2022 SOUTH WEST MASTERS TEAMS

Story: Warren Oliver ... Thank You

55 Players from the South West and Perth competed in the 36th SW Squash Masters this year. The event was again held at the South West Sports Centre in Bunbury over the long weekend in March.

It comprised 4 Divisions with ages from 35 to late-70s. The Busselton Club ran the tournament while the Bunbury Club supplied the courts, ran the bar and the dinner. This is the largest Master's Squash event outside of Perth, and one of the longest running. Busselton was able to have representatives in all 4 divisions. 13 Busselton players entered the tournament.

The coveted Div 1 shield was taken out by the SW Allstars which included Busselton's Sean Brockman at No 1, Bunbury's Brad Grinter and Neil Meek. The SW Allstars team went thru the weekend undefeated as a team, and now Brad Grinter has his name on the prestigious Div 1 shield 7 times.

Div 2 was taken out by the undefeated Bunbury team including Mark Lush, Dale Ramage and Bec Herring, who prevailed over the Busselton team of Gys Van Zyl, Louise Moss and Warren Oliver in a very close match 6 games to 3. Mark won his match against Gys 2-1 in a match with many ups and downs as each player alternately gained ascendancy throughout. Dale won 3-0 against Louise but there were some titanic rallies that seemed to just keep going on and on. Finally, Bec was defeated by Warren 2-1 in another very close match, Bunbury has now won this division 6 out of the past 7 years.

Div 3 final saw 2 Busselton teams in the final, after both these teams went through the pool stage undefeated. With all players having played each other many times, a very close final was expected, and as it was, every game was only decided by a few points and in every match the result was 2-1 with the team of Geoff Brown, Chris Champ and Anthony Smith victors over the team of Bernie Stokes, Stu Morgan and Brian Roby. Over the weekend both Geoff and Anthony won all their matches which was a terrific effort considering this was Anthony's first Masters tournament.

Div 4 was won by the undefeated Perth team Card Shufflers made up of Terry Brookes, Nikki McCuulogh and Di Cook, who convincingly defeated the Perth team, Coy Girls, made up of Helen Coyle, Allison Williams and Chris Reston, 8-1, but this was the only loss for the weekend for the Coy Girls.

Saturday night saw 43 people socialise at a gourmet BBQ function at the Bunbury Tennis Club which recognised 27 players who have entered the tournament 10 or more times with both Moya Credaro and Ron Buswell having played in 26 out of 36 possible years, and Warren Oliver, Linda McBrierty, Chris Champ, and George Reid all having played more than 20 times. All 10 year plus players were given a Busselton squash club wine goblet as a memento.

Over the past 35 years 569 players have played at least once in the tournament, and it was great to see 9 players make their first appearance at this iconic event. In the first year, 1987, 25 players entered.

The Busselton Club would like to thank its many sponsors: Hillzeez, Down South Surf Shops, Busselton Discount Drug Store, and Wayne Evans (who has played 17 times in the tournament, and was the only player to be part of Busselton first 4 division titles starting in 2003) for supplying the very popular Crayfish in the raffle, Brian Roby and Ron Clayton (the only person here that played in the very first tournament back in 1987 and then going on to play for 24 years) for the compiling the draws.

This is a unique event in which 2 rival clubs, Busselton and Bunbury come together to run this wonderful event, with the Bunbury Club hosting the event for the past 5 years. The tournament again attracted plenty of participants this year (always room for more, though), with both the

ambient temperature and the competition proving pretty hot on the squash courts. Masters are trying new tournament formats in order to keep games flowing and to facilitate the competition component to conclude at a reasonable hour (allowing time for the all-important social part of the evening).

This year each team had an A and B component. The A teams' scores were combined, as were B teams, at the end of the evenings play, and the group (A or B) that finished with the highest number of aggregated points won the night, with prizes also given to the runners up.

This format worked well, with everyone thoroughly enjoying the event, with plenty of time left for everyone to enjoy the delicious and welcome chicken and salad supper served up at the conclusion of the prize-giving, and everyone celebrating or commiserating with a few well-deserved drinks, and catching up with old and new Masters friends.

“Modern Technology”

With modern technology available to monitor a players physical output during training and playing a match it has become necessary to clarify how the information obtained can be utilized.

The squash rules now contain the following guidelines regarding use of this technology.

APPENDIX 10 - COACHING LIMITATIONS

Coaching

Coaching is considered to be communication, advice or instruction of any kind and by any means to a player, and during matches is only permitted in the intervals between games.

Player Analysis Technology

Player analysis technology as detailed here may be incorporated into the playing equipment of players if it allows that the equipment specification to continue to be adhered to. Any equipment affixed to the body of a player must fulfil safety and other Rules, as applicable.

Player analysis technology is equipment that may perform any of the following functions with respect to player performance information:

- A. Recording
- B. Storing
- C. Transmission
- D. Analysis
- E. Communication to player by any kind or means.

Player analysis technology may record and/or store information during a match. Such information may not be accessed by a player during a match.

Referees Responsibility

The Referee can penalise a player under Rule 15.6.10 for receiving coaching during play. The coaching can be in the form of the use of technology or by the verbal means, hand signals, ear tugging etc.

What the referee must determine is the difference between coaching and encouragement. Sometimes this is fine line.

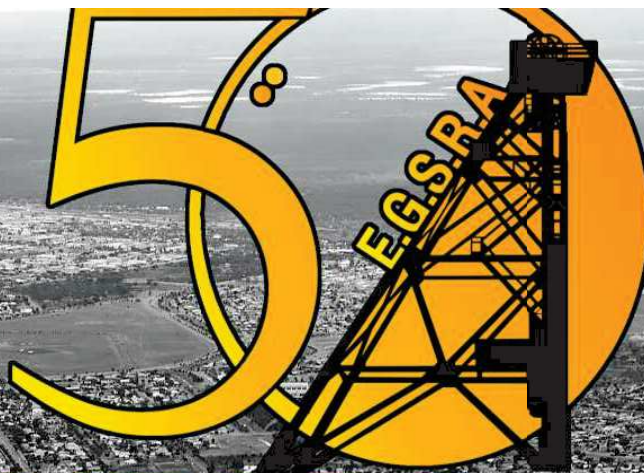

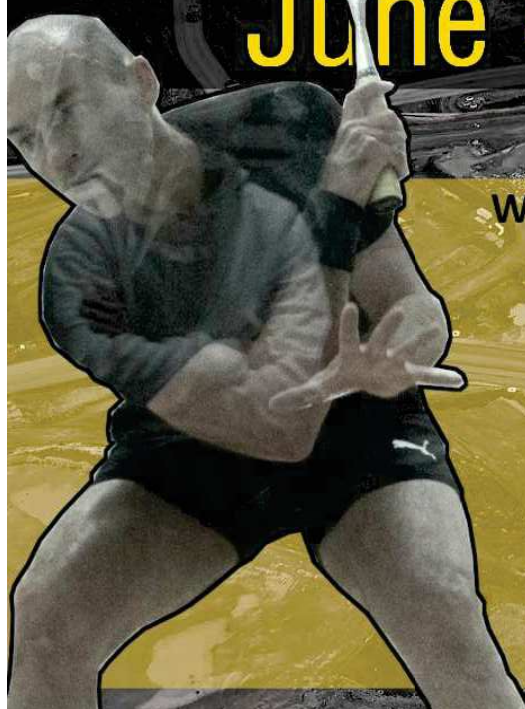

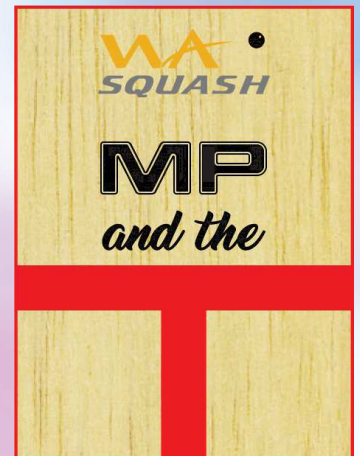
