A few of the highlights included Cambridge local and fitness guru Andre Blignaut providing the first shock of the tournament by taking out the top seed Grant Hardwick over 5 body wrecking games in Division 1.

Unfortunately the effort took its toll on Blignaut as he wasn't able to back up the following morning against Cambridge team mate Alberto Musca.

The Women's Open provided a fantastic and historic first Open win for Junior player Olivia Lindsey! A fantastic result for Lindsey and definitely a name to watch for in the future.

However a long and taxing rally ensued with Illich winning it and then going on from there to finish stronger and take the match.

In the final Corren took advantage of Illich's fatigue (as a consequence of his effort against Curtis just ninety minutes prior) and took his first Cambridge Open title with a 3-0 win.

Overall the tournament was a huge success and a fantastic welcome back to



the calendar for the Cambridge Open which plans to be a permanent fixture in the future and grow from strength to strength in the coming years!

Once again Roger Flynn joined us for the camp to put the juniors through their paces.

Having just come off 4 days of tournament play, the camp began in Bunbury with a recovery session in the rec centre pool. The kids then had some time to enjoy themselves, relaxing in the shallow water or taking on the inflatable challenge course in the lane pool. It was then off to Bridgetown to begin the camp.

This time the camp was everyone at the same time, rather than split into two separate groups. This did provide a bit of a challenge with court space, however with some quick thinking we managed to keep everyone active.

Half the group would train on court whilst the second group had some physical activities off court including a circuit session (coordinated by Dave and Shari Tsangaris), flexibility assessment, Y test and Yo Yo fitness testing.

This has been achieved mainly thanks to all the hard work and commitment shown by Mike Cornish who travels the State with the Inflatable Squash Courts. (As this article is being written Mike is in Port Hedland visiting schools).

Funding from the Department of Sport and Recreation assists with the delivery of our Country Development Strategy creating the opportunity to widen the spread of our successful school programs.

Whilst undertaking our schools programs during the day, Mike then runs coaching courses at the clubs and provides them with helpful information to assist with the ongoing development of their players and attracting new players to our sport.

In the metropolitan area, centres have been running the **Just Squash It Secondary School Program** which has been helping to steadily grow participation numbers. 53 teams entered the Interschool Squash Competition this year compared to 26 last year.

This year, Tim Cowell based at Cambridge Squash Centre, has taken the inflatable courts to schools in that area resulting in a junior program now up and running at this centre.
