Behind the Scenes

with Leigh Kaye



Firstly, on behalf of the staff and Board at WA Squash, I hope you had a safe and peaceful break, and wish you a fabulous New Year full of health and prosperity.

The squash community across Western Australia achieved so much throughout 2022. Without the unquantifiable time and efforts of our volunteers, Club Committees, Coaches, Officials, staff and Board we wouldn't be in the increasingly strong position we are finding ourselves in.

In the office we developed a new draft Junior Development Pathway Model. Through a purposeful consultative process, we refined it further. The draft has been shared with the Board for further discussion and finalisation. A few things we're excited to highlight are:

- *Tournament Tours where a group of juniors are brought to a selection of country tournaments by a male and female adult/parent. This will provide additional opportunities for juniors to compete in tournaments, gaining more experience and confidence; remove the requirement for parents to take time off work, organise travel, meals, etc.; and promote friendship and camaraderie among our junior players.*
- *The introduction of a Talent Squad which will be an additional pathway stage between Club Development Squads and the State Squad.*
- *Connecting country juniors with billet families in the metro area for activities such as squad training, tournaments, clinics, Squashathon, and more.*

As you can imagine, there is MUCH to discuss and refine with a variety of stakeholders, so watch this space for further updates.

Matt Schmidt was announced as the new President of Squash Australia, after being elected by the Squash Australia Board following their AGM. Matt replaces exiting President Jo Brodie, following her decision to stand down after 5 years of service. New Directors Carmel Ackerly (VIC) and John Cowling (NSW) were also elected by State and Territory Members at the AGM, while Greg Blycha (WA) was re-elected to maintain his director role.

In partnership with Sport Australia, World Squash Officiating (WSO) and World Squash Coaching (WSC), Squash Australia has developed a new online learning platform, set to be launched early this year. Read more about it here: <https://www.squash.org.au/w/squash-australia-learning-centre>

In other national news, Squash Australia are trialling a new participation program in South Australian schools where squash skills and programs are integrated with physical education curriculum. Once the data is analysed and program assessed, it will then likely be launched across the country in Term 3, 2023.

2022 Oceania Junior Championships: 17-19 December 2022
Thornleigh Squash Centre NSW.

The 2022 Oceania Junior Championships, taking place at Thornleigh Squash Centre, NSW, came to a great conclusion, with the best of Oceania junior squash on display.

After an incredible day of semi-finals action on Saturday and many upsets, there was no slowing down as the players took to the court ready to claim their final placings and fight for the title in their respective age groups. The atmosphere around the courts was electric as everyone gathered to see who would take out the top 3 spots.

Teagan Scott took out the number three spot 3-1 in the Under 11 Girls division against Papua New Guinea's Timonaliz Alarcos-Kriebisch.

Hannah Slyth delivered one of the biggest upsets, defeating number one seed Lijana Sultana in the final of the Under 17 Girls 3-0 (16-14, 14-12, 11-8). Lijana defeated Hannah earlier this year convincingly in the Australian Junior Open in Perth in September. She credited this win to her increased fitness and mobility.

Hannah shared, "The match was really tough. Lijana is a really good player, she whipped me 3-0 earlier in the year. I said to myself coming into this tournament, I'm just going to come back and play the best match possible. My fitness and movement have been my big areas of improvement, and in this match, I tried to attack as much as possible because she is also a very attacking player."

Daniel Marsh took out the Under 17 Boys Championship defeating his Trans-Tasman rival from New Zealand Christopher Hebbard 3-0 (11-8, 11-8, 11-6).

The Under 19 Boys final saw **Oscar Curtis** playing Kijan Sultana. It was a dominant win by Oscar, the number one seed, taking the match 3-0 (11-5, 11-4, 11-8).

The full diversity of the Oceania Junior Championships was on display, with flags of the seven competing countries proudly worn. This event saw a fantastic turn out from New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, New Caledonia, Fiji, and Norfolk Island, with these players putting our Aussies through their paces and providing some much-needed international exposure.

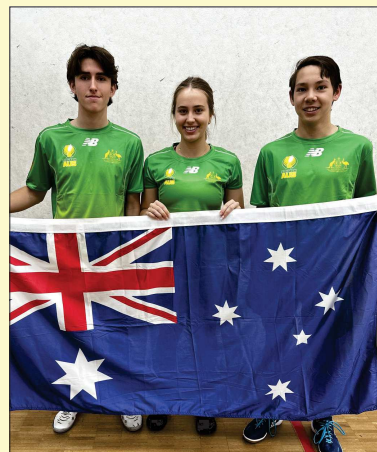

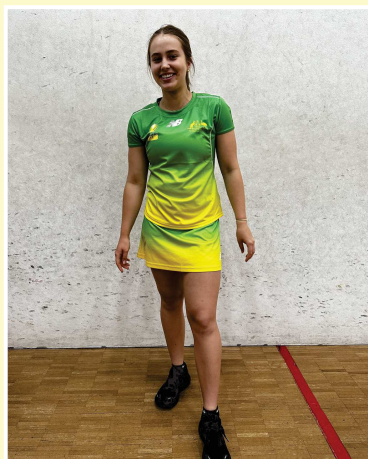

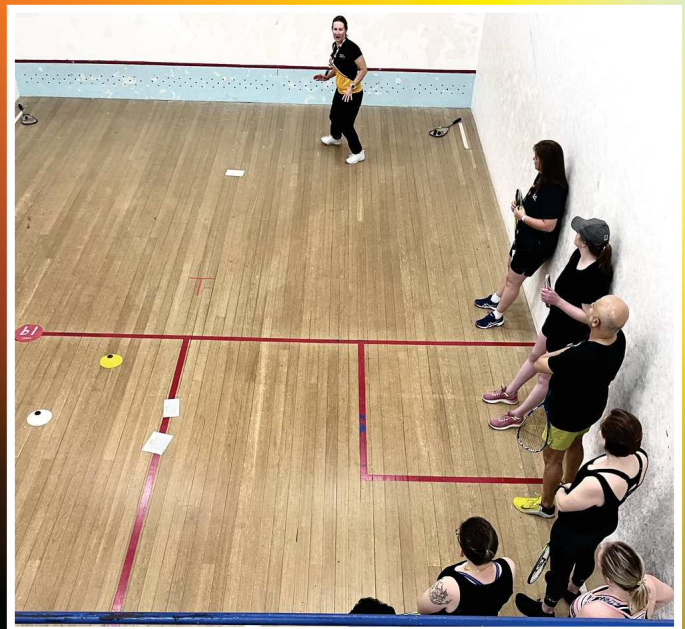
TRY WITH PRIDE DAY

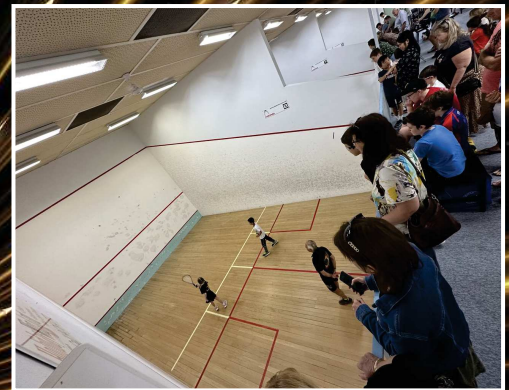
