Over the course of 2022 there have been 37 junior, senior and masters tournaments, not to mention Pennants, Leagues, Club Champs events, Junior Programs, Open Days and more. The increase in activity we're seeing is gaining momentum at a rate of knots, and for me, this is incredibly exciting. Based on

population and geographic distance from the rest of Australia, WA has punched well above our weight.

It became official that Belmont Squash Centre would be the new state centre and home for WA Squash. After three long years in the making, the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSCI) finalised purchase of the centre and the lease was signed. We're excited with the works that have commenced on centre upgrades which will hopefully be finished before December 2023.

Perth hosted three national events this year including the Australian Masters Games in April, and in September the Australian Junior Championships and UniSport Nationals. ... and what a year it was for our WA juniors! Five of our juniors comprised the Australian team that travelled to Nancy, France to compete in the World Junior Championships: Erin and Dylan Classen, Oscar Curtis, Hannah Slyth and Greg Chan. Erin Classen won the 2021 rebel Sport Junior Sports Star Award at an event at Optus Stadium in February.

Significant upgrades and updates to the WA Squash website have taken place such as:

- Live calendar you can subscribe to, as well as downloadable PDF version in a beautiful new format.
- Interactive map to help you locate your closest Club.
- Scrolling image carousel at the top of the page which is updated regularly as events occur and Clubs provide photos.
- Acknowledgement of Traditional Owners.
- **Secure area of the website for Clubs to access a HUGE range of information and resources.**
- Pennant/League dates published for the entire year with the ability to nominate for any of these via online forms.
- Coaches, Referees, staff and Board members all updated.
- Annual Award nomination forms also now online and can be completed at any time.
- Minimum of four posts per week.

Squash Australia held their AGM on the 27 November, where Joanne Brodie stepped down as President of Squash Australia. Matt Schmidt was announced as the new President of Squash Australia. Further to this, we are thrilled that WA's very own Greg Blycha was re-elected to the Board of Squash Australia for a second term.

# The Great Southern Wheatbelt Teams Championship

83 players competed in the Great Southern Wheatbelt Team Championships over the weekend hosted by Narrogin Squash Club – their first tournament for more than 17 years.



The tournament attracted players from all over Western Australia, including several State Grade-level players. Spread across seven divisions, players competed in teams of three for the overall honour of being crowned champion.

Premier team '2 Guys a Girl and a Squash Court' (Jason Patmore, Heddwyn Brahma and Zoe Petrovansky), defeated a Mirrabooka team in the final in close and enthralling matches played out on the show-court.

Of the 83 players, 23 represented Narrogin Squash club. Jarrod Denholm, Victor Ranieri and Chris Allan comprised the winning division 4 team, while Liam Ranieri, Jane Pratt and Kai Armstrong comprised the runner-up division 7 team.

After some incredible squash was show-cased, players were treated to a function on Saturday Night in the John Higgins Community Complex, as well the second-to-none hospitality that Narrogin Squash Club is famous for.

The Club would like to thank major sponsors Shire of Narrogin and South32 for their contribution, as well as many other fantastic sponsors from around town. The Club is also incredibly grateful for the small army of volunteers who kept the tournament running smoothly and players fed.



#### Individual Championships

The Australian Masters Championships were held in Adelaide this year, and attracted 207 entries for the Individual Championships, with 12 from WA. Two WA players won their division. **Sue Hillier** won the women's 55-59 Open, and **Kelvin Carmichael** won the men's 70-74 Division 2. Three players finished runner up in the open division of their age groups: **Joannah Yue-Hitch** (women's 45-49), **Danny Zande** (men's 60-64) and **Ed Jennings** (men's 75-79).

The highlight for many was Joannah's match against Melissa Martin, with Jo winning the first and being ahead in the second. Playing the first match may have worked in Melissa's favour, but who knows? Playing her second match later in the week may have altered the outcome. However, brilliant job Joannah, and I know we have some magnificent matches to look forward to from you in coming years.

It was fantastic to witness an extremely high level of squash, especially among the younger age groups, particularly with Melissa Martin, Steve Finitsis and the New Zealand team showing us how the game should be played.

#### **Teams Event**

There were 304 entries for the Teams event with 33 WA teams representing WA. We had 10 teams spread among the 16 Divisions. The job of ranking for players and teams was difficult, partly caused by no championships being held over the past two years due to cancellation due to the Covid 19 pandemic. There were also a number of players new to masters that not yet had their ranking assessed. Unfortunately, this resulted in a few WA teams who struggled, having been placed in too high a division for them.

At the other end of the scale two teams managed to win their divisions and congratulations goes out to **Doug Minchin, John De Roach** and **Prue O'Neil** who took the honours in Division 7, and **Frank Von Zon, Ric Nicholas** and **Jim Hine**, who won Division 10.

Special mention must go to the Division 5 team of Linda Roberts, Todd Hoole, Bob Price and Kelvin Carmichael who were runners up. The teams in Divisions 6, 8 and 12 did very well, finishing third.

Once again, the use of multiple (three) centres unfortunately resulted in a lack of the brilliant atmosphere Masters know and love, and the distance between centres meant that it was difficult to watch other divisions, and made it difficult to watch friends from WA and other states play.

#### **Trans Tasman Series**

WA had three players in the team Sue Hillier, and the first ever husband and wife team members to be chosen, namely Jo and Glenn Hitch. Sue, as usual, won all three matches without dropping a game while Jo had extremely hard matches as she was playing in the 40-44 age group rather than her own. She managed to win, but had close 4 and 5 set matches. Glenn had a mixed time, winning in 3 before losing in 5 and winning his final match.

Karadinga was a difficult venue for spectators with only about 10 people able to watch each match in the front row with a few standing at the back on chairs. Overall, a great result with Australia winning all three tests and the West Australians playing well and representing Australia and WA with class.

## Erin Classen won the Sarah Fitz-Gerald Junior Player of the Year (female) award:

"Erin was one of Australia's most consistent junior performers throughout 2022, reaching the final of the Australian Junior Open and Australian Junior Championships, as well as performing impressively at the World Junior Championships in Nancy, France. Erin has performed well on the PSA World Tour this year, reaching her highest World Ranking of 130."



Oscar Curtis won the Chris Robertson Junior Player of the Year (male) award:

"Oscar has been Australia's undisputed top male junior for the past three years, and in 2022, he made his long-awaited World Junior

# S Let's play fair with Neil Butler

**THE SERVICE** 

Prior to 1990 squash used to have two serves. Whilst researching when the single serve came into the game I came across the rules published around 1965. Briefly, they stated that "The Server serves his hand out and loses the stroke if he serves two consecutive faults". This sounded reasonable.

The definition of a fault is still the same today although we do not distinguish the calls between "Fault" and "Foot-fault" as was done up until recently. Now it is just simply "Fault". However, the Receiver had a part to play in the two fault rule as well. The rules stated that "Hand-out may take a fault. If he attempts to do so, the serve thereupon becomes good and the ball continues in play".

The rule continued on to say that "If the receiver does not attempt to do so, the ball shall cease to be in play, provided that, if the ball, before it bounces twice upon the floor, touches the server or anything he wears or carries, the Server shall loose the stroke". This was to cover the case where the Server mishit the first serve or deliberately hit the ball back towards themselves in order to gain time to regain their breath or strength.

Further down the track the rules were amended so that the referee could award a stroke against a Server who deliberately served a first service fault in order to regain his breath or strength. Spare a thought for the Referee in having to decide if the Receiver attempted to return the ball or did the Server deliberately serve a first fault or just mis-hit it! The Second Fault became hand out.

Move forward to the 1st May 1990 when the single fault rule was introduced. The Guideline for Referees was:

"This new concept is a fundamental change to the game of squash. However, it is a simple concept to understand and apply. All faults now result in change of server and are the same as a fault on a second service, or hand out on either service before the rules were changed. Thus a foot fault becomes hand out, as does a service which hits the front wall on or below the cutline or which lands in the incorrect quarter court. Servers will therefore need to concentrate more when serving. The change is designed to speed up play as well as making the rules of service more easily understood."

The Guideline was almost as long as the rule. The last sentence is certainly true. Today we take the single serve for granted but sometimes we have to know how the rules have evolved over the history of our game to understand where are going.


