Dean's Diary

As we near the end of 2021 it is time to reflect on what a year we have had.

We managed to have a full 3 seasons of Pennants and League and 2 seasons of Day League. Numbers were very good with a slight increase in Pennants which is very encouraging. Thank you to the Club Captains who work tirelessly to put teams in which can be very time consuming and difficult. To the League committees who have a great system in place where individual players are placed into teams that pretty much guarantees a good even game of squash. It is also played at one venue so the atmosphere is great and it's a very social competition.

Tournaments have been very well attended throughout the year in regional areas as well as Metro. Huge thanks to Kane and Simmo who continually put in the hard yards to make sure these events are full.

We celebrated Cambridge Squash Academy's (now Centre) 60th Birthday with past owners and operators. Cambridge is now the oldest surviving centre as the first was Broadway Squash Centre on Broadway, Nedlands and the second was Oxford Squash Academy, both gone sadly. Both the Adelphi and The Esplanade courts were a part of hotels and not a commercial squash centre as such but sadly they too have gone.

Our Juniors continue to perform well with good results in National Events. Erin Classen and Oscar Curtis are playing well as is Dylan Classen, Hannah Slyth, Isla Harris and Dan Marsh. It hasn't been an easy year with the cancellation of the AJC but fingers crossed 2022 will see them able to compete and as WA is hosting the AJC in 2022 it will give the juniors a great chance to play against the best in our own backyard which will be a financial reprieve for the parents. A lot of work is needed to run this event and WA Squash will be looking for volunteers to help. WA is also hosting the 18th Australian Masters Games in April as well as the UNISport Games in September so it will be a big year.

The 4th Hall Of Fame night was held in November and 130 people attended to see the "The Invincibles" WA State Team of 1956 and Sue Hillier inducted. A great night was had by all and we look forward to the next one.

In closing I would like to thank the Board and the Office staff for an eventful year, and I'm hopeful 2022 will once again be a challenging year as we try to maintain our competition numbers whilst promoting squash through schools and the Centres as best we can on a very restricted budget.

We saw Sue Hillier resign from her role as Development Officer and replaced by Michaela Pratt.

Dean's Diary

We continue to have very good relations with the DSR and State Government, which is so important.

WA Squash held a Special General Meeting to amend and change a few constitutional matters which were all adopted. This will enable WA Squash to be able to directly communicate with members as well as clubs. The major change is in the make up of the Board as DSR are bringing in gender diversity and we need the flexibility to be able to appoint directors to fulfill these needs.

Facilities remain the ONLY major problem we have and we must pour a lot of energy into this area as we have to realise that the privately owned centres (Mirrabooka, Marmion, Hilton, Kensington, Cambridge and Maddington/Gosnells (Fitzpatricks) are the last remaining single usage, privately owned centres left in Perth after approximately 64 have closed their doors in the past 30 years.

We must seek an alternative and we have started talking to local Government but the wheel turns slowly. This should have been done 10 years ago but wasn't. Now we must start again. If we are able to put courts in to existing Recreation Centres or into new builds we need more than just 4 courts and that is where another problem lies. So, whilst Squash in WA is going OK at the moment its easy to say we need more courts but that's just the start. To have secured Belmont as our HQ for squash is a step in the right direction but we are still losing courts with Mullaloo being demolished for residential units, The Vines taking one court out for a gym, Wongan Hills will potentially lose their current 2 courts as a new one is built. So just in the past year we have lost 11 courts.

Its all very well having a strategic plan to GROW squash but I can tell you its difficult without courts!!

Finally a huge thanks to Kim Schramm who puts the SWAN together each month. I can tell you it's a lot of work chasing people for articles, putting names to photos and formatting. The SWAN is a vital part of our communication to the clubs as well as to the State Government and our sponsors. Thank you and well done on an amazing year of SWANS Kim.

The Hawthorn Civil and Mining Services Hilton Open & PSA Satellite was held over December 3 and 4 at Squashworld Hilton. This was the final Event in the Squashworld PSA series and included a Men's Division 1 and 2 and a Ladies Division 1 to go along with the PSA Events. It was a great thrill to have Alex Haydon (World # 142) and Nick Calvert (World # 165) coming over from Queensland for the Event. This is the first time since the start of Covid that we have had interstate players come into WA and I know our players were really keen to play someone new, as I am sure Alex and Nick were too!

With a few PSA matches taking place Friday morning the action really started Friday evening with everyone in the Tournament having a match. The first match proved to be the most enthralling with our young gun Oscar Curtis (5th seed) taking on top seed from Queensland Nick Calvert. Nick came out strong and got the better of Oscar in the first two games before Oscar started to wrestle control of the match to take it out in 5 games and 62 minutes in a huge upset! David Ilich and Remi Young renewed their rivalry after an epic 5 setter at the Mirrabooka Event with Dave showing the benefits of working with his new Coach, Brian Logan to win this one in a tight 4 setter 11-7, 11-7, 7-11, 11-7. Mike and Will both justified their 3rd and 4th seedings to make quick work of their matches against Dylan Classen and Brenden Ward respectively.

There was a big crowd to watch Queenslander Alex Haydon play her first match against youngster Caitlin Pratt from Narrogin. Alex gave us a glimpse of her experience and skill to make it a quick match, as did Erin Classen over another youngster, Isla Harris from Moora. I am sure these girls will have appreciated the chance to play against these top ranked Australian Players and will be better for the experience! The other 2 matches were closer fought affairs but still resulted in 3 nil victories to Isabella Diver over Khris Wiaceck and Hannah Slyth over Lisa Christou.

Ladies Division 1 saw Barb Wood step onto court after a 5 hour drive from Albany and somehow still get the win in a tough 4 setter with Bec Barendrecht and Michelle Hodge doing

the same against Jacquie Gray.

Luke's nerves showed in his first match, with Arron Radinger in his comeback to Competitive Squash after 10 years out taking full advantage to register a win 3-0. Patrick Minson answered a late Thursday Night call to replace the injured Alexander Marsh and managed to win his first competitive match in over 6 months to beat Shane Hercules.

Saturday Morning was Semi Final morning with some close matches and some not so close affairs! Will Curtis took on younger brother Oscar and after a very tight first game in which Will prevailed 13-11, Oscar (probably feeling the effects of his huge match against Nick the previous night) couldn't stay with his more experienced brother and lost 3 nil to see Will progress to the Final. The other Semi saw Mike take on his great mate and training partner Dave. Dave certainly showed his more attacking style but in the end Mike prevailed, taking out the match in 3 competitive games.

The Ladies Semi's were short and sharp affairs with Alex and Erin both keen to sharpen up and get off court as quickly as possible to be ready for the Final! Whilst Isabella and Hannah both lost 3 nil, they got a chance to see first hand what it takes to get to the top of their chosen sport and I am sure they will be better for the experience!
