I'm pleased to say that WA Squash Board have endorsed the re-establishment of three committees. The Tournament, Junior and Pennant Committees join the League committee in working together to drive Squash in WA.

Expression of Interest will be going out shortly for the Referee and Coaching committees, please keep an eye on the website.

In the past two months in my role, I'm heartened by the people that have put their hands up to give their time for squash, and especially those that have committed to join a committee, thank you all (I will do a Committee Introduction in next month's SWAN).

The WA Covid Border restrictions may have been removed in March, and cases may have risen higher than expected, but that didn't stop the month of May being jammed packed.

Around the State we ran tournaments, State Team Squads, WASA training, Junior Pennants, night pennants and league with a sprinkle of Covid on the top, making things a little more challenging for our players and organisers. BUT Squash soldiered on!!!

The phasing in of the new Squash software platform from SportyHQ to SquashLevels/Revo sport is progressing nicely. We encourage all players to register with squashlevels as we'll be moving into the next phase soon. Squash Australia together with Revolutionise Sport have a plan to roll this out and we'll be relaying the information onto Centres, clubs and players as soon as we are able to.

How special must it be to represent your Country? The Australian Junior Squash team has been announced with a whopping 5 of the 12 selected players coming from WA. Erin and Dylan Classen, Hannah Slyth, Oscar Curtis and Greg Chan. Congratulations !!

The World Junior Championships takes place in France in Aug 2022 and we wish the Australian Team everything of the best as they represent Australia, in front of the whole world.

The Australian Junior Championship (AJC) will be played at Mirabooka Squash Centre this year and we're expecting all States to send teams and individuals to Perth for this event. In preparation for this, our State Squad has been training hard under the experienced eye of Amanda Hopps and Paul Kershaw and shadowing for experience, Remi Young and Pascale Louka.

I'm confident that this leadership team will assist in building our juniors so WA can continue to represent Australia well into the future. Without a strong, passionate and organised person in the office (and at Squads), we would not be able to offer this training – thank you Michaela!

Together with the Board, office staff and committees, I'm looking forward to what the next few months bring.

Rest In Peace Do

Emeritus Professor Donald W Watts

After completing his schooling at Hale School Don Watts enrolled in science at the University of Western Australia (UWA), graduating as a Bachelor of Science with Honours (BSc(Hons)) and subsequently as a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD). He continued his research in physical chemistry for three years at University College London and then in 1962 accepted appointment as a Senior Lecturer in Physical and Inorganic Chemistry at UWA. He was promoted to a Readership in 1968 and then to a Personal Research Chair in 1978. He won numerous awards including the Rennie Medal and Leighton Medal of the Royal Australian Chemical Institute for his research contributions. He also spent time as Visiting Professor at the University of Southern California, as a Fulbright Scholar, the University of Toronto and the Australian National University.

Don took up tennis at an early age and became an outstanding junior player. He represented Western Australia (WA) in the Linton Cup Junior (Under 19) Interstate Teams Championship and UWA in (senior)



intervarsity competitions. He began playing squash while at UWA and soon excelled at this sport too. He represented WA in the annual Australian Teams Championships in the early 1950s. In England he played in what at the time was the very strong London inter-club teams competition.

After returning to WA he involved himself actively in local squash affairs. He was State Champion in 1962. He was also a State and later a National Selector. He was a Life Member of WA Squash.

In 1980 Don was appointed as Director of the Western Australian Institute of Technology (WAIT). The institution was granted university status as Curtin University of Technology in 1987. Don became its inaugural Vice Chancellor. He played an influential role in WA Squash establishing its headquarters at WAIT, an arrangement that lasted for 20 years.

In July 1987 Don was appointed as President and Vice Chancellor of Bond University, Australia's first private university. His first tasks were to design and have built the initial campus on the Gold Coast, appoint staff and plan the academic programs. The University opened its doors to students in May 1989 and the first MBA degrees were awarded in 1990.

Don moved on to work for the Northern Territory Government as Executive Chairman of NT Trade Development Zone and of the NT Employment and Training Authority.

In 1995 he retired and returned to Perth. Since then he assisted the University of Notre Dame Australia. He was appointed as Emeritus Professor and in 2009 was awarded a Distinguished Service Medal.

Don served on many Commonwealth and State Boards and Committees. The most challenging were his six years on the Australian Science and Technology Council, advisory to the Prime Minister and Cabinet, and his period as Chairman of the Australian Space Council.

He also served on the inaugural Board of the Western Australian Institute of Sport and was invited to serve on the Board of the Queensland Academy of Sport.

His work has been recognised by the award of Honorary Doctorate Degrees by the University of Western Australia, Curtin University and Bond University. He has been awarded a Centennial Medal and membership of the Order of Australia.

Sporting Walk Hall of Fame

The Town Of Victoria Park Sporting Walk of Fame started in 2008. It honours competitors and contributors who have a strong connection to the Town and have achieved success at an elite sporting level or made significant contributions to the elite sporting arena. This includes all people who have impacted positively in the realm of elite sport.

Induction to the Sporting Walk of Fame takes place every four years and paver for each inductee is currently featured at the entrance to the Aqualife Centre, Somerset Street, East Victoria Park. Each paver includes the inductees name, chosen sport and date of induction.



I was privileged to be nominated by Vic Park Squash Club in the Sports Contributor category, for Squash Coaching. My nomination was successful and I was inducted into the Sporting Walk of Fame on 22 May 2022 with 2 other nominations.

The two other nominees were Joshua Hofer a paralympian swimmer, who won 11 medals at his first Paralympics – why is he not a household name? The other was Stuart Durham a triathlete coach who has many achievements in his chosen sport.

My Star is close to a famous cricketer Dennis Lillee. Merv Macintosh also has a star there; he played against my Dad in the WAFL in their day.



I have been coaching for approximately 35 years and have always run our junior program on a voluntary basis with others in the club.

I have enjoyed coaching juniors through to seniors over the years and love meeting people and finding out what they do for a living.

Its great to see juniors start their journey, find their way, choose other directions to go and see them come back to the sport as

adults and enjoy playing.

Listening to the emcee Glenn Mitchell, read what I have achieved over the years was quite humbling, as coaching day-today one does not consider any of this.

I'm currently trying to introduce squash to more females. I'm running two girls only programs: one at Bluegum and one at Vic Park targeting years 12-16. The two groups of girls are a delight to coach and I only hope that they can continue playing. I also run a Ladies Only on Friday mornings at Vic Park. The women are from all walks of life and enjoy getting together each week playing squash with the occasional coffee and chat afterwards.

I have been lucky to play in great clubs, who were/are very supportive and I wish to thank the Vic Park Squash Club for this nomination. Sue Hillier

Summed up by Bridgy

The classic Broome weather turned it on as the first of 72 players representing Broome, Dampier, Karratha, Geraldton, Dongara, Perth, Mandurah, Busselton, Bunbury, Leschenault, Katanning, Narrogin, Esperance, Kalgoorlie and as far away as Carrara Queensland made their way to Broome for the 6th annual Broome Invitational. All were gathered at the Habitat Resort for Welcome to Country and the



Welcome dinner on Thursday night, where the rules of the road were made very clear by MC Bridgy. Both Jamie 'The Juggernaut' Herring and' Lethal' Leigh Kaye were acknowledged as defending champions in A grade and the Womens open, as was former world number 2 Brett Martin and former world number 23 Melissa Martin who after 3 long years were finally here in Broome. Once the dinner and formalities were taken care of most players walked over the sand dunes to watch the last night of Staircase to the Moon which was a great omen for the rest of the weekend.

The tournament began Friday morning at 0800 and the day was peppered with some great matches ... none greater than the B-grade match up of Tyrone Holloway from Mirrabooka and Dwayne Franks from Narrogin which saw each player have no less than 3 match points each in the 5th game before Tyrone finally edged clear. Friday night also saw the first match featuring Brett Martin who wowed the crowd against a gallant Derek Nunn and also the sheer class of Melissa Martin was also on display.

Saturday was much the same with all semi finals complete by end of play which left a mouth watering last day of competition. On Sunday All plate finals were completed and at 2 pm the first of 5 Main Draw finals was underway.

The D Grade final saw Number 1 seed Erin "Too Easy" Zolnier from Leschenault take on number 2 seed "The Assassin" Ann Jeanette Bass from Mirrabooka. AJ proved to be too strong as Erin struggled with nerves and as Erin told me after, she has performed in front of a 1,000 people before and not felt the nerves that she felt on the day. AJ would become champion in 3 games.

C Grade final saw number 9 seed Graeme "Working Class Man" Barnes from Vic Park make it to the final after dispatching number 1 seed Lindsay Jackson from Broome where he would meet number 2 seed Daniel "The Muckrunner" Richardson from Mirrabooka. Richardson leapt to a 2 game lead before Barnes pegged one back before Richardson closed out the match in 4. To close out a flawless tournament, Richardson would go on to win 1kg of pearl meat and \$100 in the raffles.

B Grade saw former finalist and number 1 seed Jeremy "The Reverend" Church from Dongara match up with number 2 seed Brad "The Heartthrob" Hibbs from Mandurah. The match was

a torrid affair with two of the biggest hitters going at it with Church taking an easy 2 game lead before Hibbs showed true grit to dig in and take out a memorable final in 5.

This left the 2 main events to go and before that was underway the pre-show entertainment began with dancers from Rae Bodles Squashettes entertaining the crowd.



First up was the A Grade final featuring Number 1 seed Brett "Popeye" Martin from Carrara Queensland taking on number 2 seed Jason "The Peoples Champion" Patmore from Blue Gum. From the start the standard was something that we haven't seen in Broome with Patmore taking the first game before Martin took the next 2. Patmore took the 4th comfortably which left only the 5th to decide a winner. Martin held a handy lead at 9-3 before Patmore surged to the finish line and a match point. With the match on his racquet, Patmore played a drop that was 1mm too tight which levelled the match at 10-10. Martin then showed experience and class to win the next 2 points to take out what was certainly the greatest match ever seen in Broome .

Once again the Squashettes did their thing before the final match of the tournament was underway.

The Womens Open final saw number 1 seed and former world #60 Zoe "the Zeitgeist" Petrovansky take on number 2 seed and former world#23 Melissa "EMENEM" Martin in what was a highly anticipated affair. The first game saw both players have periods of dominance before Petrovansky scratched out the first one. However, once the scent of blood was in the water, Petrovansky put in an almost flawless last 2 games to be crowned champion in 3 games. In addition Petrovansky's parents also had a front row seat to watch their daughter become champion in front of a raucus crowd.

Presentations were held back at the Habitat Resort amongst great fanfare as all winners received their polished pearl shell trophy. Tournament referee Neil "no let" Butler awarded the match of the tournament to Brett Martin and Jason Patmore and also awarded Dwayne Franks from Narrogin Player of the Tournament who clearly had a break-out tournament after finishing runner up in C grade last year to making B grade plate final this year. That's a big jump ... Well done Dwayne.

The Peanut of the Tournament was awarded to Melissa Martin who lost her scooter keys to the point that the only people that weren't looking for them were the Police and then took someone else's shoes home.

The tournament wrapped up on Monday night with a farewell Sunset dinner on Cable Beach which was well attended and capped off what for me was a perfect Tournament.

"Affected or Prevented Swing"

Rule 8.9 Racket swing describes what is a reasonable swing comprises:

- 1) Reasonable backswing
- 2) Strike at the ball
- 3) Reasonable follow through

The striker's backswing and follow through are reasonable as long as they do not extend more than is necessary. The rule then explains two situations where there is interference to the striker's swing.

1. Swing is affected – slight contact with opponent who is making every effort to avoid the interference - LET unless a winning return is prevented

2. Swing is prevented – contact with opponent even if opponent is making every effort to avoid the interference – STROKE

Where there is no actual contact and the swing has been held by the striker for fear of hitting the opponent then this is dealt with under Rule 8.6 – General Interference (see next page).

Rule 8.9 states if a swing is affected by slight contact, a let is allowed. If a swing was prevented, a stroke is awarded




