

After many delays from Covid and border closures the Australian Masters Games were held in Perth at the end of April comprising of 32 sports including our beloved Squash. These games included over 3000 competitors at many locations around Perth.

There was even a highlight with an inaugural Wildcats Team reuniting to play in these games. The Masters Games haven't been held in Perth since 1993.

It all started with the official opening ceremony on 23rd April at Optus stadium where athletes were welcomed and paraded under their sports banner onto the hallowed turf. We were represented by over 20 people ranging from competitors, squash games administrators and supporters.

Our Squash Games officially started on Tuesday 26th and finally wrapped up on Friday 29th April. The Belmont Squash Centre was abuzz with excitement as some amazing squash was played. We were privileged to welcome some of our Eastern State competitors, all of which had a fantastic week.

As there were several age divisions that had been combined, many first or second matches were the medal matches for certain age groups.

With Friday ending with our last match on show court 2, a brave battle from our 70+ men Ray Villarroya and Michael Millington, who fought over a 5 setter. The final game finally ending 14-12 to Michael.

Presentations followed with 17 Gold, 13 Silvers and 5 bonze medals being awarded.

To mark the end of the games and a fantastic week the Closing Ceremony was held at the WA Museum Boola Bardip as participants got to choose between exploring exhibitions or dancing the night away or perhaps both.

#### Surprise Meeting at the Masters: Thanks Trevor Cruickshank

While preparing to referee a squash match during the week, I asked one of the players, Peter Campbell, where he was from. When he replied from the south coast of NSW near Bega, I said what a coincidence I was born near there in Cooma in 1954. To my amazement he said he was also born in Cooma, in 1953 but somehow, we had never met each other.

Although, he did remember Arthur's newsagency in Cooma which was my family's business for years. We chatted after the match and realised we had both also lived in Canberra throughout the 70s and frequented the same haunts but our paths had never crossed. It took coming to Perth for the Australian Masters Games over 60 years later for us to meet.

While that could have been the end of the story, the next day Graham Follington thought he saw me warming up on court by myself and called out the friendly greeting "Get off the court you ugly bugger!". When the person on court turned around, Graham realised it wasn't me but someone who looked almost identical to me and subsequently apologised profusely. In fact, that person was Peter and up to then, neither of us had realised that we were dead ringers for each other.

Later that day Ray Villarroya walked up to someone he thought was me to continue a conversation from the previous day about how many times he had played at Club Sierra over the years. When Ray said not only had he played there 12 times but we had also played each other 3 times, he was slightly disappointed I didn't seem more responsive. After talking to me later on that afternoon we realised he hadn't been talking to me at all, he had been talking to Peter, who had been polite and smiled kindly at this elderly gentleman rather than correct him that they had never met.

While Peter and I were blissfully unaware of our physical similarities, it took others to realise we are doppelgangers. What do you think?







### "The Corkscrew Serve"

Whilst the corkscrew has made way for the screw top on wine bottles it is still used as a legitimate shot in squash. The corkscrew shot is widely used in the American hardball game.

Because the court is narrower (762mm) than our standard singles court and the ball harder the corkscrew is an aggressive shot both on service and during the game.

The server is able play the shot high onto the front wall side wall corner (hitting the front wall first) and the flight and speed of the ball across the court makes the opponent move quickly to avoid being hit and to be able to make a good return.

During possibly the late 60's and 70's when the softball players (our squash game) went to America they adopted this shot and introduced into our softball game when they returned to our size court.

It was not as effective on the serve on our size court due to the softer ball and wider court. To get the correct angle the player had to move further out of the service box nearer to the centre of the court.

Herein laid the problem. The taller players were at an advantage, and still are, because they were able to keep one foot in the service box and stretch out towards the centre of the court to achieve the correct angle.

The shorter players were at a disadvantage because they were unable to get the correct angle onto the front wall without stepping out of the box and Foot-Faulting.

Up until the introduction of the one serve rule the players would use this serve because they had the second serve if the corkscrew was a fault on the first serve.

It was used less once the single serve was introduced and used even less when PARS scoring was adopted as the preferred scoring system.

The Corkscrew During Play

After the serve has been delivered correctly the corkscrew shot can be used at any time during the rally.

#### Referees Responsibility with the Corkscrew Serve

Under Rule 5.7 both the Marker and Referee must be certain that

- 1) At the time the server strikes the ball, one foot is in contact with the floor inside the service box with no part touching any boundary of that box
- 2)The ball is struck directly to the front wall, hitting it between the service line and the out-line, but does not hit the front and side walls at the same time

Sometimes this is fine line for both these conditions to be met on the corkscrew serve.

The other parts of the rule relating to the where the ball must bounce for the first time and the

ball being served out apply equally to the corkscrew serve.

If the Marker is unsure, then they make no call.
If the Referee is unsure, then they let play continue and if
the opponent loses the rally and appeals a Let is played.
If the Referee is certain that one of the above conditions
has not been met, then they shall stop play immediately
and rule accordingly.


### Hi Squashies!
