The ball is about to start rolling with the upgrades to the WA Squash state centre - Belmont. The smaller, less noticeable items such as lighting, removing of cupboards and moving of offices, will commence shortly, with bigger ticket items kicking off a little later.

A huge thanks to Belmont Saints Squash Club for working with us to make these significant changes. We will do our best to remain open during this time, keeping player health and safety in mind at all times. If there are any tradesmen out there in the squash community that would like to offer their services, please drop me a line.

In preparation for the phasing out of SportyHQ by March 2023, training commenced with three online 'Intro to revolutioniseSPORT' sessions. The next phase of training 'Getting Started' will also be offered across three dates; we are trying to get a 6pm time slot for WA. Links will be sent out for you to join in on these. We strongly recommend 2-3 people per Club attend these online sessions. Clubs have been emailed this information directly however please give us a shout if you haven't received it and want to attend the training.

Busselton Squash Club hosted its 5th annual Invitational Tournament at the Sebel Resort Busselton on the 28th-30th October 2022.



An Australian record was set at last year's tournament, with 72 players across two courts, but Busselton Squash Club have decided to go even further ... 80 players competed in 120 matches over 48 hours across only two courts!

40% of tournament entrants were again female which ties back to the Busselton Squash Club's strategy around increasing female participation. The tournament also attracted vast representation from across the state; with nine country and five metro clubs sending some of their very best along.

Halloween theme dress up took over again Saturday night with some players even opting to wear their costume on court! The Busselton club members worked hard all weekend to keep everyone fed and hydrated throughout with a little help from the Bunbury club cooking a BBQ for 110 people!



This was my fourth Trans Tasman. I was lucky to have West Aussies Joannah Yue (O40) and Glenn Hitch (O45) in the team with me ... it was the first time in the team for them. This year was the 40th Anniversary of Australian Masters and the 25th Anniversary of the Trans Tasman series. Our uniform went back to the first test to reflect how it was back in the day.

On arriving in Adelaide on Wednesday it was great to meet some of the team members at the airport and then the rest of the team that night. Thursday we had a hit at Karadinga Courts ... quite slow courts.

Friday was our first test, I was feeling the usual nerves but these were overshadowed when I got to the courts and caught up with the awesome Kiwis. The opening ceremony is always great with the National Anthems played and an introduction to both teams members. Then let the test begin.

We played on two courts with Glenn first up on one of them, winning 3/0 (11/7, 11/9, 11/9) against Matthew Green – great start for the Aussie Team. I played Vicki Beker also winning in 3 (11/1, 11/6, 11/6). Joannah looked nervous winning a tough battle in the O40 against Joanna Shanks (even though she is O45) winning 3/2 (8/11, 11/2, 7/11, 12/10, 11/2). Australia won the first test 11/3. A light supper and catch up rounded off a great night.

I won this match 11/2, 11/1, 11/5.

Glenn had the match of the day. Despite being ill during the week, Glenn led 2/0 before Matthew staged a come back to level 2/2. We all thought Glenn was gone, but what a fight to win 11/9, 13/11, 9/11, 3/11, 11/8. Joannah had the upper hand this time and won 11/7, 15/13, 11/6. The Aussies won the third test 10/4.

It was great to have the support of all the WA contingent, I hope we inspired them for the Teams event. Having secured the Vic Belsham Trans Tasman Trophy it was time to wind down, enjoy the great Aussie / Kiwi companionship, exchange gifts then sadly say our goodbyes.

Playing the Masters is such fun and I encourage all players O35 to play Masters. The people are fantastic and you can travel our great Country and the World always meeting new people. It's the experience that we always remember not whether we won or lost.

Oscar made the first appearance at 1.00pm, against Queensland's Rhys Dowling, while Erin made the second, taking on another Queenslander Jess Turnbull at 3.45pm.

Rhys Dowling and Jess Turnbull proved too strong for our young guns Oscar and Erin, the scores being 3-0: 11-6, 11-2, 11-4 (23m) and 3-0: 11-4, 11-7, 11-3 (26m) respectively.

WA Squash checked in with Remi on the Friday afternoon to see how he was feeling leading up to the event. "I'm feeling a bit nervous because of the strong competition, but excited to play outside of WA again!" he shared.



## Canberra Open

Seeded 14th in the Men's PSA Satellite, Remi Young won his first match on the Friday night in a super close five-setter against 19th seed, Scotsman-come-Aussie Robert Palmer. The scores were 8-11, 11-5, 17-15, 6-11, 11-9.

Remi shared, "I was really happy to get this win. It wasn't my strongest performance, but I managed to pull through when it mattered. I made a bit of a comeback in the 5th from 9-3 so I'm stoked with the result."

Remi fought hard in his second match on the Saturday morning against 3rd seed, Dubai's Sandeep Ramachandran who proved too tough to beat. The scores were 11-5, 11-8, 11-7.

Remi's final match on the Saturday afternoon was for 9th/10th position, against 11th seed, Victoria's Dylan Molinaro.

"It was a tough match against Dylan," Remi said, "I just didn't feel like I was playing my game, but it highlighted things I need to improve on."

When Remi returned home, we caught up with him again.

"My last match was tough but I'm glad I got through it, playing some better squash. Overall, it was an okay performance in the tournament from me. It was a very tough tournament, but I learned a lot about my own game and the level that awaits me as I enter the PSA circuit. It was great to see many familiar and unfamiliar faces, and it sure made me look forward to doing more events in the future!"

Whilst there were low numbers at the squash event, the Teachers played a Round-Robin




Competition, followed by some sneaky doubles and some good old fashioned 5down.
