


No event runs smoothly without key people behind the scene ensuring what needed to be done, was done.





# LISACAMILLERI





Lisa Camilleri has continued her good form over the past few months reaching another PSA final.

Competing at the NT Open in Darwin Camilleri played some awesome squash to reach the final before losing to former World #3 Madeline Perry.

Seeded #6 Camilleri won her opening match 3-0 against Alexia Clonda in straight 11-2, 11-5, 11-5 before facing a tough test against #3 seed Jessica Turnbull (Qld).

Camilleri fought back from 1-2 down to advance to the semi final. She began well winning the first 11-8 but lost her way in the second and third losing 8-11, 2-11.

Down but not out a rejuvenated Camilleri found some magic and struck back impressively to close out the match 11-3, 11-2.

Meanwhile Queenslander Samantha Foyle was upsetting the #1 seed Christine Nunn. Foyle was equally impressive fighting back from 0-2 down to win in five. Foyle won 9-11, 9-11, 11-3, 11,8 11-9 to set up a semi final clash with Camilleri.

The semi final was a see-sawing struggle with Foyle winning the first 11-9 before Camilleri took the second 11-8. Foyle then went to a 2-1 lead

with another tight 11-9 result.

Facing 1-2 down for the second time Camilleri once again dug deep and began a concerted effort to close out the match 11-9, 11-5 to set up a clash with Northern's Ireland's Madeline Perry.

The former World #3 retired from the circuit in April 2015 to take up the role of Head Professional at the East Coast Squash Academy in Sydney.

So it was going to be a tough ask for Camilleri. She had already been to five in the quarters and the semi so the energy levels were down and her opponent had breezed through to the final without dropping a game.

Her opponent was also a very highly experienced and respected rival. Unfortunately for Camilleri, Perry was on fire and right from the outset was too strong for Camilleri winning 11-5, 11-3, 11-2.

It wasn't a setback for Camilleri because Perry would have most likely done that to whoever she played. She is a fierce competitor who simply doesn't give anyone an inch!

Camilleri moves on to the City of Perth International where her chances are high that she will break through for another win.
