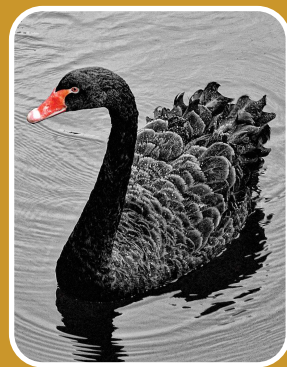

I have owned an engineering workshop for most of my adult life and during that time it became obvious there was a need for an inexpensive, effective and environmentally friendly way to clean workshop parts.

Previous to Warthog, the only option for automatic parts washers had been a caustic water-based hot wash. These are expensive to run and need constant servicing, particularly under a heavy workload. Using a water base also means fine particles in the solution can dry on the parts, which requires the use of rust inhibitor. When cleaning internal parts, after every hot wash a hand wash in degreaser is also necessary.

It became clear that a hot wash not only resulted in higher energy bills but also created its own set of inefficient processes too. Hence the beginning of my development of the Warthog Parts Washer.

I designed and built the Warthog Parts Washer to eliminate these issues. Being a cold wash it's inexpensive and safe to operate, and using a degreaser as the cleaning agent leaves your parts clean and ready to use after one wash only. Even with a heavy workload, servicing is significantly reduced with Warthog, compared to a water-based hot wash.

In addition to designing and building an effective parts washer, it was also vitally important for me to keep running costs to a minimum while still being eco-friendly. This meant a fit-for-purpose degreaser needed to be created – and with that in mind I formulated Enviroclean.

I designed and built my own distiller so that all used degreaser collected from workshops when servicing would be treated, reused and recycled. This process has meant a cheaper degreaser for the client and an environmentally sound product as any waste generated from the distilling process is collected and recycled.

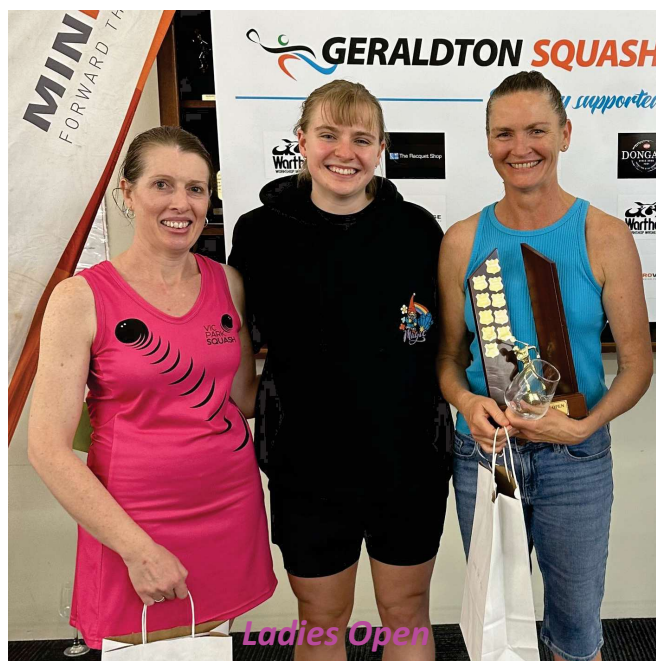

Still, not too much drama as we got started without losing too much time for the first class. The standard of all the students here was really good so hopefully we can see a few more of them head down to the squash courts.

The interest is certainly there for more visits, the schools loved having the programs back after the many years off, hopefully we can get back to this being a more regular annual thing in town as there is plenty of potential for growth in the squash club.

Thanks to the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries for allowing us to deliver these activities, and to Geraldton Squash Club for being so keen to work with us on this.

In C-grade we saw an all Broome semi with Rickus Heystek getting up over Dean Fulford while Broome local Lindsay Jackson got up over former champion Daniel Richardson.

B-grade saw #1 seed Luke Austin go down to Luke Senior in a high level match while defending champion Andre Blignaut was made to work by Diego Hernandez with a

***B-grade** saw defending champion Andre Blignaut take the first game before Luke Senior stormed home with the next 3 in what was an extremely entertaining match.*

*The **A-grade** was one for the ages with Lewis Christie bursting out of the blocks before he was reeled in by Heddwyn Brahma before Lewis took out the 5th. Both players finished the match exhausted to a thunderous applause.*

Presentations were held at the Broome Surf Club overlooking Cable Beach with the weather turning it on as a fantastic sunset capped the weekend off a treat. Antoine Cicco was awarded the Player of the Tournament for his outstanding support throughout the weekend while Neil Butler took out the Peanut award for having his car impounded at the courts overnight.

Squash super-couple Russell and Lyn Chandler were two of the very deserving nominees for the 2023 Squash WA Volunteer of the Year award.

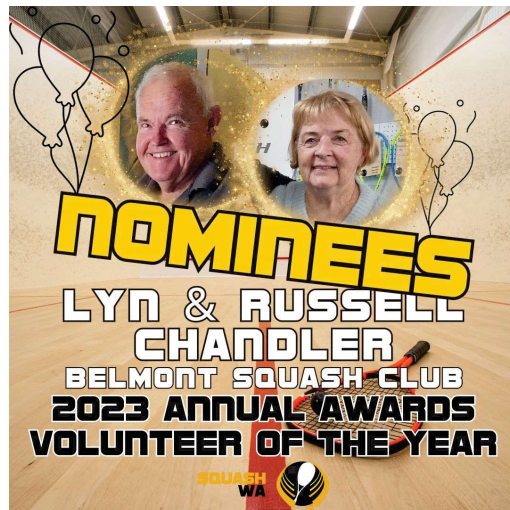

COACHES CORNER

Time to check how many dots you are using ... Again!

It's that time of year, where the temperature gauge has started to drop (finally) and to borrow a quote from a popular TV Series ... 'Winter is Coming' That should mean that a good majority of us should be locking away the double yellow dots and grabbing out the single yellow dots or red dots to play with. Especially at junior clubs, but don't limit it to there.

Centre staff members, junior program coaches have some sort of influence here to suggest the most suitable ball for players. Having spent a bit more time behind the counter these past 6 months, even in summer we have seen a lot more casual players going for the easier single yellow dot. If we want to sell the sport as the fitness beast it can be, we need to make sure we are handing over something bouncy and not a rock!

The next step I think we can take? Seeing more official events - day pennants, night pennants and tournaments following suit implementing the ball change. Some people may not agree, but (me being opinionated) its a bit selfish because a bouncier ball might not fit the touch game strategy!

Remember the benefits that a bouncier ball can provide:

Fitness - Getting more shots back and increasing the length of rallies, the heart has a chance to work a bit longer before it gets a rest, so challenge it!

Technique - Players can still focus on striking the ball well instead of trying to over hit it too much just to get it warm. The harder hitters can adapt to a slightly faster ball by not hitting it as hard and working on their placement.

Enjoyment - Not having to lunge so deep or run super fast just to try and get a ball back. For the older players this can help to potentially reduce the chance of injury with that ball bouncing just that little bit more.

Tactics - Opponent getting the ball back a bit more often? Think that strategy through! Keep working them around the court and those opportunities will come.

For the die hard squashies out there, keep this in mind ... there is a reason why some parts of SA, Vic and regional NSW see more participation in racquetball than squash. We are really fortunate how warm it can be in Perth

There are also reasons why sports like Pickleball are growing at a rapid rate, with people from squash and tennis both flocking to it. It's a sport which is ticking all these boxes and making it easier for more people to participate, be successful and have fun. So as a sport this is critical for us to attract new players or keep existing players for just a bit longer.

So start locking away those double dots again, let them have a holiday and we will see them again in September!



LET'S PLAY FAIR

At a recent AFL game, a player was penalised for time wasting by not handing the ball directly back to the umpire at a stoppage in play. As a result, the opposition were able to score a goal which may or may not have affected the result.

The TV commentators were aghast and said commonsense should apply and the umpire was over officiating.

The coach of the penalised team said he was not aware of the rule but that the players had made more mistakes than the umpire so not a lot to complain about. Most of the players said they were not aware of the rule.

What's my point I can hear some people say?

The point is that as coaches and players we should be aware of the rules and coach and play in accordance with the rules.

Mostly this is done but when an abnormal situation comes up if there is a rule written to cover that situation the rule must be applied and not commonsense applied. Commonsense can only be applied if the referee or umpire is not aware of the rule or is not sure what to do in a situation.

Spanish Proverb

In our game Rule 1.3 states "Play must be continuous as far as is practical"

Rule 15.6 states "If a player's conduct is unacceptable, the Referee must penalise the player, stopping play if necessary".

Unacceptable behaviour includes "Delaying play, including being late back on court" (15.6.8).

Other examples of time wasting are:

- *Taking too long to prepare for serving*
- *Taking too long to be in position to receive the serve*
- *Trying to engage with the referee in discussion about decisions (this can be different to dissent or arguing with the referee)*
- *Kicking or hitting the ball away in order to gain extra time to regain breath or composure*
- *Excessive ball bouncing when preparing to serve. Note there is no definite number of times the player may bounce the ball, but it is left to the referee to make the decision if it is time wasting*

The rules are not specific with time periods but use the words "If in the opinion of the referee...."

How does the referee decide then what is time wasting?

If after a long rally both players are taking their time to return to their respective positions of server and receiver is this time wasting? Do both players get penalised? If a player bounces the ball say 5-6 times consistently before each serve and then bounces it 8-9 times before a serve is this time wasting?

A good method to help decide on time wasting is if one player is making a reasonable effort to ensure play is continuous and the other player is taking an unreasonable amount of time to be in position to either serve or receive then that player must be penalised. A Conduct Warning may be sufficient but if ignored then a harsher penalty can be applied.

As our game requires the players to mark and referee it is important that players are aware of the rules in order that a fair result can be achieved in a match.

By the way the AFL umpire's decision went against my team but I have had to support the umpire's decision.
