



Australia have secured a 20-12 victory over New Zealand to retain the Junior Trans Tasman Trophy in Melbourne in April.

Day 1 saw the Aussies win 10 rubbers to 6. Therefore, the task on Day 2 of the series was to win just 7 rubbers to succeed overall. Green & Gold reigned supreme winning another 10 rubbers.

WA's Daniel Marsh and Hannah Slyth were selected to represent Australia and performed well. Daniel was narrowly beaten on Day 1 11-9 in the 5th. That probably left him a little flat on Day 2 where he went down in straight. Hannah got off to a great start on Day 1 winning the first game but ended up losing 1-3. She made amends on Day 2 with a strong 3-0 win.

The camp focused on doing the simple basics well; hitting good length, strong movement and taking the ball in short when the opportunity presented itself. Some different agility tests were conducted as well as some different types of ghosting and agility training work that we can continue into future sessions.

The younger portion of our junior Talent Squad also got the chance to spend some time with Stewart and Jenny, reinforcing some of the key training messages to them over the session.



Club Committee members do an enormous number of volunteer hours to keep clubs going, keeping memberships and payments up to date, setting up events, and more.


One of the biggest drawcards for REVO is the significant reduction of this workload, so please get on board and activate your account if you haven't already, and help out your Club Committee in the process.

Interference Rule 8 – Excessive Swing

Often I am asked, what is an excessive swing.

By definition:-

"A reasonable swing comprises a reasonable backswing, strike at the ball and a reasonable follow through."

"The striker's backswing and follow through are reasonable as long they do not extend more than is necessary."

What does this mean?

In the case of the backswing, this generally means a straight arm extension that causes the opponent to take preventative action from being hit with the racquet.

In the case of the strike at the ball, this generally this means a straight arm extension and wide flat swing to take preventative action from being hit with the racquet.

In the case of the follow through, this generally means a straight arm extension and wide swing that prevents the opponent from moving toward the ball.

In all three situations, if the striker asks for a let, the answer should be "No Let".

Where the excessive swing is on the follow-through, the opponent may ask for a let.

Movement for Beginners

The final article on movement before discussing something else is what to look for in beginners.

The biggest challenge new players face is not knowing where the ball is going. The result is often running in circles or too far past the ball to play a decent shot and then recover. How to address it? The **P-D-A** tool in the new World Squash Federation coaching content is a nice way to start breaking it down.

Perception - What you see

Decision - Based on what you see, what do you intend to do

Action - Now go and do it!

A lot of beginners will do one of two things. They either don't watch their opponent and tunnel vision the front wall (this means there is no perception, therefore no anticipation is possible - they are 100% reactive to the situation) OR they full body watch (turning their whole body to see their opponent, which can then mean their take off from the T is compromised).

The first step to improving this when coaching players is to keep the open skill approach in mind. This will challenge them to watch the coach to try and spot the differences between various shots.

The next focus is trying to get their racquet prepared in time. Some players may get to the ball in a good position, except that the racquet isn't prepared, so they lose that advantage. To address this, I've gone back to the very basic drop the ball in line with their leading foot and get them to swing. After a few of those I start moving and challenge them to watch and keep up with the ball. Whilst doing this the racquet is always ready for the moment I drop the ball. They are getting the feeling of moving with a prepared racquet to strike the ball when in a comfortable position. The coach can move anywhere on the court with this activity, challenging the player to move laterally as well as forwards and backwards.

The next progression I throw into the mix doesn't involve swinging at the ball. I ask the player to judge the flight of the ball and move to a spot on the court where they think the second bounce of the ball will be on their toes. This is to recognise this is the last moment they have to hit the ball, so as long as you have the second bounce covered, you are still in the rally.

Finally, they need to understand the amount of space needed. "You're too close to the ball when hitting" might not be the complete answer they need. It's hitting the ball too close to your shoulder. A ball really close to the ground or high in the air will be 'closer to your body' than a shoulder height volley or top of the bounce ground stroke will be. But they are further from your shoulder, meaning you can straighten your arm out on impact to hit it as opposed to your elbow being at right angles.

Now we try and bring it all together. Getting the player to watch their opponent, start preparing the racquet as they judge the flight of the ball, and move to an impact point. If we have nailed these things, we should see a player moving more efficiently and playing better shots.

Once they get simple shots off the front wall down pat, introduce them to shots coming off the side wall!
