not struck correctly; or bounced more than once on the floor before being struck; or touched the striker or the striker's clothing.</i>
OUT	<i>To indicate that a return: hit the wall on or above the out-line; or hit any fixture above the out-line; or hit the top edge of any wall of the court or passed over a wall and out of the court; or passed through any fixture.</i>
10-ALL: A PLAYER MUST WIN BY 2 POINTS	<i>To indicate at 10-all that a player must lead by 2 points to win the game. Called only on the first occurrence in a match.</i>
GAME BALL	<i>To indicate that a player requires one point to win the game.</i>
MATCH BALL	<i>To indicate that a player requires one point to win the match.</i>
YES, LET	<i>To repeat the Referee's decision that a rally is to be replayed.</i>
STROKE TO	<i>To repeat the Referee's decision to award a stroke to a player or team.</i>
NO LET	<i>To repeat the Referee's decision that a request for a let is disallowed.</i>

Each of the above calls clearly tells the players the situation. Also, importantly it also tells the spectators the game situation.

A sign of good marker is when you can close your eyes and listen to the Marker and clearly hear and know the match situation.

If I have a good marker then that makes it easier to concentrate on the match. One person less that I have to think about. Mind you I still have to record the score in case the Markers make a mistake or there is a query on the score.
