Western Australia became the Mecca of squash this month with three major events running back-to-back. On the first weekend of June the Golden Open took place in Kalgoorlie and attracted 135 players along with a full cast of Professional Squash Association (PSA) players.

The following weekend saw the biggest WA Open tournament in 30 years take place with just over a cool 200 players, including the PSA players following the convoy back to Perth from Kalgoorlie. ...and just when we were about to take a breath, the Australian National Championships were upon us which saw the top male and female players in Australia vying for glory and national team selection.

When we were finally able to take that breath, I couldn't help but beam with pride as I reflected on three weekends in a row of tremendous talent, invaluable volunteers, and a true resurgence of the sport that has given me so much.

All those who came out of the woodwork to lend a hand at the WA Open International - **THANK YOU from the bottom of my heart.** With the added, professional touches such as the towels and bottled water provided to the PSA players for each match, the live-streaming, the welcome function and so much more, we have set the bar higher than ever.



Amazing Busselton success with three divisions taken out over the weekend plus a local member in Div 1. 60 Players from the Southwest and Perth competed in the 38th SW Squash Masters, in Busselton at the Sebel Resort's 2 courts, which started Fri afternoon thru to Sunday.

It was wonderful to have 20 new players in the tournament plus many long serving players. The Tournament was played in 5 Divisions with ages from 35 to early 80s This is the biggest master's Squash event outside of Perth and one of the longest running. Busselton had 16 players over all 5 divisions all on a round robin basis. This competition started in Busselton in 1987 with only 25 players.

The coveted **Division 1** shield went to a count back after 2 teams ended up with equal games and had to be separated by points, after no team went through the weekend undefeated. It was taken out by team, **"Top Guns"** which included a



The Return back from Injury

I think a lot of us have been there in some way, shape or form. Be it a week, 2 or maybe months on the sideline, rehabbing an injury. From a coaching perspective, we certainly have a role to play in terms of easing players back into playing.

Squash is a chaotic game, some injuries don't need chaos when returning, they need controlled movements with sufficient repetitions to gain strength and confidence. As a coach though, it's not my place to diagnose, nor is it to my place to determine the rehab plan. That is up to the specialists looking after the player I'm working with.

From personal experience, each injury had a check list to reach. For my hip, it was



certain degrees of internal and external rotation to make sure I had the range to start running. Before running, I was allowed to cycle, keeping the movements very steady. My knee was similar, getting the range back into the joint before progressing to the next step. A red flag did pop up in the mobility issue for my knee, which resulted in a follow up surgery, back to square 1!

In most cases, it's the lowest impact movements first, so pool, then bike, then running. For my knee, I was able to access an Alter G treadmill which meant I could start running sooner as I wasn't running at 100% body weight, rather I started about 60% and increased weekly depending on how I pulled up. Alongside this was the strength program to complete, once the mobility check boxes were ticked off, it was time to get on court finally!



So what's some of the things we can do with players returning from an injury? We keep it basic, especially if rehabbing a leg problem. A bouncier ball could be a great option - less demanding on the body. Solo hitting is probably the first step to consider, just get used to swinging a racquet again.

From there it is going to be rehearsing very simple movements to each corner. As much as I advocate for open skill drills, definitely keep the rehab work closed and predictable. Progress the moving from one corner to two, then keep working your way around the court.

The important thing is feedback from the player, how is it feeling and are other areas fatiguing? Compensating for an injury is a big problem which can result in other areas getting injured. If you used to train for an hour before the injury, maybe aim

for a solid 20-30 minutes of quality, see how you recover, then continue to build up as you go.

The other important thing here is that the player still keeps some regular medical attention with a physio to monitor the return to full play. Once the medico's give the tick to move to the next step, we can look to increase the intensity, before then opening up the drills for some change of direction elements.

Again, I'm not qualified to offer medical advice, I can only speak from experience. When it comes to pain, its knowing what is an ok pain and what isn't. Some pain can be worked through, once blood flow to joints, muscles and a tiny bit to go to the tendons gets going - which is why warming up and preparing is even more important when in your rehab phase. But if pain gets worse, you've reached your limit and need to ease off.

Do you need a coach to go through this process? No if you have a hitting partner who is patient enough to feed you some balls to help your movement. If you don't have a hitting partner like that, then reach out to a coach who can fill that role for you.

Lastly, your physio gave you a strength program for a reason, do it! It's not for decoration on the fridge, or just another app hiding away not getting used on your phone! That strength and rehab program is what saves you cash down the track by not having to visit your specialist weekly (could be cash to spend towards your coach instead ;)) That, coupled with building up your bodies tolerance to playing again is what keeps you on court for longer instead of breaking down again the minute things ramp up to 100% effort.




If going through a serious injury, hang in there. That first match back after extended time off is going to be fun for sure. The days after, not so much! But make sure you have a team around you.

It doesn't matter what level you play squash at, it's a sport to be enjoyed: fun, fitness, social ... the investment is worth it to get back.
