It has been said by numerous people that June 2022 has been by far the busiest month in a long time.

- For the first time in over two years, we've had National and International players come over to enter our tournaments and later in the year, we'll have the Australian Junior Championships, where we will welcome over 100 National juniors to WA.
- We celebrated 50 years of the Kalgoorlie Squash Club, in the presence of Life Members, past players, new players and visiting players from around the Country.
- We've congratulated 5 WA juniors who will be representing Australia at the World Championships in France
- We've congratulated Mike Corren on an incredible 100 PSA titles in his career, so far! Who would have thought a Ton is possible in squash!
- We have re-established the Junior, Tournament and Pennant committee
- We have sent out an EOI for people to join our Referee and Coaching committees
- We've been organising interschools, Pennants and State Juniors for the kids
- We had Squash Australia coaches here testing and training our high performance juniors as well as spending time with our State Squad Juniors
- Working with Squash Australia with the change of platform from Sporty to Revolutionise

Unfortunately, Maddington Gosnells squash club closed its doors on the 3rd June. The Club members will be moving to the Leeming squash centre and for now, will call it home. They will retain the Maddington Gosnells club name for now, whilst they settle in and get some guidance on the best way forward. Thank you to Mike at Leeming Strikers Rec centre for working with us to find a home for the Club. Leeming has 6 glass back courts and is located at 55 Farrington Rd Leeming.

Squash in schools is growing. How do we know this? Over the past couple years, we've run Inter schools over one day at the Mirrabooka courts as this allows us to enter 28 teams from multiple schools. Over the past couple years, we have not reached capacity, however this year, due to a

Due to this amazing turn of events, WA Squash will start discussions straight away with schools to go back to 2 days for interschools so we can double the teams to 56 for next year. These are the types of problems I love to have. Bring it on!!!

Over the past few months, the office has been working extremely hard behind the scenes keeping squash on track, improving the office systems and processes, talking to clubs and players, all to enable us to better support our clubs.

To finish off on an even more positive note, a quick Announcement:




It was so nice to see so many juniors competing in both the junior and the senior events, as they are a skillful and competitive bunch and have a lot to offer squash in WA.

### **Clothing Standards**

#### Clothing

As with any sport there is an image of the game to be presented to the public. Each sport has a dress code for what is acceptable attire to wear in competitions.

Squash is no different.

We see very strict rules at say Wimbledon where tradition

has been kept and players must wear white. Everybody complies.

Squash moved away from white clothing many years ago but still has rules to keep up the standard of clothing to be worn during competition matches.

The following is the current Pennant By-Law relating clothing requirements for competitions under the control of WA Squash:-

#### 15. Clothing

15.1 Any decision by a referee on interpretation of By-Laws relating to clothing shall be final, except an item of clothing or a design approved by the World Squash Federation or Squash Australia for League play, cannot be ruled as breaching these By-Laws.

15.2 All clothing shall conform to the accepted standards of decency and cultural/religious traditions of Australia, as judged by the referee.

15.3 Clothing of any colour or combination of colours in accordance with the current WSF Rules of Squash Rackets may be worn and shall conform with the following: -

Men shall wear shorts socks, playing shoes and short sleeved shirt.

Ladies shall wear a dress, skirt or shorts with a shirt, socks and playing shoes.

The referee may permit other garments such as part of a tracksuit to be worn during play, subject to compliance with other By-Laws on clothing.

This is an extract from the WSF regarding how serious they are on dress standards:-

#### **Dress and Equipment**

On-court: Players shall dress and present themselves for play in a professional manner wearing clean and customarily acceptable squash clothing which conforms to the standards defined in World Championship Regulation L, and using equipment which conforms with the WSF specifications.





### **Clothing Standards**

Any player who is in breach of this rule may be ordered by the Championship Referee or WSF Technical Delegate to change his clothing immediately. Failure of a player to comply with such order may result in immediate default and may result in a fine up to £250 GBP. For a second and any subsequent offences in any 12 month period, the player may be fined up to £500 GBP for each offence.

These standards are not onerous but the sport needs to maintain standards if we are to move forward in relation to obtaining and retaining sponsorships.

The general criteria is that any clothing sold as tennis gear is acceptable. Football jerseys, basketball singlets, etc are not sold as tennis gear!

A coach once told me "if you are going to be a squash player at least look like one to start with".

We also encourage club shirts and team shirts to promote the sport and a provide a sense of pride as being part of our great sport.


### Hi Gquashies!

### **2022 WA SQUASH INTERSCHOOL COMPETITION**

The 2022 WA Squash Interschool Competition was held on the Tuesday of the last week of Term 2, at Squashworld Mirrabooka.

This year, in a trial format, all divisions were held on one day, to encourage more participation from schools. This had a very positive effect, as there was a total of 45 entries - the most that there has ever been. Some schools had play-offs amongst their students, and the number of teams was reduced to 28 - the maximum capacity that can play across the 14 courts at the largest Squash Centre in Australia.


